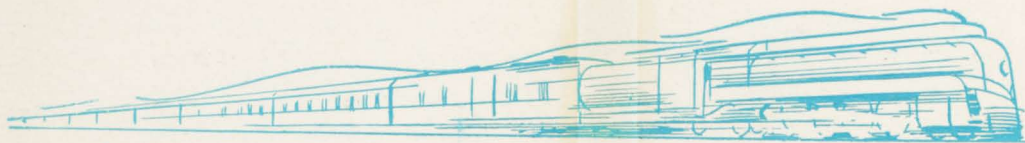

## *A Nation's Capital*

When Colonel By of the Royal Engineers was building the Rideau Canal he established his headquarters on the banks of the Ottawa River . . . . In his honor the place became known as Bytown . . . . For nearly three decades it was Bytown and not much more impressive than its name . . . . In 1854 the name was changed to Ottawa . . . . Four years later Queen Victoria made it the seat of Government . . . . thus disposing of the rival claims of Montreal, Quebec, Toronto and Kingston . . . . In 1867 the Dominion of Canada was created and Ottawa became its capital . . . . Who could have foretold, in 1826, that insignificant Bytown would rise to be one of the great cities of the world? . . . . From Ottawa is steered a nation of 12,000,000 . . . . There the Governor-General resides . . . . there Parliament meets . . . . there are situated the National Archives, the National Gallery, the Royal Mint, the Royal Observatory . . . . Chateau Laurier, one of the finest hotels on the continent . . . . With its lofty Gothic towers, its greenswards and its gardens along the river and the canal, Ottawa is a beautiful city, its appearance in keeping with its importance and its dignity . . . . Ottawa is a quiet city on the surface . . . . fuss and fume are not in its nature . . . . yet underneath its calm there is ceaseless activity . . . . Directing the affairs of the Dominion of Canada, at home and abroad, is a tremendous task, even in times of peace . . . . And today the nation is at war.
