Fishing In Jasper

True, you can't hunt in Jasper National Park . . . except perhaps with the camera . . . it's a wild life sanctuary . . . but fishing is another story. Fishing is not only permitted but it is encouraged . . . Maligne, Amethyst, Edith, Patricia, Celestine, Pyramid and other lakes are well stocked with rainbow and eastern brook trout . . . And are they thriving! . . . It's a thrill to cast a fly in these clear sparkling waters surrounded by mountain splendour . . . The government fish hatchery on the Maligne River is something to see. It has a capacity of 600,000 fingerlings. They remain in the troughs until they are an inch to an inch and a half long. Then they are transferred to the rearing ponds, where they are allowed to develop for eighteen months before going to the lakes . . . Beautiful mountain waters that looked tempting but had nothing pertinent to say to the fisherman are now sporty waters . . . Of course fishing is only one of the attractions that bring visitors to Jasper Park Lodge from all parts of the world . . . Trail riding, hiking, motoring, climbing, swimming, canoeing, golfing are others . . . And if you don't want to do anything more strenuous than looking, there is plenty to look at.
