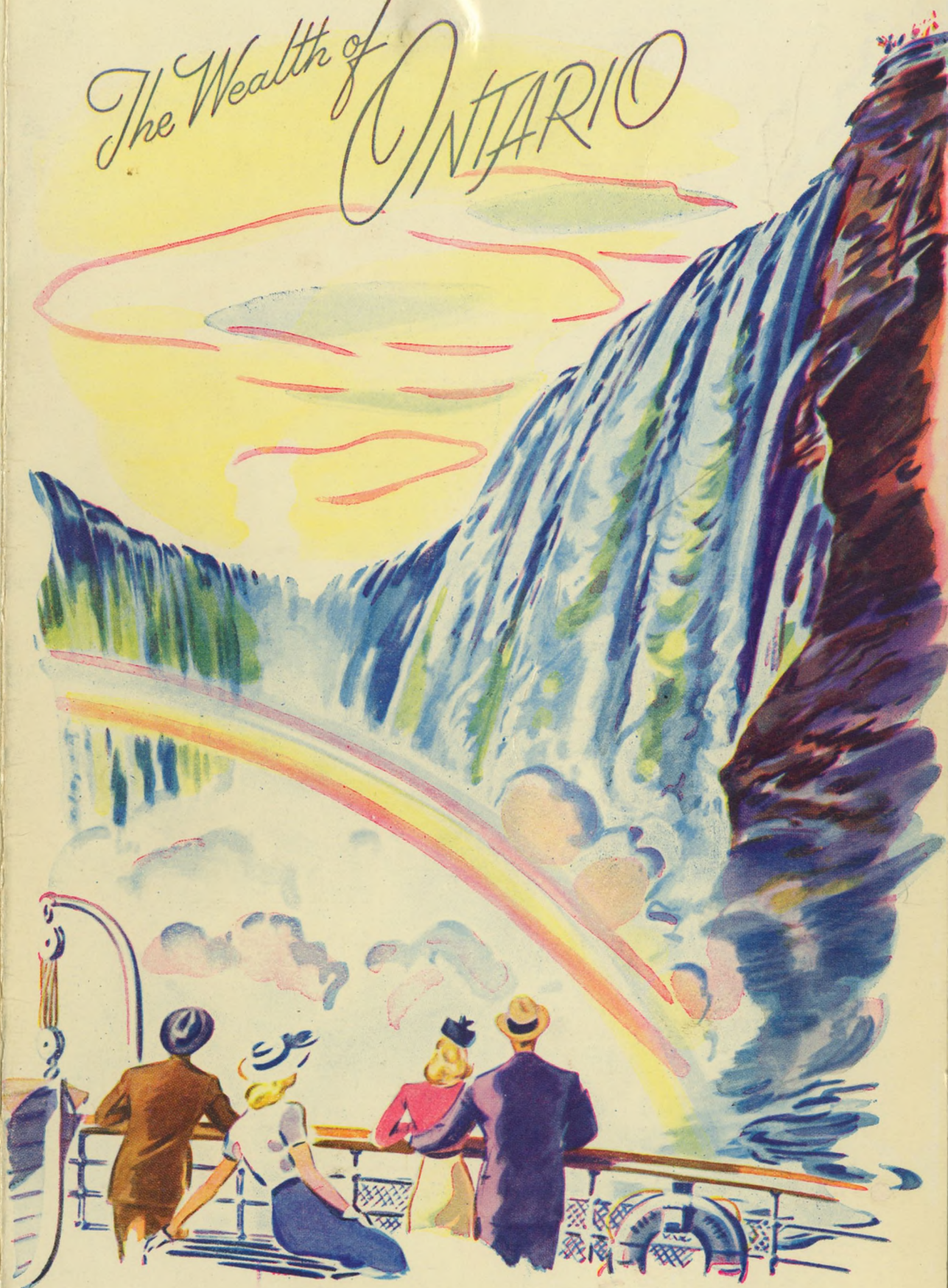

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The Wealth of ONTARIO

Niagara Falls is a symbol of the wealth Ontario shares with its visitors. Within its more than 360,000 square miles, the province displays enormous riches of natural beauty and grandeur which attract millions of tourists every year. Niagara, Algonquin Park, Lake of Bays, Muskoka, Minaki, Kawartha Lakes, Timagami, Georgian Bay, Lake of the Woods, Lake Nipigon, Lake Nipissing and the Thousand Islands are famous names, and hunters and fishermen know countless other refuges from the cares of the workaday world. But Ontario is more than a mighty playground. It is rich in agriculture, in timber and pulpwood and minerals, in water power; it is the most intensively developed industrial area of Canada. It is rich in beautiful and thriving cities, like Ottawa, the nation's capital, and Toronto, second city in Canada. Ontario is important in the cultural life of the country as well as in its industrial, financial and political life. It is rich in its history, going back as far as the Indians, the French explorers and the Jesuit martyr saints. But its greatest wealth is its four million people, a third of Canada's population.
