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



#### TOUR C-1

### 8-DAY TOUR TO TORONTO, MONTREAL AND GASPÉ PENINSULA

(Departures daily except Sundays and Wednesdays,  
June 28 to August 28)

(Saturdays May 29, June and September)

**FIRST DAY** — Evening departure from Chicago on CN's "International Limited".

**SECOND DAY** — Arrive Toronto in the morning. This afternoon, enjoy two hours of sightseeing around Greater Toronto, viewing such points as the Casa Loma, High Park, Canadian National Exhibition grounds and Provincial Parliament buildings. (If desired, a side trip to Niagara Falls may be arranged at additional cost). Board the "Inter-City Limited" for Montreal. Overnight at The Queen Elizabeth — Canada's finest hotel.

**THIRD DAY** — In the morning, join the three-hour sightseeing tour of Greater Montreal, including stops at Notre Dame Church, Westmount Lookout, the magnificent St. Joseph's Oratory, Wax Museum (admission extra), University of Montreal and McGill University. A Tally-Ho trip to the Chalet on Mount Royal gives you a mountain-top view of the city and St. Lawrence River. Afternoon at leisure. Leave Central Station tonight on CN's "Scotian".

**FOURTH DAY** — On arrival Mont Joli, the Gaspé Tours Line representative meets you for the start of the escorted Gaspé Peninsula Tour. Your modern automobile travels along the shore of the St. Lawrence River most of the first day, passing the city of Matane. The picturesque countryside is dotted with quaint French villages whose air of tranquil old world charm lifts this tour above the common place. At Cap-Chat, a stop for luncheon. Then the drive continues with the broad expanse of the St. Lawrence stretching to the north. At times the highway skirts the shore of the Gulf, then again it rises above sea level to a panoramic view of mountain and sea. After a gentle descent Rivière Madeleine is reached and you spend the night at Hotel Bon Accueil or Hotel du Golfe.

**FIFTH DAY** — After breakfast, the tour is resumed and shortly you reach Rivière-au-Renard (Fox River), an interesting fishing village in a natural amphitheatre flanked by sloping hills; the drive continues through the lovely Shickshocks at the tip of the Appalachian Mountains. Soon the extreme tip of the Gaspé Peninsula is passed and you enter Gaspé village, standing on a beautiful natural harbor where the York and Dartmouth Rivers meet. It was here in 1534 that Jacques Cartier took possession of the land in the name of God and the King of France. After an enjoyable luncheon at Fort Prevel Inn, motor to the picturesque village of Percé where you stay overnight at Hotel La Côte Surprise or Au Pic de l'Aurore (Peak O'Dawn).

**SIXTH DAY** — This morning you explore Percé village and take the boat trip to Percé Rock and Bonaventure Island bird sanctuary. The boat circles the island's precipitous cliffs and ledges where thousands of sea fowl make their home. Percé Rock, so named for its massive archway, was once part of the mainland but has been severed by the continued erosion of the

waters. In the afternoon the route follows the shore of the Gulf of St. Lawrence and the Baie des Chaleurs. At Carleton, a popular summer resort, reservation awaits you at the Hotel des Sables Rouges or Hotel de la Baie Bleue.

**SEVENTH DAY** — Departure for Matapédia stopping there for lunch at the Restigouche Hotel. On through the beautiful rolling countryside of the Matapédia Valley arriving Mont Joli in time for dinner at the Commercial Hotel. Later in the evening you leave on the "Ocean Limited".

**EIGHTH DAY** — Arrive Montreal Central Station this morning. Free time until afternoon departure from Windsor Station on the "International Limited" for Toronto. After changing trains, you leave for Chicago.

**NINTH DAY** — Into Dearborn Station this morning — end of an unforgettable vacation.




