# Regina

# Queen City of the Plains

REGINA SUSTAINS to the full all the regal qualities its name implies—the Queen City of the Plains. A city with parks of remarkable beauty, and fine streets bordered with a density of shade trees, Regina has many handsome public buildings, such as the Parliament Buildings of the Saskatchewan Legislature. But regal qualities are only the setting for great merchandising activity. Its position on the main line of the Canadian Pacific, midway between Winnipeg and the Rockies, has made Regina a distributing centre for the southern half of Canada's great wheat province—Saskatchewan.

The Regina Plains, famous for their fertility, lie about it, and twelve railway lines radiate from the

city to the rich districts on every hand.

As the capital of a province furnishing 50 per cent of the Dominion's wheat, and yet with a relatively small fraction of that province's cultivable area producing, the development of Regina into one of the great cities of the continent is assured.

Regina was formerly the capital of the Northwest Territories, and was for over forty years the headquarters of one of the most famous forces in the

world—the Royal Northwest Mounted Police.
