## Rules for CANADIAN ROCKIES COLOR PHOTOGRAPH CONTEST Summer 1939

# Organized by CANADIAN PACIFIC HOTELS

- 1. Color photographs entered in this contest must have been taken in Banff, Yoho or Kootenay National Parks and vicinity during 1939. There is no restriction as to the nationality of the contestants.
- 2. Entries, if transparencies, must be forwarded by registered mail mounted between glass or celluloid as a slide for protection. All entries must be packed flat, between two pieces of stiff cardboard accompanied by an entry form on which are written the name and address of the sender, the date and place at which the photograph was taken, and date on which the contestant registered at a Canadian Pacific hotel or lodge listed in paragraph 5. Entry forms will be supplied on application to any Canadian Pacific office or hotel or from Room 318, Canadian Pacific Railway Company, Windsor Station, Montreal.
- 3. No entry to contain more than 5 prints or transparencies, though a contestant may forward as many entries as he or she desires, provided each entry does not exceed 5 prints or transparencies.
- 4. All entries must be forwarded postpaid or express prepaid to "CANADIAN ROCKIES COLOR PHOTOGRAPH CONTEST," Box 6000, Montreal, Canada, or Box 456, Chicago, Ill. Entries mailed in U.S.A. should be sent to Chicago and those mailed in Canada to Montreal to avoid delay by customs.

- 5. This contest is open to all guests who register during 1939 at Banff Springs Hotel, Banff, Alta.; Chateau Lake Louise, Lake Louise, Alta.; Emerald Lake Chalet, Field, B.C.; Yoho Valley Lodge, Field, B.C.; Lake Wapta Lodge, Hector, B.C.; Lake O'Hara Lodge, Hector, B.C.; Moraine Lake Louise, Alta. It is not open to employees of the Canadian Pacific Railway and subsidiaries, though members of their families may submit entries.
- 6. All photographs remain the property of the contestant with the exception of the first nine prize winners which are to become the property of the sponsor, who may reproduce them in printed or advertising matter. Other prize-winning photos are to remain in the possession of the sponsor for a year for the purpose of arranging an exhibition of a selected number of the best entries at suitable places. The sponsor will not be responsible for entries delayed or lost in transit. Photographs will be returned if adequate postage is enclosed.
- 7. Contest closes November 1, 1939. Entries postmarked or express waybilled later than November 1st will not be eligible.
- 8. Decision of the judges to be final. Judges will not enter into correspondence with any contestant.
- 9. Failure to comply with the regulations outlined above automatically disqualifies any entry from this contest.
- 10. If there is a recognizable person in any photograph entered in this contest, written permission from that person, with his or her address, to use a prize photograph in reproductions, if required, must be given by the contestant to the sponsors of this contest (Canadian Pacific Hotels).


