Recreational Attractions and Facilities

CALGARY, a busy and progressive city, is situated at the confluence of the Bow and Elbow Rivers, in the Foothills Country. It is the logical break in a journey to or from the Pacific Coast and is also the gateway to the Canadian Rockies. Calgary is a flourishing industrial and agricultural centre. Once important only as a ranching town, Calgary still maintains its association with the "wild and woolly West" by staging an annual "STAMPEDE", the greatest event of its kind in the world. Broncho-busters, wild steer riders, steer decorators and chuck wagon outfits from the ranches of all Western America compete and no visitor to the West should miss this spectacle. Calgary is picturesque, with many parks such as Central Park and St. George's Island Park with its Zoo and lifelike specimens of pre-historic animals. Forty miles south of Calgary are situated the Turner Valley Oil Fields, considered among the largest in the British Empire.
