JACKFISH CURVE

The Dominion, westbound from Montreal and Toronto to Vancouver, is pictured taking the curve at Jackfish, Ontario, where the rugged landscape is typical of the route along the northern rim of Lake Superior that is one of scenic grandeur the year round. In summer, the many tones of green are restful to the eyes; in autumn, hardwoods splash nature's canvas with a riot of reds and browns; and in winter, spiky evergreens cast purple shadows over a deep blanket of snow. To the south the restless expanses of Lake Superior stretching to the horizon appear frequently. For miles the track follows the wave-beaten, rock-ribbed shore. Small settlements, fishing villages, the occasional railway town and the engineering triumph of a comfortable track show how man has conquered this beautiful wilderness.
