"Coquihalla Pass"

Long years ago — history records no dates — Canada's west coast Indians, with the poetry that so often seems inherent in language before "civilization" spoils it, named a pass in the coast range, Coquihalla — "the parting of the waters".

Geographically, the Coquihalla Pass extends from Hope, where the Coquihalla River joins the Fraser, to Coquihalla Summit — thirty-six miles of canyon-riven scenery that presented many engineering problems to be overcome when the Canadian Pacific line through the southern Rockies was constructed.

The southern route, notable for the Coquihalla Valley at its western limit and the famous Crows Nest Pass near its eastern entrance, opens a picturesque mountain area less well known than the Canadian Pacific transcontinental main line, but equally notable for spectacular mountain scenery. Views such as our illustration of the box canyon between Othello and Hope alternate with the orchard-covered benchlands of the Okanagan Valley, the magnificent vista of Okanagan Lake from the top of the long switchback that links Myra and Penticton, the Five Fingered Canyon near McCulloch, the dams and rapids between Nelson and Castlegar, and Kootenay Lake.

To simplify inclusion of the Southern Canadian Rockies as an alternate round-trip route, daily trains between Vancouver and Medicine Hat connect with Canadian Pacific Montreal and Toronto transcontinental main line services.

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
