Banff Springs Golf Course

Wise golfers forget their score cards the first time they play the 6,704 yard Banff Springs Golf Course. This has nothing to do with the Par 71 links—it is directly attributable to the scenery. Second time round is soon enough to pay real attention to the game—although even then, it takes a concentrated player to ignore the magnificent vistas of pine-covered mountain slopes, rocky crags, snow-covered peaks and rushing glacial waters that surround this sporting course. From the club house, two minutes from Banff Springs Hotel, the first drive is across the glittering, chattering Spray River which joins the rushing Bow River in front of the hotel.

'Hoodoo,' the 525 number 11, takes its name from a peculiar geological formation behind the green, where erosion has fashioned a series of queer forms. 'Big Bow,' pictured on the cover, continues a direct southward line from Cascade Mountain intercepted by the rounded top of Tunnel Mountain.
