## Lakeside Inn

#### Yarmouth, Nova Scotia

Almost at the southern tip of Eastern Canada is a paradoxical place where seafarers go for fresh water sailing and fishing and landmen stay to enjoy tempered sea breezes from the broad Atlantic—Lakeside Inn, Yarmouth, Nova Scotia.

Lakeside Inn is unique in that there is fresh water lake bathing at the foot of the lawn and sea bathing from sandy beaches a short drive away. Dedicated to comfort, the Inn has 68 rooms with bath and 5 two-bedroom cottages in a 50-acre estate which borders the Milo chain of three freshwater lakes emptying into the sea. Yarmouth, at the southern tip of Nova Scotia, is bounded by the Bay of Fundy to the west and the Atlantic to the south. Reached by the Dominion Atlantic Railway, via Saint John, N.B., and Digby, N.S., or Halifax, or by sea from Boston, Yarmouth is a centre for the world's annual tuna fishing championship.
