## *Canadian Pacific*

Robert Burns, Scotland's national poet, who crowded a wealth of song and poetry into 37 years, was born near Ayr, January 25, 1759. Always close to the heart and mind of the lowly, Burns sang nostalgic ballads of his native heath.

Scotsmen the world over celebrate "Burns' Night" every year in tribute to the great lyric poet over whose work critics disagree vehemently to this day. Many of them—and Burns himself—favoured "Tam O'Shanter" as his greatest work: almost as many advance the claims of songs that are still on every tongue. Not only Scotsmen pay their tribute to Robert Burns. Wherever the Queen's English is sung, "Auld Lang Syne" is a hallowed parting air.

In his 38th year Robert Burns died near his birthplace at Ayr on July 21, 1796.
