LAKE LOUISE

Mile high Lake Louise, pictured on this menu, in addition to being a fabled pleasure resort crowned by the Canadian Pacific summer hotel, Chateau Lake Louise, is famous as one of the discoveries of the famous guide, Tom Wilson, who explored the Canadian Rockies before the world's first transcontinental railway was built.

Surrounded by the peaks and glaciers it reflects in its placid, jade-green waters, the lake is fed by the great Victoria Glacier, mighty offshoot of the 400-foot deep snowfield seen in the upper centre of the picture.

Around the rim of the lake trails for hikers and riders lead to The Plain of the Six Glaciers, to the Lakes in the Clouds and, for the truly adventurous, to The Mitre and Abbott's Pass.

Fronting the Chateau are beds of Iceland poppies so accustomed to the high climate that they have become native. Nearby, in the Valley of The Ten Peaks, is Moraine Lake, and a few miles west, The Great Divide, where the sparkling waters flow east and west from the very "top of the world".
