Vancouver Island from toe to tip is a succession of beauty. Landscapes, seascapes, wooded hills and the inter-mingling of English, Indian and old Spanish names appeal to eye and ear. Within easy reach of the Empress Hotel by car or by luxurious highway bus, several short drives tempt the visitor. Through Esquimalt with a stop at Race Rocks and Sooke, past Sheringham Point to Jordan River, your way takes you along the south coast of Juan de Fuca Strait. Northward lies the way to Brentwood, site of the famous Butchart gardens, along the east coast of Saanich inlet, and home by way of Sydney, through leaf-bordered roads where the sight of King Pheasant and occasional deer is not unusual. Northward again lies the famous Malahat Drive where the highway climbs between flowering Dogwoods and tall Arbutus on the west bank of Saanich Inlet, past a series of breath taking views; to return to the east side of Shawnigan Lake by a road bordered—in Springtime—by acre upon acre of tulips and daffodils.

For those whose stays are short, much of the arboreal beauty of Vancouver Island is preserved close at hand in the 10½ acres of gardens surrounding the ivy-covered hotel. Here, too, are trees, rose gardens famous the Continent over, rock gardens and water gardens well worth a visit and a picture. Most tempered of Canada's cities, Victoria enjoys an outdoor year. It is a city of gardens where the gardener's age-old quest of year round bloom is realized.
