# THE ROYAL YORK HOTEL

Toronto—in the Huron tongue, “a place of meeting”—capital of Ontario, typifies the province it serves. Busy, bustling, progressive, this lake port and rail centre is the focal point of manufacturing, mining, trading, banking, the arts and travel in central Canada.

Headquarters for commerce, touring, the industrial and social life of the city is the Canadian Pacific “Royal York”, the largest hotel in all The Queen's Realms. This modern hostelry, within easy reach of the steamship piers, linked by a tunnel with railway and subway stations, dominates the downtown sky-line and overlooks Lake Ontario.

An additional wing is now under construction and will be opened late in 1958. It will have an additional 400 air-conditioned bedrooms and magnificent new Convention and Public Rooms.

Toronto as a travel centre links the North American continent with Georgian Bay, French River, the Muskoka and Kawartha Lakes, Niagara Falls, the north shore of Lake Superior and other notable hunting, fishing and holiday areas.
