Oliver Goldsmith, poet, novelist and dramatist, author of "The Vicar of Wakefield," "She Stoops to Conquer" and "The Deserted Village", and many other works, was born, 1728, at Pallas, County Longford, Ireland. He was one of the eight children of a clergyman.

The contemporary of such great figures as Burke, Johnson and Reynolds in London, where he gravitated after attendance at the universities of Dublin and Edinburgh where he studied arts and medicine, Goldsmith read law for a while.

His sudden death in 1774 was deeply mourned by literary circles. He was buried in the Temple, London, and is commemorated by a monument in Westminster Abbey.
