

Almost a mile above sea level the massive, turretted castle atop the high banks of the purling Bow River faces the valleys of two streams that rush and tumble in search of lowlands far to the east. Built of stone quarried from Mount Rundle, the six hundred room hotel offers accommodations unsurpassed in the greatest cities — each suite or room with a view of Sulphur Mountain to the west or eastward to the "million-dollar" Bow Valley.

Unbelievable but true this paradoxical paradise caters to every member of the family. Hardy outdoor life with climbs, hikes, fishing and horse-back riding for the strenuous; golf, motoring, tennis; sightseeing in your own car or by bus over scenic, well engineered mountain roads; photography — with unafraid wild-life or Alpine flowers for models; outdoor and indoor swimming pools; shuffleboard; a sun swept terrace for lazy tanning. When the sun goes down spacious lounges are ideal settings for cards or conversation. Two dining rooms offer meals planned to satisfy appetites sharpened by keen mountain air. Chateau Lake Louise


Four hundred rooms, each with a view of the lake or the lofty Pipestone Range, offer metropolitan comfort in a beautiful mountain wilderness at Chateau Lake Louise.

The Chateau, overlooking the lovely lake for which it was named, has two wings that face south to form a sun trap for the loggia and terraced flower gardens that slope down to the water's edge. A glass-screened, filtered pool of warmed glacial water is popular with swimmers of all ages. Southward, the Victoria Glacier, overhung by a snowfield four hundred feet thick, glistens in the sun and is mirrored by the lake. Around its edge, beyond the rustic fence that borders your mountain estate, footpaths and riding trails lead to the foot of the glacier or to "The Lakes in the Clouds" where cosy tea houses reward riders and hikers with roaring fires, light lunches and pleasant hospitality.

Lounges, public rooms and the pleasantly elegant Fairview Room face the lake. The dining room, with picture windows forming its south wall, spices its delicious meals with an unbroken view of the massive peaks that surround Lake Louise. Beneath its terrace are the thousands of Iceland Poppies for which Lake Louise is famous.

Upstairs, modern comfort typifies the living appointments of Chateau Lake Louise. Whether your suite or balconied bedroom faces the lake or the range, its interior comfort is designed for healthful sleep engendered by the crisp, beneficial mountain air. Fully licensed, Chateau Lake Louise promises you the utmost in mountain holidays.

You can be strenuous, restful, adventurous or placid at Chateau Lake Louise. You make the choice, the Chateau offers the amenities. From riding—and you can rent a habit if there was no room in your baggage—to hiking (wear thick soles and low heels for the slopes) to boating, swimming or putting on the flower-bordered green, there are activities to fill your days. 
Sun-filled, sheltered, the terrace swimming pool. You swim in glacier water filtered, warmed and ever changing.




SCENIC LIFTS



Here's a typical Chateau Lake Louise bedroom.



Lovers of the antique will enjoy interesting reproductions.


