
MAP OF

## **Banff Springs Hotel**

This modern castle-hotel — a Canadian Pacific hostelry — stands at the confluence of the Bow and the Spray rivers amid a circle of majestic mountains. It is 4,625 feet above sea level. Banff Springs Hotel, with its fireproof construction; 600 attractive guest rooms, all with bath; luxurious suites; spacious public rooms; tasteful and varied cuisine and regal setting is the ultimate in comfort and enjoyment.

Points of Interest - Bow River Falls - Buffalo Park Animal Paddock - Cascades of Time - Museum - Royal Canadian Mounted Police Barracks - Beaver Colonies, dams and houses (3 miles west of Banff) - Bow River Boat-house - Banff Mineral Springs Hospital - Alpine Club House - Hoodoos - Mount Norquay Chair Lift - Banff Springs Hotel - Canadian Government Sulphur Water Pools at Cave and Basin - Upper Hot Springs - Sulphur Mountain Gondola Lift.

**Trail Riding -** Trail Riding is one of the joys of a mountain holiday. Many scenes of unsurpassed beauty can be reached only by trail.

Sulphur Mountain, Trail past the Upper Hot Sulphur Springs. All day.

Spray Valley, following the Spray River and visiting the goat traps. Half day or all day.

Loop Trail, skirting the golf course where a brisk canter may be enjoyed on the level stretches. 2 hours.

Healy Creek and Brewster Creek, Trail on the way to Mount Assiniboine. Half day or all day.

Mount Edith Pass, gateway to the vast mountain region to the north. All day.

Hoodoos, Trail skirting tunnel mountain north of the Bow River. Half day.

High-line Trail, Trail following Spray River for 3 miles and returning via Upper Hot Sulphur Springs. 2 hours.

Riding clothes may be rented at the Checkroom.

Rates for horses and guides are fixed by Government regulation.

Enquire at Information Desk in Main Lobby.

Camping and Hunting trips may also be arranged at Information Desk.


Nearby Beauty Spots - Lake Louise, Victoria Glacier, Emerald Lake, Moraine Lake and Valley of Ten Peaks - The Lakes in the Clouds, Agnes and Mirror - Lake O'Hara - Lake Wapta - Yoho Valley and Takakkaw Falls - Radium Hot Springs - Mount Eisenhower - Mount Assiniboine - Natural Bridge - Plain of Six Glaciers - Twin Falls - Kicking Horse Canyon - Stoney Indian Reserve at Morley - The Great Divide - Columbia Icefield Highway.

Canadian Pacific Operates - Chateau Lake Louise - European Plan - forty miles from Banff. 5,680 feet above sea level. Ask the Information Clerk for further particulars.

## Mountain Motoring at Banff

**General Drive** - Vehicles leave Banff Springs Hotel for Buffalo Park, thence Tunnel Mountain Road, with excellent view of the Bow Falls, Spray Valley and the town of Banff. After visiting Buffalo Park, where fine specimens of big game may be seen, the return journey is made through the town, with stops at the Cave and Basin and Cascades of Time. - 2 hours.

**To Lake Louise via Johnston Canyon -** Among the many points of interest en route are Vermilion Lakes, Hole-in-the-Wall, Pilot Mountain and Mount Eisenhower. A stop is made at Johnston Canyon for a visit to the Falls. - One way, 2 hours; return, all day trip.



To Lake Minnewanka - The combined motor and launch trip will ever remain a pleasant memory. The motor road passes through the town and continues to the Lake via Buffalo Park, Bankhead and Devil's Canyon. The mountains are very impressive when viewed from the launch during the delightful sail on the lake - 3 hours.

Twilight Tour - Beaver Dams and Mt. Norquay Road - At dusk the Canadian Beaver can sometimes be seen in the construction of their dams and lodges. From the slopes of Stoney Squaw Mountain some of the finest views of the Bow Valley, and the environs of Banff, lovely in the soft evening light, can be seen -  $1\frac{1}{2}$  hours.

Other sightseeing tours to scenic points of interest are available at convenient schedules throughout the day. De Luxe private cars for hire by the hour or day. Full information and rates at Gray Line Desk in Main Lobby of the hotel. (Motor car tariffs in Banff National Park are fixed by Canadian Government.)

Other sightseeing tours to scenic points of interest, including the famous Columbia Icefields, are available throughout the season.

## Suggestions For Daily Recreation

Golf - Banff Springs Hotel Golf Course is one of the world's most beautiful championship courses. 18 holes, 6,704 yards, par 71. The Club House and first tee are only 100 yards from the hotel. Green fees: per round or per day \$5.00; per week \$30.00; per month \$100.00, and per season \$150.00. A fully equipped pro-shop is operated at the Club House. Caddies are also available.

Swimming - Filtered fresh water pools 74/78° F. Competent instructor in charge.

**Fishing** - There is good fishing in many of the lakes and streams of Banff National Park. Dolly Varden, Grayling, Rainbow, Cutthroat and Nipigon trout offer thrilling sport. Lake trout, specimens of which run to 50 pounds, are found in Lake Minnewanka only.

An experienced fishing advisor, familiar with the fishing waters of National Parks, is at Banff Springs Hotel and will gladly give information as to the best fishing lakes and streams, or conduct parties.

**Boating** - Rowboats, canoes and motorboats may be hired at Bow River Boat-house which is located on the Cave and Basin Road near the Bow River Bridge.

Trips can be made up the Bow River for 8 miles, also up Echo River (which flows into the Bow a short distance west of the Boat-house), thence via Willow Creek to the Vermilion Lakes, which offer delightfully shady waterways for canoeing.

Motor launches make several trips daily up the Bow River. Round trip, 16 miles,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  hours. A 10-minute stop is made at the upper end of trip, near which is good fishing and a fine place for picnicking. Passengers may stop over and return by a later trip if they so desire. For full particulars and rates enquire at Information Bureau.

Tennis - Five fast, hard surface tennis courts are situated in the Athletic Field, north of the hotel.

**Putting** - 9-hole green near Swimming Pool. Putters and balls are obtainable (without charge) at the Check Room.

**Shuffleboard** - On the Terrace overlooking the magnificent Bow River Valley.

Mountain Climbing - Banff is a popular centre for mountain climbing.

**Photography** - Photograph film stocked in standard sizes, fresh color film, expert developing and printing.

Dancing - Every evening, except Sunday, in the Cascade Room of Banff Springs Hotel (Guests of Hotel only).

Dinner Music - Every evening.

Musicale - Every evening, except Sunday, 9 p.m. Mount Stephen Hall (Hotel Guests only).

Mt. Rundle Lounge & Cascade Lounge - Open daily except Sunday.

Library - A selection of books by well-known writers - fictional, educational and historical.
