



In NEW YORK, the terminals at Liberty Street and 23rd Street are most convenient. The Liberty Street Terminal (one block south of Cortlandt Street) is close to the financial and business district and convenient to all Subway, Elevated and Surface lines. The West Shore Railroad Station directly adjoins Liberty Street Terminal and no transfer is required for West Point, Newburgh, and Albany. Colonial Line Steamers leave adjoining Pier for Providence with connections to Boston and other New England points. West 23rd Street Station adjoins the Eric Railroad and Lackawanna Terminals and is also the most convenient approach to Ocean Steamship Piers.




