One of the first railroads to do away with the cumbersome, eyestraining timetable of yore and to provide in its stead a well-designed modern version, the Coast Line continues its study and to make changes for the better.

This issue of the folder incorporates the latest improvements.

Below are a few brief suggestions that will, if read and followed, be very helpful. We believe you will appreciate the ease with which you can readily locate the information you need.

READ THROUGH THIS PAGE—YOU'LL FIND IT HELPFUL

TABLE OF CONTENTS

The table of contents on page 4 will assist you in quickly locating, by page number, all the information appearing in this folder.

TRAIN SERVICE SCHEDULES

All schedule tables in this folder are *lettered* or *numbered* and appear in sequence beginning on page 8. They show stations served directly by the Atlantic Coast Line and its connections.

STATION INDEX

To find service to and from station in which you are interested locate the station in the alphabetical station index beginning on page 5 and continuing on pages 6 and 7. The numbers following each station are the schedule table numbers (not page numbers) on which you will find train service to and from that particular station.

TIME

AM or PM: Time from 12.01 AM (midnight) to and including 12.00 Noon is shown in light-faced figures and time from 12.01 PM (Noon) to 12.00 Midnight in dark-faced figures. STANDARD TIME is used throughout this folder and is referred to as Eastern Time or Central Time as the case may be.

TRAIN STOPS

Trains make regular stop at stations where time figures only are shown. When a symbol (circle with number) appears in train column, either with or without time figures, opposite a station, this indicates train stops on certain conditions. Note carefully when any symbols appear. The explanation thereof is given under REFERENCE NOTES at bottom of same page. Where trains make a conditional stop, advance notice must be given to agent when passenger wishes to board a train or to conductor when passenger wishes to get off. Where only a dotted line (. . . .) appears in train column train does not stop.

On page 4 is the Table of Contents and Guide to Train Service, which when used with the Station Index on pages 5, 6 and 7, will take you directly to the information you need. Page numbers are clearly marked in the upper corners of the page. All related information is grouped together. Reference material is given on every page on which reference marks are used. General Information for Passengers appears on pages 4 and 5.

The over-all arrangement of this folder, the clear readable type it is printed in, the use of white space, easy-to-spot headings and information flow have been chosen . . . to help you make your travel plans as smooth, easy and pleasant as an Atlantic Coast Line trip itself.

READ DOWN or READ UP

Where station column in tables appears in center of table the schedule figures at the left of stations should be read down (top to bottom) and the schedule figures at the right of station should be read up from bottom to top. In all other tables read down.

STATIONS BETWEEN RULES

In tables where stations are shown between horizontal rules this indicates they are on lines branching from the line covered by the table and show connecting service. Very often through car service is provided to such points; if so it will be shown under equipment for that particular train on pages 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 or 13.

EQUIPMENT

Equipment carried on all Atlantic Coast Line trains is shown on pages 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13.

DAYS ON WHICH TRAINS OPERATE

Trains usually operate daily or daily except Sunday, some trains less frequently. The days on which trains operate are shown at the top of train columns and when space does not permit this, it is shown by reference mark with explanation thereof at bottom of page.

PLANNING A TRIP

You will find it helpful as well as interesting to use the map on pages 18 and 19 when planning a trip. Mark thereon the points between which you wish to travel, then draw a line over the route, thus revealing the territory to be covered. This is particularly helpful in locating your connecting point should one of your stations be off the through line of travel.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

When in need of additional information or help in planning your trip consult the nearest Atlantic Coast Line office listed on page 34.

NO RESPONSIBILITY is assumed for errors in time tables, nor for inconvenience or damage resulting from delayed trains or failure to make connections. Schedules and equipment shown herein subject to change without notice.

TICKET OFFICES at all important stations are open thirty minutes before departure of trains, and passengers are requested to purchase tickets before boarding trains. Passengers should always procure tickets at regular railroad ticket offices, as there are numerous expired and counterfeit tickets in the hands of unauthorized parties for sale, which when presented, are rejected by conductors.

ADJUSTMENT OF DIFFERENCES: In the event of disagreement relative to tickets, passenger should pay conductor's claim, taking receipt, and refer

the case for adjustment to the Passenger Traffic Manager, Wilmington, N. C., who will refund overcharge. Conductors have no discretionary power and are governed by rules which they are not authorized to change.

REDEMPTION OF TICKETS: All tickets issued by this Company are limited. If limit of ticket expires before used, it will be redeemed in accordance with established rules. Passengers purchasing tickets which for any reason they do not use in their entirety should not attempt to dispose of them to unauthorized dealers, as this Company will fully protect original purchasers from loss where for satisfactory reasons the tickets are not used, refunding the value of unused portion of such tickets. Forward tickets with full particulars to the Passenger Traffic Manager, Wilmington, N. C., for adjustment.

CHILDREN: Children under five years of age, in charge of competent person, are carried free. Those five years of age and under twelve are required to pay half fare. Those twelve years of age and over are required to pay full fare.

STOP-OVERS: Regular one-way tickets are limited to thirty (30) days in addition to the date of sale and are good for stop-over at all intermediate points within limit, upon application to train conductor. Stop-overs will be allowed at all intermediate points in either direction on all classes of regular round-trip tickets.

BAGGAGE will be checked and transported subject to regulations and charges contained in tariffs on file at each agency station. A service charge is assessed for checking baggage, 25 cents for each piece of hand baggage, and 50 cents for each trunk and articles other than hand baggage. Carriers have been forced to make a small service charge as result of substantial increases in the cost of handling checked baggage. Generally 150 pounds of baggage may be checked on each adult ticket and 75 pounds on each half-fare ticket. When the free weight allowances are exceeded charges are assessed for excess weight in accordance with tariff regulations. No single piece of baggage that weighs over 300 pounds, measures over 72 inches in any dimension or is valued at over \$2500.00, can be checked. Money, jewelry, negotiable papers and like valuables and liquids may not be shipped in baggage. Dogs and other household pets may be checked and transported subject to tariff regulations and charges. Sporting paraphernalia, such as baseball, football, golf, guns (unloaded), lodge paraphernalia, fishing rods and tackle when enclosed in trunks or other suitable containers; also baby carriages, go carts and bicycles (not motorcycles) may be checked in baggage service, included in weight and value of passenger's baggage. Every effort is made to handle baggage promptly, but the railroad cannot guarantee to forward baggage on the same train with the passenger; nor can the time of arrival at destination be guaranteed. Storage charges, under tariff regulations, apply on baggage not promptly claimed at destination.

DON'T BURDEN YOURSELF with unnecessary baggage on the train. We suggest that for a more comfortable trip passengers carry with them only the baggage that will be needed enroute and check the balance. Baggage may be checked through to home address, hotel or other address at certain destinations to insure prompt delivery and avoid the necessity for attention to baggage at destination. Delivery charges will be collected at the time of delivery of baggage. This delivery arrangement is in effect at the principal stations on Atlantic Coast Line and other railroads. Consult the ticket agent or baggage agent at starting point; also consult him about having baggage checked from home, hotel or other street address. Mark or tag each piece of baggage, inside or outside, with your name and permanent address, whether the baggage is checked or carried with you on the train. Ask the ticket agent or baggage agent for tags and labels.

BAGGAGE LIABILITY is limited by the tariff to a maximum of \$100.00 on each adult ticket, but higher value may be declared, thus increasing the liability. The charge for excess value is 20 cents for each \$100.00 or fraction. No single shipment may be valued at more than \$2500.00. Personal effects and baggage insurance policies of St. Paul Fire and Marine Insurance Company, insuring baggage and personal effects during the entire journey, may be purchased at principal Atlantic Coast Line stations and because of the liberal coverage we commend this to your consideration. Consult ticket agent or baggage agent for rates and other information.

LOST ARTICLES: When articles are lost on train or in waiting rooms, owners should apply at once to the ticket agent or baggage agent at station where they left train, or write to Passenger Traffic Manager, Wilmington, N. C. Report to the Pullman Company the loss of articles in Pullman cars. The protection of such personal property is the responsibility of the passenger.

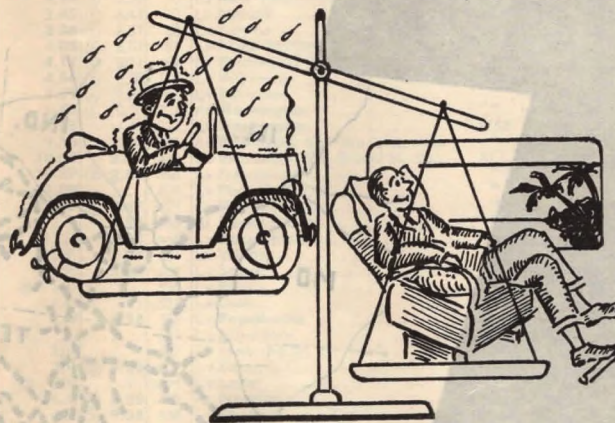
