# Columbia River Historical Expedition of 1926

The Columbia River Historical Expedition will travel from Chicago, Illinois, to Seaside, Oregon and return on a Great Northern Railway special train. Those receiving an invitation are eligible to join this Expedition, for which a Special All Expense fare has been provided. This fare, quoted herein, covers every expense incident to the tour, such as transportation, Pullman sleeping car accommodations, all meals whether on the dining car enroute or at hotels and picnic grounds on various occasions, automobile and bus transportation where required; in other words, everything but your own personal incidentals.

This tour offers you, at a moderate cost, the rare combination of a delightful vacation trip through the scenic splendors of the Northwest's real Adventure Land, with an opportunity to learn many important and interesting things about the early history of this country.

The route of the Expedition is over the world-famed highway of steel that James J. Hill constructed in regions where the bold Verendryes, the fearless David Thompson and our own Immortals, Lewis and Clark, had explored but a few generations before, and along the route of the Government survey for a railway from the Mississippi to the Pacific made by Isaac I. Stevens in 1853-4. At each stop, which will be at some place notable in the early history of the Northwest, speakers of national and international prominence will deliver addresses on the adven-

tures of the explorers, pathfinders and pioneers, the escapades of the fur traders and trappers and the struggles of the early settlers, whose dauntless courage made possible the Northwest of today.

From your car window you will gaze out upon the Lake Park region of Minnesota, dotted with hundreds of tree-bordered, sky-blue lakes and famous as the route of the Red River Ox-cart; you will follow the waters of the mighty Missouri, waterway of a thousand hopes and fears; you will cross the Rockies through the lowest and last to be discovered of the passes—Marias Pass and coast below the purple crags that hem in the greenish-blue The train will carry you past Pend waters of the Kootenai. Oreille Lake and on into the Spokane country; then down the "North Bank" of the far-famed Columbia to the sea. An automobile trip will be made on the scenic Columbia River Highway and a day will be spent at the Pacific beaches. Sight-seeing tours will be made of many cities throughout the journey-St. Paul, Minneapolis, Great Falls, Spokane, Portland and Longview. Two days will be spent amid the towering snow-capped peaks of America's great mountain playground-Glacier National Park, and for the final day there will be a daylight ride underneath the verdure-clad bluffs that line the Mississippi River.

Every detail of the Columbia River Historical Expedition has been carefully planned in advance to make this journey most enjoyable and instructive. Experienced men will be in charge and the equipment of the Columbia River Special will be of the most modern type. The Pullman sleeping cars are among the newest and most complete products of the Pullman Company's shops and embody every convenience for the traveler. The dining car service is being specially planned for the twelve days with a view of furnishing an appetizing variety of choice foods produced in greatest perfection in the Northwest. The train will also carry an observation car with extra high windows which will afford the passengers a good opportunity to view the scenery enroute.
