


FOR 300 miles alongside the Kootenai River—that is how out of Montana and across the Idaho "Panhandle" the Great Northern makes its way through the rugged Cabinet Mountains. Kootenai Canyon is one of a hundred wonder-places along this scenic track.

**A**T Glacier Park Hotel, in the Montana Rocky Mountains —"Great Trees Lodge" and gateway hostelry of Glacier National Park that's at the trackside of the transcontinental line—all of the Great Northern's overland trains pause at the "front door" of America's foremost summer playground.




ACROSS the Continental Divide and through the main range of the Montana Rocky Mountains the Great Northern's transcontinental line for 60 miles skirts the south rim of Glacier National Park—the only transcontinental line that follows alongside a national playground.

**T**HE heart of Minnesota's Lake Park country—where the "10,000 lakes of sky-blue water" are—for more than 200 miles is traversed by the Great Northern's transcontinental line. Lake Geneva, Alexandria, is just one of scores of lakes that outstretch at the trackside.



THE Reservation of the Blackfeet tribes, in the foothills of the Montana Rocky Mountains, nowadays is the home of the "400" of the North American Indians and the one-time landlords of Glacier Park. At the Great Northern's trackside—at Browning station.

**A**T ST. PAUL, by the Mississippi River, the transcontinental line of the Great Northern Railway begins its 2000-mile-long wonder journey via Glacier National Park to the Scenic Northwest—"America's Finest Ride-by-Rail." Annex lines from the Lake Superior cities: Duluth, Superior.



MINNEAPOLIS is the Great Northern's other "by-the-Mississippi" city. The Great Northern's Oriental Limited, however, via the Burlington Route starts its westward journey from Chicago. The Great Northern Express via the Burlington and Billings sets westward from Kansas City.








