"Say it with Service"

From Elbert Hubbard's Scrap Book

Like many another great man, Elbert Hubbard kept a scrap book in which he stored gleanings from the literature of all ages, the best passages from his favorite authors.

Alongside of paragraphs from Shelley, Tennyson, Socrates, Queen Victoria, Galileo, Danie O'Connell, Plato, George Washington and Dante, is this statement made by James J. Hill:

"While the railroads of the United States may have mistakes to answer for, they have created the most effective, useful and by far the cheapest system of land transportation in the world. This has been accomplished with very little legislation and against an immense volume of opposition and interference growing out of ignorance and misunderstanding. It is not an exaggeration to say that in the past history of this country, the railway, next after the Christian religion and the public school, has been the largest single contributing factor to the welfare and happiness of the people."

This statement is as true today as the day that James J. Hill made it; as true as the day Elbert Hubbard clipped it from a newspaper and pasted it in his scrap book.
