THE GREAT RED RIVER VALLEY

The route of the new streamlined RED RIVER courses through the heart of Minnesota's ten thousand lakes and the fertile valley of the Red River of the North, the legendary land of Paul Bunyan.

It is said that the patchwork of shimmering summer resort lakes north of Saint Paul and Minneapolis are the rain-filled footprints of the lumberjack colossus who cleared the pine forests with a few swings of his mighty ax.

In summer, sleek sail boats by the scores, skippered by vacationists from all parts of the nation, cruise these sky-blue waters. Great herds of dairy cattle graze the flat rich land, and golden fields of wheat, oats, barley and corn color the autumn scene.

Farther north, the route traverses the famous Red River Valley of Minnesota and North Dakota, long renowned as the "Breadbasket of the World". With natural endowments of rich soil and good rainfall, combined with excellent transportation facilities, this area once was known only for its bonanza wheat farms. Its agriculture is now diversified and its economy stabilized with other crops of potatoes, sugar beets and alfalfa which are produced in abundance.
