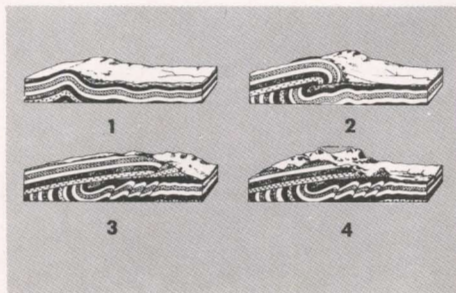
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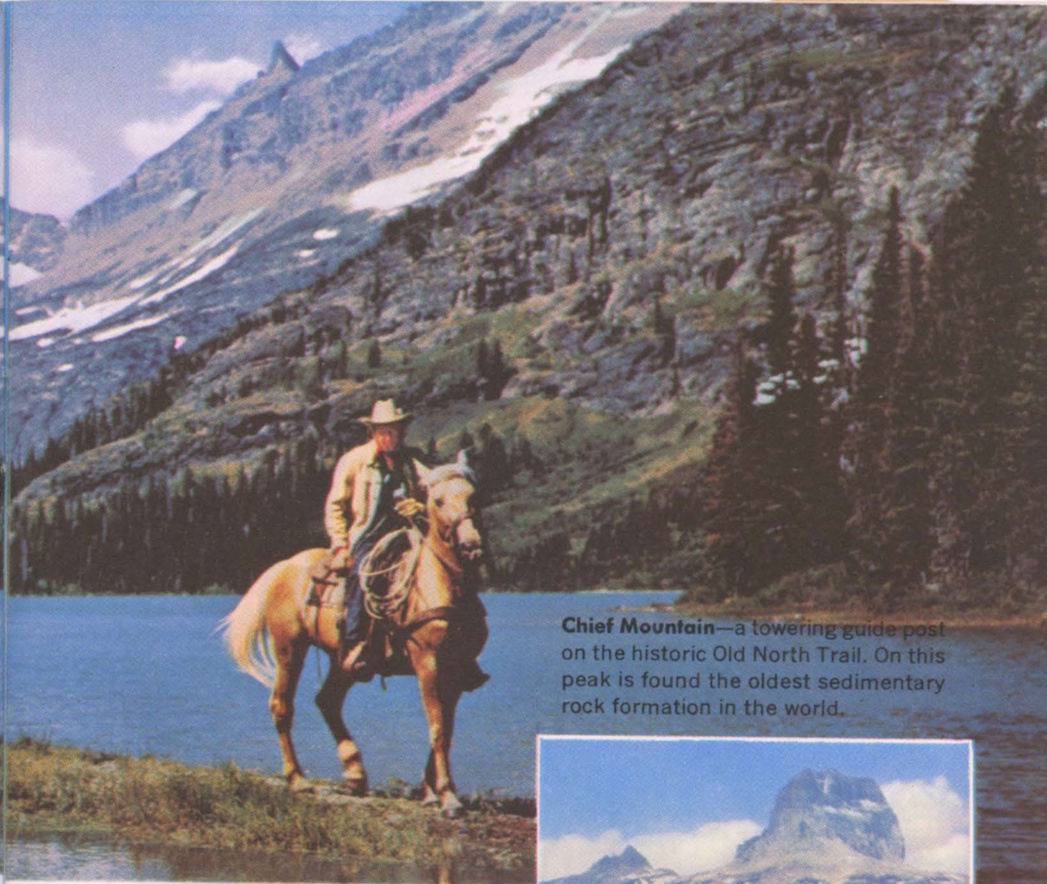


A million years in the

Geologists say that Glacier Park is *different* ... because here the very oldest rock formations are found on the mountain tops. Much younger formations lie beneath the peaks due to a million-year-long upheaval that occurred many years ago. This miracle of nature is called the great Lewis Overthrust and its action is illustrated by the diagrams at right.

Ages ago, layers of sediment gathered at the bottom of a shallow sea. When the water receded, this sea floor became the Great Plains of the West. Eventually, the stresses produced by the changing earth





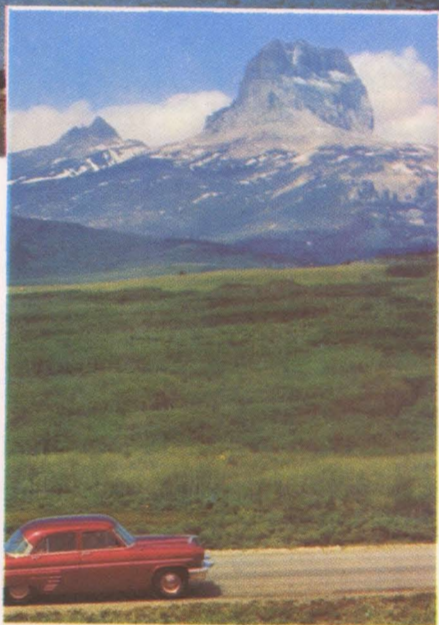
Chief Mountain—a towering guide post on the historic Old North Trail. On this peak is found the oldest sedimentary rock formation in the world.

making...

slowly forced the surface *upward* (diagram 1). Continuing pressure pushed the ancient lower layers of sedimentary rock *up and over* for thousands of feet (2). Some of these lower layers were “overthrust” as much as 18 miles to the East (3).

The peaks and valleys we see today (4) were gradually hewn by the storms of centuries, the grinding of the Ice Ages, the glaciers and the rivers.

You'll trace the course of this miracle of evolution when you visit Glacier Park. In the familiar landmarks you'll see mute evidence of Nature's irresistible, awesome force.

Still Cowboys n' Indians !

Glacier is steeped in Western lore and legend. Once the home of the powerful Blackfeet Indian tribe, much of the Park was purchased from them. The Blackfeet Reservation borders Glacier Park on the East. Many of the Park's most scenic areas and peaks are named for

mighty Chiefs and Scouts who fought, hunted and lived here only a few decades ago. Today, descendants of Blackfeet Chiefs still wear their brilliant costumes and provide color and action for your camera. The Museum of the Plains Indian is located at Browning, Montana.

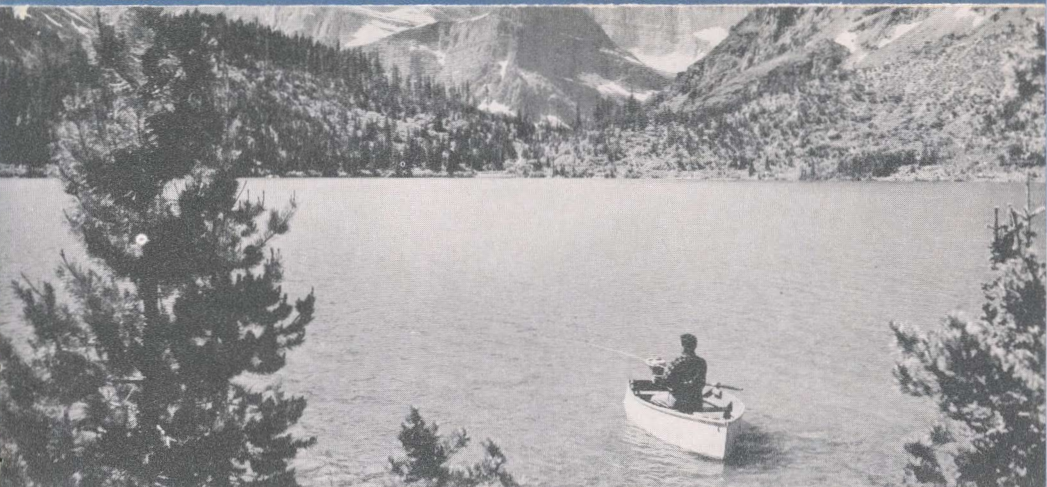

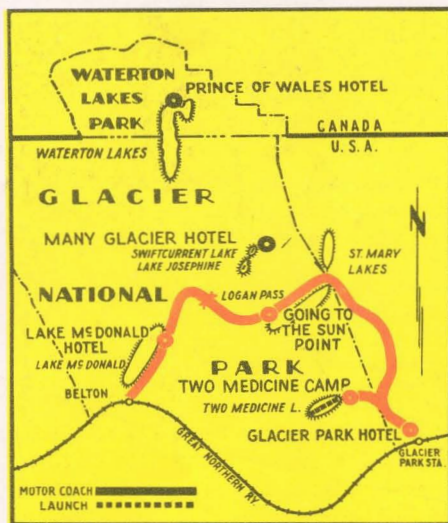

Some are an almost startling blue . . . others are dark purple, reflecting the awesome colors of their rock walls. A few lakes are white from "glacial milk" or red from rocks ground by ice.

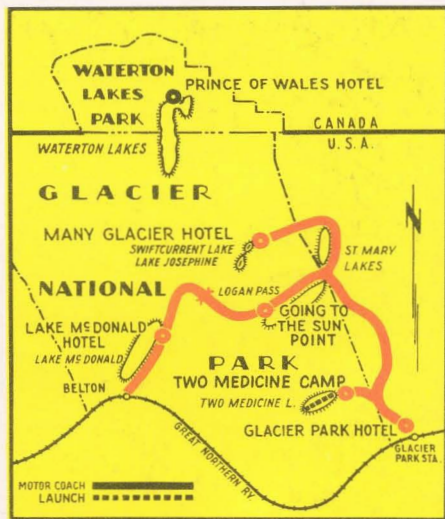

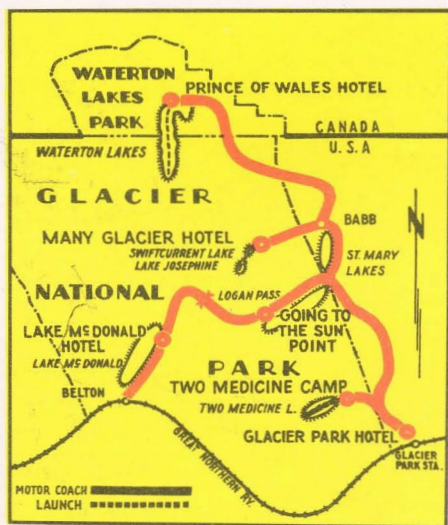

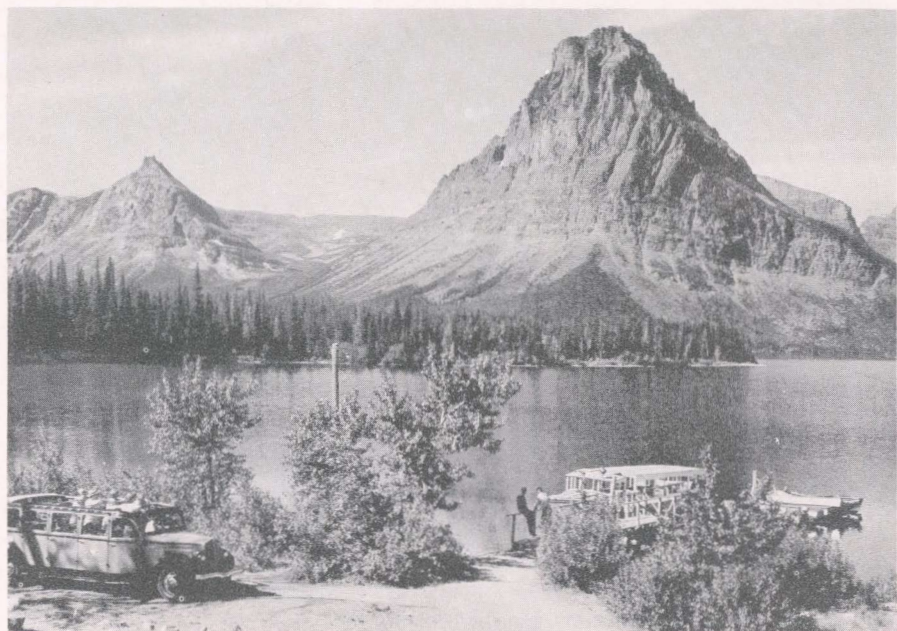

Frequent stops are made along the way wherever passengers wish to take pictures of spectacular panoramas.

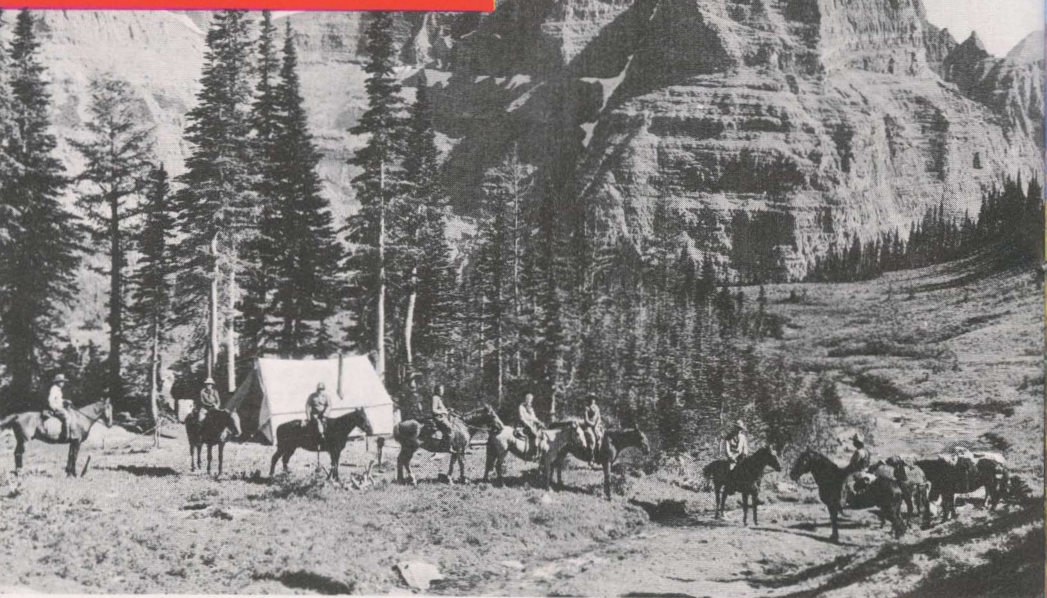


Two Medicine Lake is a high spot on all-expense motor coach tours. .



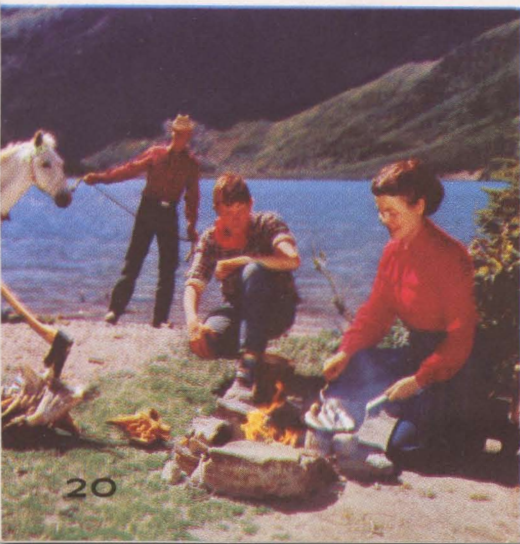
GOING-TO-THE-SUN HIGHWAY, one of the world's most spectacular roads, winds up the mountain sides toward mile-high Logan Pass.

You won't need a license to fish at Glacier!

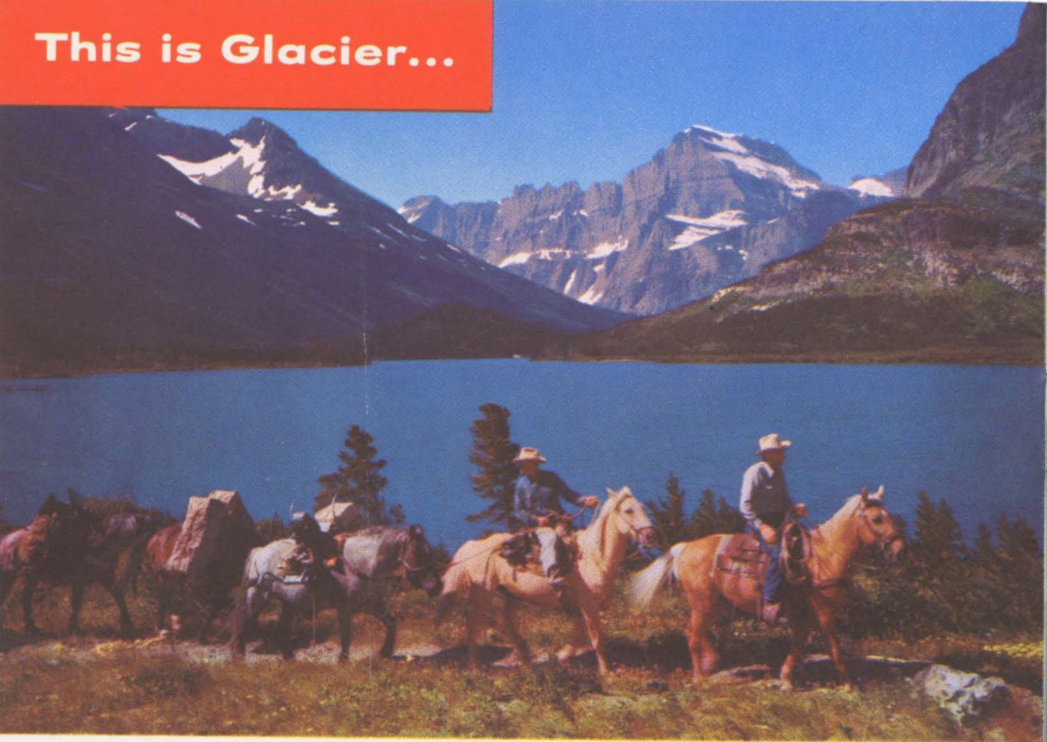
Just Name Your Fun... You'll Find it Here

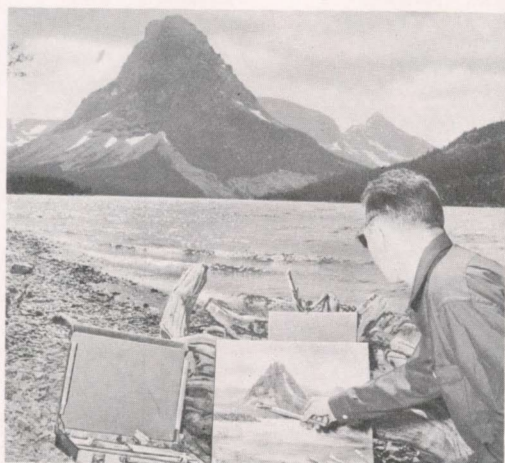

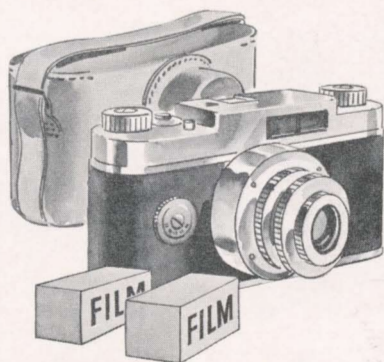

For Your Convenience...

Photo supplies of every kind are sold in all the Glacier hotels. Expert developing and printing service is also available. And Glacier Park will provide "shutter-bugs" with a wealth of camera subjects . . . sharp contrasts for black and white; breathtaking color; dramatic action for movie makers.

Bring your camera—and make a permanent record of your wonderful visit to Glacier!

Clothing needs are simple at Glacier. You can forget city formality. Sports clothing is acceptable everywhere, for all occasions, and evening dress is not needed. Mountain breezes and cool nights call for a warm jacket, sweater or

topcoat. Light cottons and silks are comfortable for sunny days and hotel affairs.

If you plan to follow the trails on foot or horseback, take along a woolen shirt, levis or riding breeches. A brimmed hat or cap will protect you from the brilliant sun. Wear sturdy, sensible shoes for hiking, riding.

Sports clothing, fishing tackle and camping equipment are moderately priced and available at hotel shops. Fishing tackle and riding equipment may also be rented.

Camping is restricted to designated campgrounds. Hikers desiring to camp at other locations must obtain a permit.

ESCAPE HAY FEVER

If you suffer from hay fever, you'll find relief at Glacier! According to the American Academy of Allergy, a vacation spot with a pollen index of less than 5 is ideal. The Academy's survey shows that Glacier has an index of less than one-tenth of one—no irritating pollens in its pure mountain air.



All the Comforts of Home

Mail, telegraph and telephone facilities at Glacier make it easy to keep in touch with home or business. Mail and telegrams for guests at Lake McDonald Hotel should be addressed care of the Hotel, Lake McDonald P.O., Montana. For guests at Prince of Wales Hotel, care of the hotel, Waterton Lakes National Park, Alberta, Canada.

For guests at other hotels address in care of Glacier Park Company, P. O. East Glacier Park, Montana. If you are in the interior of the park, mail will be forwarded according to your instructions. Telegrams and telephone calls will be transmitted to vacationists in the Park at regular telephone tariff rates.

Religious Services are conducted at Glacier Park hotels every Sunday. At Glacier Park Hotel, Catholic services are conducted each Sunday morning at 10:00 A.M. and Protestant services at 8:30 P.M. At Many Glacier Hotel, Catholic services at 6:00 A.M. and Protestant services at 3:00 P.M. In Waterton Lakes Village, Catholic services are at 11:00 A.M., Protestant services at 11:00 A.M. and 7:30 P.M. At Lake McDonald Hotel, Catholic services are at 6:30 A.M. and Protestant services at 3:00 P.M.

Animals in the park are wild animals and should be treated as such. Regulations prohibit feeding, molesting, touching or teasing bears. Observe them only from a safe distance.

COMPLETE HOTEL SERVICES

Glacier Park hotels provide the same standard of services you find in modern hotels in metropolitan centers. Valet and laundry services . . . house physician . . . trained nurses . . . clothing shops . . . room service. In addition, Glacier Park Hotel has a complete beauty parlor . . . and you'll find a barber shop and beauty parlor at Many Glacier Hotel.

There are cocktail lounges and bars at Glacier

Park and Many Glacier Hotels, the latter also operating a state liquor store. Beer is available at the Prince of Wales Hotel, and there is a liquor store in Waterton Lakes Village.

Fishing excursions, horseback trips and guided camping trips can be arranged from Lake McDonald, Many Glacier and Prince of Wales Hotels. If you wish, the hotel will prepare a box lunch for your outing.

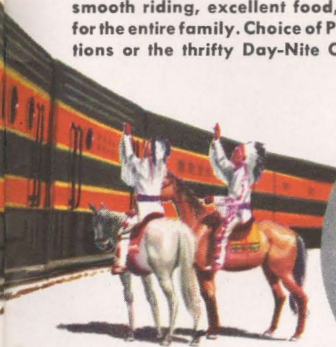
