

FROM MOUNTAINS ...

WHATA VIEW! Mountain crests (many easily accessible by trail) and 60 active glaciers are thrilling settings for the camera fan. Here in the cool, clear, pollen-free air there is little to mar a perfect picture.



TO VALLEYS ...

OPEN TOP MOTOR COACHES wend picturesque roads with romantic names like Going-to-the-Sun Road and Blackfoot Highway. Unobstructed, you can "snap" a mountain goat high above or a splashing waterfall just ahead.



TO LAKES ...

NOW SMILE! A dozen major lakesset like sparkling jewels in a ring of mountains and flower-filled meadows -make picture backdrops an artist would envy. You and a basket of these Mountain Daisies-what a picture!



FROM HIGHWAYS ...

"BUM" BEARS-so-called by Park people-beg handouts from visitors. Only a few of Glacier's 400 bears will sit erect and pose along the highway. Drivers obligingly stop for these entertaining acts. Don't get too close!



TO BY-WAYS...

HOLD IT! Tame deer show up in the strangest places to have their pictures taken. Maybe at your hotel window; or wandering around your trail camp. But stand farther off to photograph "big brothers" elk and moose.
