


FELLOW AMERICANS ... some of the friendliest folks on earth. One fourth of Alaskans are natives like this Eskimo woman and her child.







SPORTSMAN'S paradise

FISHING VILLAGE OF BARANOF, in southeastern Alaska rests at foot of mountains, beside cascading rivers that plunge into the sea. Part of the rugged, green coastline of the "inside passage", this area is known as Alaska's "panhandle."

MT. McKINLEY, North America's highest peak, thrusts its eternally snowclad summit 20,320 feet into the clouds. Ice Age glaciers carved its jagged spires, knife-like ridges, broad valleys. Modern glaciers are plentiful in Mt. McKinley National Park.
