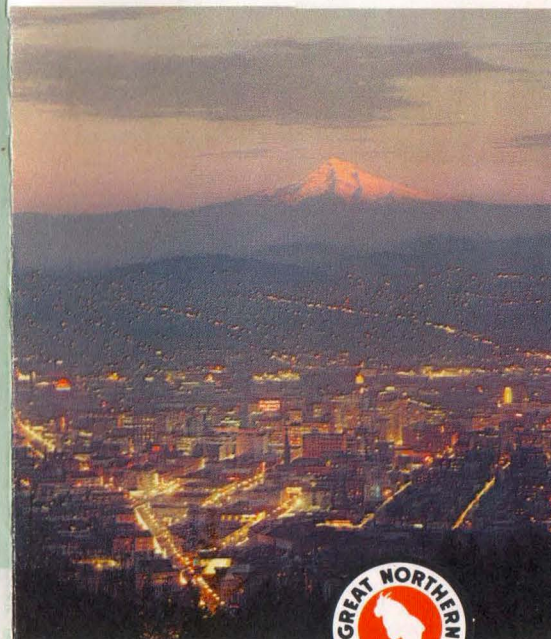

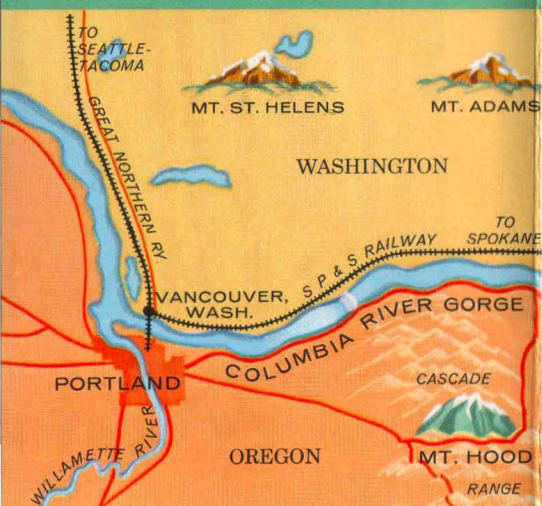

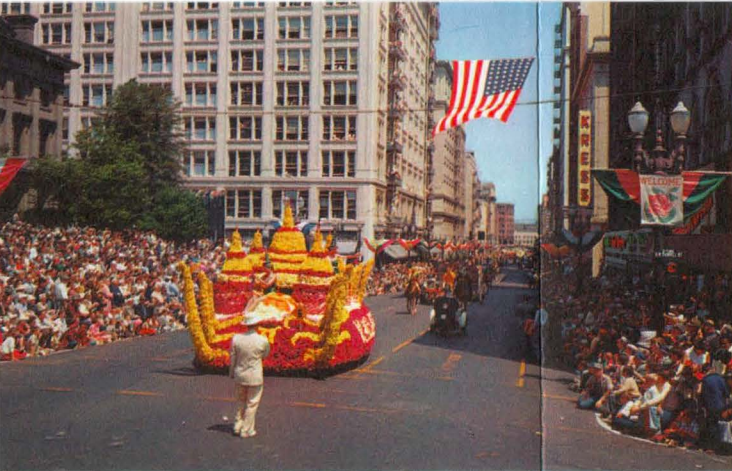

Flowers and friendliness abound in the **CITY OF ROSES**

Proving there's no rose like a Portland Rose, the city's Rose Festival each June is famous for its pageantry, floral parades and winsome princesses. Any time of year, visitors enjoy Portland's western friendliness, and these rewarding sights: Mt. Tabor Park, with its view of the city, rivers and mountains; the garden grotto, or Sanctuary of Our Sorrowful Mother; Washington Park Zoo; Jantzen Beach Amusement Park (four swimming pools!)

NORTHERN OREGON'S magnificently rugged coast, a scenic masterpiece, is little more than an hour away by car. Numerous state parks like this preserve its sweeping grandeur.



LAMBERT GARDENS, 30 acres of indescribable floral beauty, are best known for roses—countless varieties and colors. Equally impressive are the tulips and zinnias.



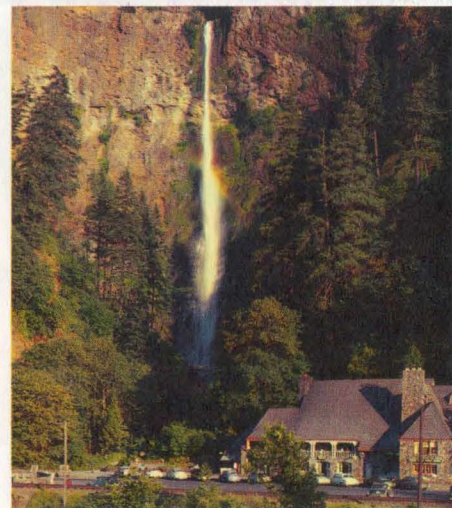
Memorably scenic palisades of the **COLUMBIA**

You'll pass 11 shimmering waterfalls, including famous Horsetail and Bridal Veil, on the two-hour loop trip up the Columbia River Gorge. Leave Portland by bus or car along the scenic highway past Crown Point to mighty Bonneville Dam and fish hatchery; return the water level expressway beside the raging Columbia, whose rushing waters carved these scenic splendors.

BONNEVILLE DAM and fish ladders, 40 miles up the Columbia from Portland. Fingerling salmon are marked and released each year. Four years later, they return to home streams for spawning.



HIGHEST of eleven falls in ten miles along the Columbia, Multnomah Falls plunge 620 feet over the sheer palisades . . . 541 feet in one leap. A favorite stop for visitors.



MT. ST. HELENS' snowy slopes rise majestically above Spirit Lake in Washington, north of Portland. Great country for the outdoorsman.



Snow-crowned sentinels in an all-year playground **MIGHTY CASCADE PEAKS**

Leaping up two miles or more from coastal lowlands, the Cascade Mountain peaks surrounding Portland are uniquely impressive. Stately Mt. Jefferson to the south, and just north of the Columbia in Washington, lovely Mt. St. Helens, and Mt. Adams, loftier than Oregon's highest.

TIMBERLINE LODGE, only 3½ miles by trail from Mt. Hood's icy summit, is open year-round. Ski facilities include a fine lift, sno-cats and slopes ideal for beginner and champion.
