On the front cover of this menu is reproduced "Desperate Stand", one of the masterpieces of Western art by Charles Marion Russell, world-famous Montana cowboy artist. Largely self-taught, Russell had no peer in the depiction of the Western horse, the plains cowboy and the Indian. He died in Great Falls, Montana, in 1926.

A modern art gallery in Great Falls, sponsored by the Trigg-Russell Foundation and dedicated to the memory of Charlie Russell, houses many of this artist's finest oils, watercolors, sketches and sculptures. The gallery is adjacent to the painter-sculptor's former home.



The scenic and historic route of the Western Star stretches Westward from Chicago to Seattle, Washington, and Portland, Oregon, great inland seaports of the Pacific Northwest, via Saint Paul, Minneapolis, Saint Cloud, Alexandria and Fergus Falls in Minnesota; Fargo, Grand Forks, Minot and Williston in North Dakota; Great Falls, Montana, and Spokane, Washington.

From Chicago to Saint Paul the route is that of the Burlington Lines; between the Twin Cities and Seattle, that of Great Northern Railway, and from Spokane to Portland, along the North bank of the Columbia River, via the Spokane, Portland & Seattle Railway.

Great Northern's main line swings through three time zones; over two major mountain ranges; along the boundary of Montana's Glacier National Park, America's third largest and only national park on the main line of a transcontinental railway; and through the formidable Cascade Range in Washington, by means of the 7.79-mile Cascade Tunnel, longest rail bore in the Western Hemisphere.

The Western Star serves Glacier National Park daily June 15 through September 10.
