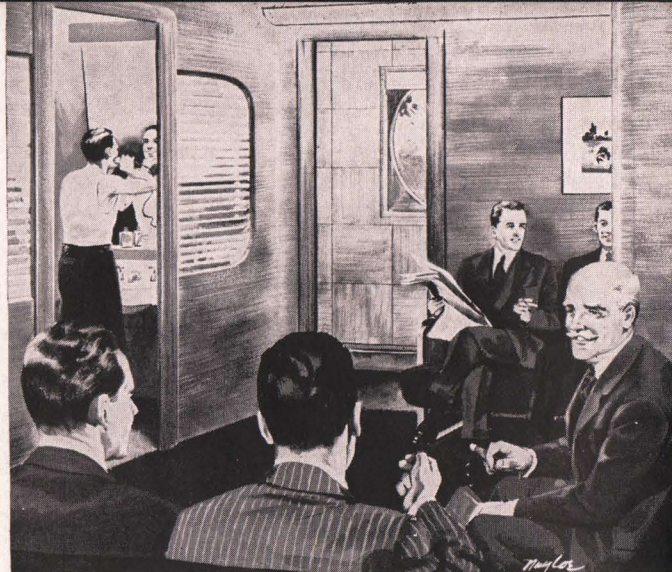


Milwaukee Road Speedliners go transcontinental!

FOR TWELVE YEARS Milwaukee Road Speedliners have been consistent leaders in popularity with the traveling public. Now, with the introduction of these new trains, HIAWATHA service is being extended over 1800 route miles.

To those traveling on business or for pleasure, the OLYMPIAN HIAWATHAS bring more than flashing speed and the luxury of a superbly appointed train operating over a seasoned, well-ballasted roadbed. They also offer intimate close-ups of a route that is unsurpassed for scenic charm.

Beginning June 29th, The Milwaukee Road will offer a double daily service on the OLYMPIAN HIAWATHAS and the COLUMBIAN (formerly the Olympian) which will continue to be electrically operated over the mountains.

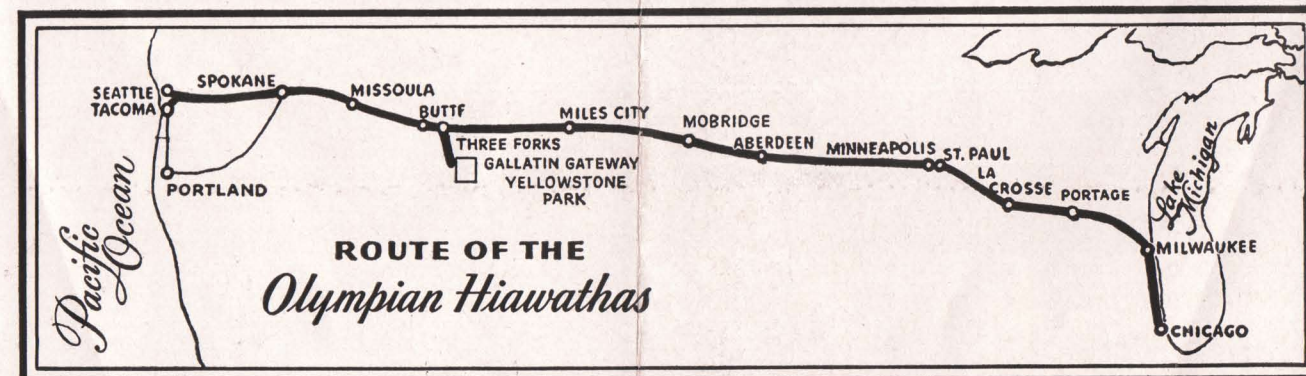

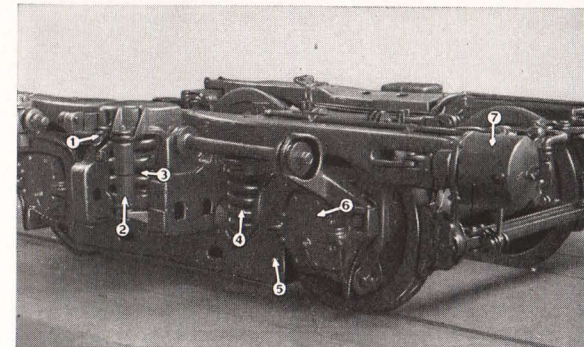


ARROW SWIFT... SHADOW SMOOTH AND SILENT

THE OLYMPIAN HIAWATHA represents the latest advance in engineering design. Pulled by 6,000 horsepower diesel-electric locomotives, this train will be capable of cruising at a hundred miles per hour, and of maintaining high speeds over mountain grades.

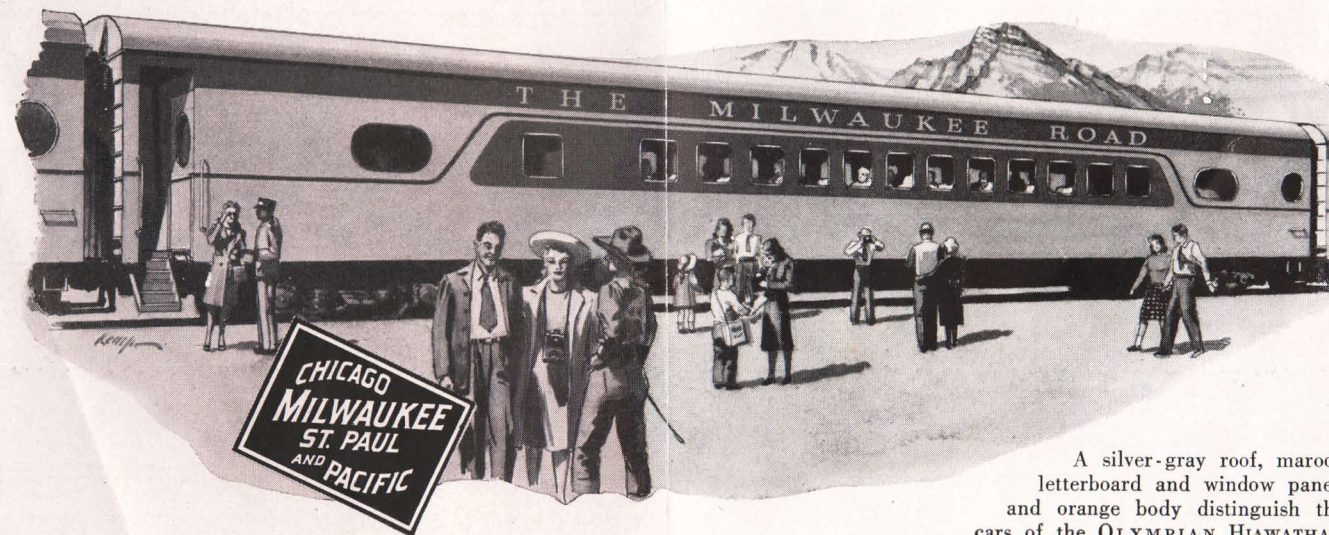
Equipment for the OLYMPIAN HIAWATHAS, with the exception of the all-room sleeping cars scheduled for later delivery, was built in The Milwaukee Road's own modern shops at Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Full advantage has been taken of the experience and engineering knowledge gained through the production and operation of the famous HIAWATHA fleet, which includes the Afternoon Twin Cities HIAWATHA, most popular train in the Midwest. The new equipment embodies advanced principles of design that are based on millions of miles of service. With their rigid frames and all-welded bodies of tough, Cor-ten steel, these cars combine exceptional strength with moderate weight.

The specially designed trucks are a Milwaukee Road development that further reduces sideway and provides a smooth, vibration-free ride. Brakes are of advanced design with electrical controls that respond instantly, yet permit extremely smooth deceleration. Milwaukee Road engineers who pioneered in the use of roller bearings on through trains, have always emphasized riding quality. HIAWATHA innovations have included such items as hydraulic shock absorbers, multiple coil springs and anti-sway stabilizers. You'll travel in perfect comfort on the OLYMPIAN HIAWATHAS.

This silent and smooth riding truck is specially designed to reduce sideway. There are lateral shock absorbers, and the bolster springs and hydraulic shock absorbers are placed considerably outside of the wheels for added stability. Brakes are actuated by new electrical controls.

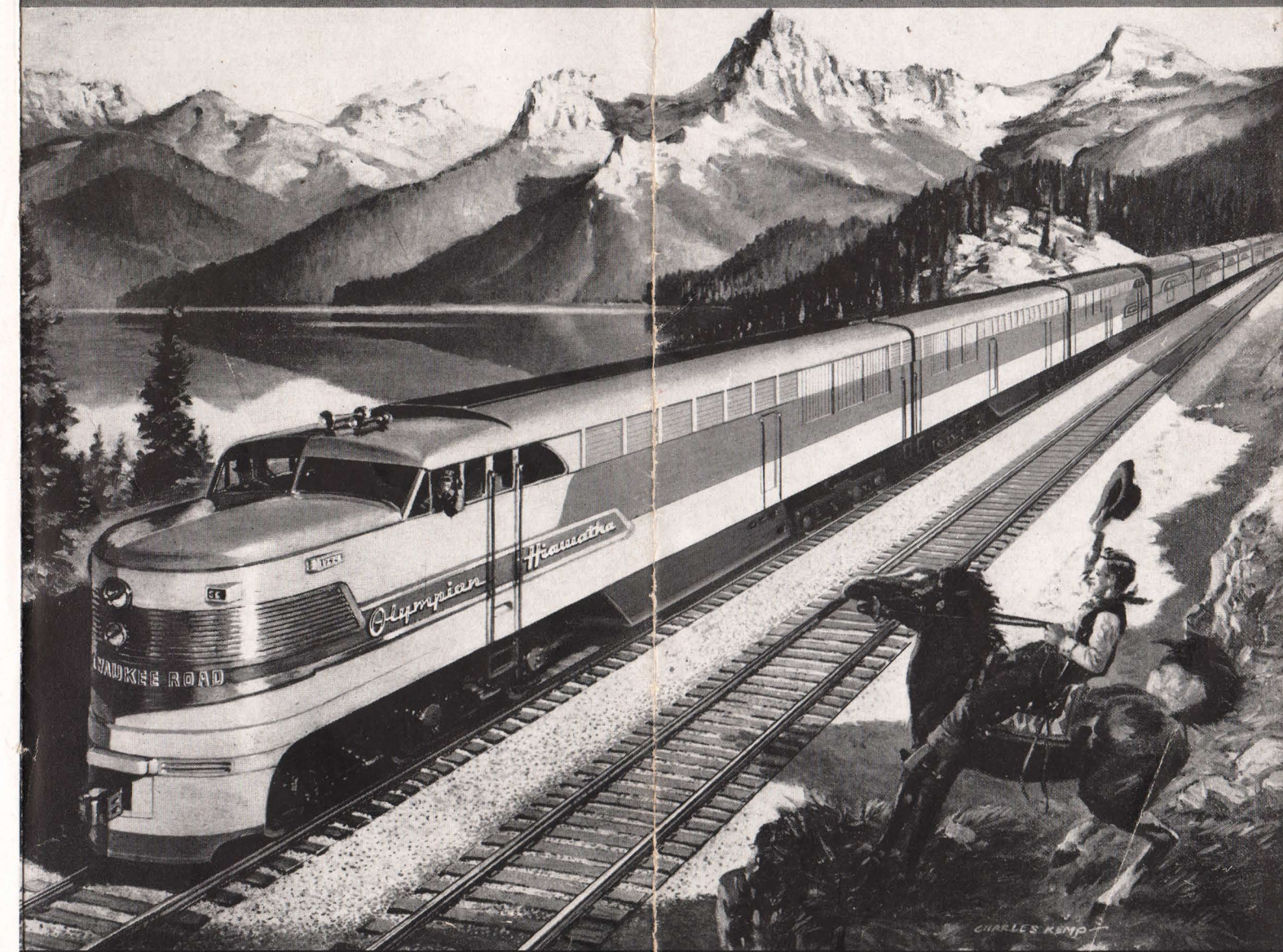


A silver-gray roof, maroon letterboard and window panel, and orange body distinguish the cars of the OLYMPIAN HIAWATHAS.

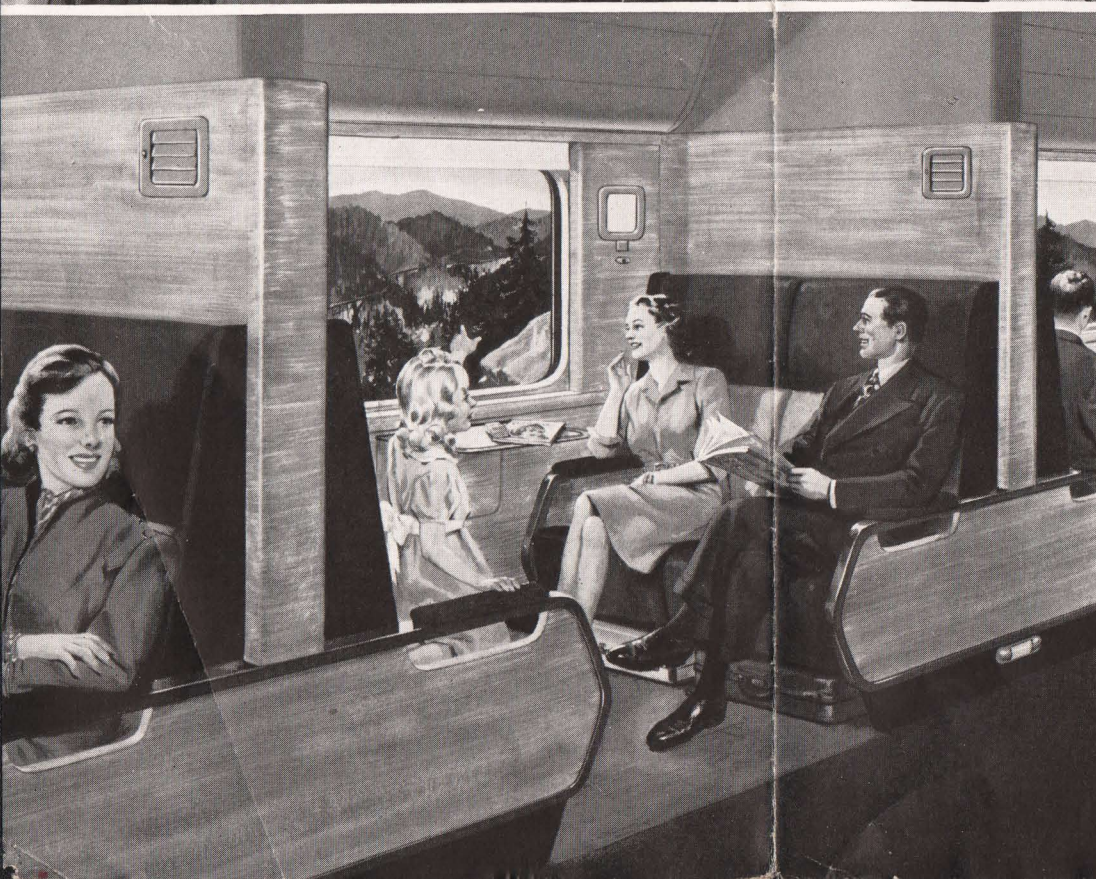

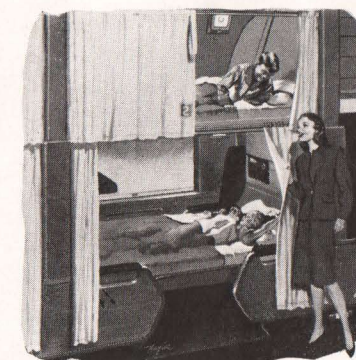

Some of the new features include individually-controlled reclining chairs of the "Sleepy Hollow" type that are padded with resilient foam rubber for maximum comfort. Fluorescent tubes provide evenly distributed, glare-free lighting. Separate lounge rooms for men and women are exceptionally spacious.



TOURALUX SLEEPING CARS afford privacy and comfort by night or day. The extra-wide berths have individual reading lights and air conditioning. Space costs will be about one-third less than in standard sleeping cars, and rail fare little more than in coaches. Here, too, the lounge and dressing rooms are unusually large and well appointed.

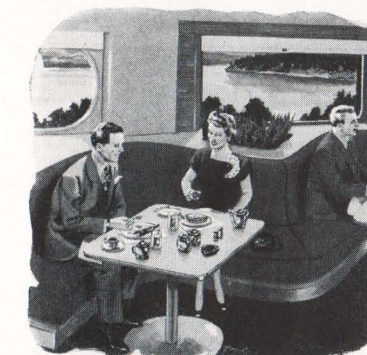
space cost. You'll find nothing like these cars in any other train!
