





## The Milwaukee Railroad - - in Indiana

has an important Investment in right-of-way, station and service buildings, equipment, and in about 450 miles of tracks of all kinds.

It affords transportation facilities in the State at many stations, large and small, of which only a small number are served by any other railroad.

It pays annually Taxes amounting to over \$200,000 for the

construction and maintenance of institutions and facilities for the benefit of residents of this State.

Its Payrolls in Indiana amount to about \$1,500,000 a year—divided among some 900 employes.

It Purchases yearly close to \$11,000,000 worth of Materials and Supplies from producers and manufacturers in this State.

The Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific Railroad is, therefore, one of Indiana's important home industries, contributing to the material and social welfare of the residents of this great State.
