(See Time Folder for bus connections during park season.) 31 miles east of Billings, about 1:44 p. m., pass Pompey's Pillar on left of train, named by Captain Clark of Lewis and Clark expedition.

Forsyth, Mont.Ar
Interesting ranch and open range country, Lv rich in historic lore. South of here General Custer made his last stand at the Battle of the Little Big Horn.

Miles City, Mont.Lv
Named for Gen. Nelson A. Miles, famed Indian fighter. Oil derricks will be seen east of here in the booming Williston Basin.

Connecting N. P. Transport bus Lv. Sidney 3:20 pm, Ar. Glendive 4:45 pm, connecting with North Coast Limited.

Glendive, Mont.Ar
Center of Williston Oil Development. Lv North Dakota's colorful Bad Lands about 6:25 pm. Theodore Roosevelt ranched here.

Dickinson, N. D.Ar
Important financial, livestock and grain Lv center of western North Dakota.

Mandan, N. D. (Mountain Standard Time)...Ar
Lewis and Clark spent winter of 1804-05 in Mandan Indian villages near here. Turn watches ahead one hour, Central Standard Time east of here.....Lv

Bismarck, N. D.Lv
Capital of North Dakota. N. P. tracks reached here building west, in 1873.

Jamestown, N. D.Ar
Site of Jamestown College. Lv

Fargo, N. D.Ar
Largest city in North Dakota and trade Lv center for the rich Red River Valley. Cross Red River into Minnesota.

Staples, Minn.Ar
Passengers for Duluth-Superior transfer Lv here to Train No. 58. Lv. Staples 3:45 am, Ar. Brainerd 4:26 am, Superior 6:50 am and Duluth 7:05 am.

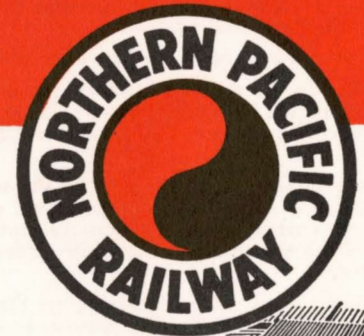
Minneapolis, Minn.Ar

Luxurious Vista-Dome cars on the North Coast Limited—offering both Coach Domes and Pullman Domes—give passengers a glorious new view of the scenic Northwest. There is no extra charge for seats in the Domes and the seats are not reserved.

The Feminine Touch—A popular extra on the North Coast Limited is the Stewardess-Nurse service. A friendly, capable Stewardess-Nurse welcomes you on the train and is ready to give helpful service. All regularly assigned Stewardesses are registered nurses.

Lewis and Clark Traveller's Rest Car—ahead of the dining car—These new Buffet-Lounge cars are, we believe, the most interesting and attractive, and at the same time the most serviceable cars ever offered the traveling public.

Outstanding service features are:

Meals—In the Buffet section, select and a la carte meals and snacks at popular prices are served at the counter from 7 AM throughout the day.

Beverages—There's beverage service all day and evening in the Lounge section.

Library, Cards, Music—Also in the Lounge section there are magazines and tables for cards and throughout the car there is radio reception, and background music from the train's high fidelity sound system.

All passengers are invited to use the facilities of this car.

Luxury Dining Car in the center of the train between the Pullmans and coaches, serves NP's famous table d'hote and a la carte meals. Breakfast service starts at 7 AM, luncheon at 12 noon and dinner at 5 PM.

Pullman Observation-Lounge, at the rear of the train, for Pullman passengers, has the luxurious appointments of a fine club. Radio, magazines, writing desk, background music from the train's public address system. Beverages served from the buffet, 7 AM to midnight.

All-Room Slumbercoaches, now in service on the North Coast Limited between Chicago and Seattle, provide economy-minded travelers with sleeping room privacy at low additional cost on coach tickets.

Travel on Credit—Ask your nearest NP agent about American Express and Rail Travel credit cards, permitting tickets, Pullman and services aboard train to be charged. Billing at end of month.

Baggage Transfer. Pullman passengers may arrange with porter to transfer hand luggage from train to station taxi stand before arrival in Chicago, St. Paul, Minneapolis, Billings, Spokane, Seattle or Portland, on payment of prevailing Red Cap fee for city involved.

Pullman passengers holding through tickets to destination east of Chicago may arrange with Railroad Transfer Service on arrival in Chicago, for transfer of hand luggage to the check room of station from which departure will be made. The prevailing parcel check fee will be charged. Also, passengers holding Pullman space east of Chicago on the 20th Century Limited, Broadway Limited or Capitol Limited, may arrange with their Pullman porter for transfer of hand luggage direct to their outbound space on those trains.

Rail-Auto Service. Arrangements may be made before departure, or en route to provide a new rental car for your own private use on arrival at destination or stopover point. The small auto symbol  appearing in the schedule opposite certain cities shows where this service is available. Charges are nominal. Ask your nearest agent or favorite travel bureau.
