# NORTHERN PACIFIC CENTENNIAL

The building of a northern transcontinental rail line, to follow closely the route blazed by Lewis and Clark, had been advocated as early as 1834. But it was not until 30 years later, when the nation was still divided in the strife of the great Civil War, that Congress enacted a law to authorize the project. President Abraham Lincoln approved this act and signed the Northern Pacific Railroad charter on July 2, 1864. Construction was begun in 1870, progressed rapidly for three years, suspended during five years of Indian wars, financial crises and unforeseen engineering difficulties, and was completed, finally, in 1883. Within seven years of that date, the entire tier of northwestern territories had gained sufficient population to enter the Union.
