

You relax in your ringside seat at this glorious show of Nature. Your train speeds cross-country. And at every turn you are the center of a new and breath-taking panorama. Your attention is so taken with the unfolding beauty of the landscape that there is no time to wonder at the miracles of modern engineering science that go into the maintenance of the "Scenic Line of the World."

Your train speeds over a carefully ballasted roadbed constantly maintained by the most modern and efficient off-track work equipment . . . powerful "cats," bulldozers, and shovels that maintain the way under traffic without interfering with your train.

The rail on which your train rolls weighs 131 pounds per yard and has been specially designed by Rio Grande research engineers using the photo-elastic method in one of the nation's foremost railroad research laboratories located at Rio Grande's Denver shops.

It takes extra power to pull your train up tough mountain grades through the towering Rockies. Mighty mountaintype locomotives, the heaviest in standard-gauge power, are used to speed you on your way. These mammoths of steel and steam mercilessly punish the toughest track . . . even this track that averages 230 tons of steel to the mile.

And no matter which Rio Grande route you travel the most modern signalling devices known to railroading are at your service. Huge, unblinking eyes of red, amber and green watch over your safety, expedite your trip. Hundreds of miles of Rio Grande's busy mainlines are able to carry a double burden through the judicious use of Centralized Traffic Control, an electric network that eliminates delays and so speeds traffic that single track capacity equals 80% of double track capacity.

Our belief that you will travel this way again . . . our faith in your continued good will . . . is our foundation of the future . . . a future that promises remarkable railroading on the "Scenic Line of the World."
