Dudes on Horseback

All the thrills of ranch life in the Rockies, without sacrificing any of the comforts of home, is the lure which annually attracts hundreds of "tenderfeet" to Colorado's colorful Dude Ranches. Riding, hiking, fishing, hunting, outdoor and indoor sports of all kinds, or just plain loafing in this mountain wonderland—all are available in unlimited quantities and to suit any taste.

Riding, of course, is the most popular diversion for the guests, most of whom have cherished from childhood a secret longing for the carefree (according to the story books) life of the cowboy. And so a string of high-quality saddle horses is the most popular attraction at any Dude Ranch.

The cover picture shows a group of these synthetic cowboys and cowgirls about to start off on a ride through some of the scenic wonders of the vast San Juan region in southwestern Colorado. Many, of course, are accomplished riders, and the rest make up in enthusiasm what they may lack in experience. And if the ranch rules require that one of the real cowboys always ride last to round up any strays, that's not necessarily a reflection on the horsemanship of the guests—just a sensible business precaution to avoid losing a paying customer.

For the hardier dudes, three and four-day pack trips are made into the San Juan Wilderness Area—a primitive region high in the Rockies accessible by no other means. The scenic beauties of this virgin wilderness have made many a tenderfoot forget his saddle sores and go back to his workaday world with a new Nature-inspired zest for living.
