

Mountain Wonderland

The Colorado Rockies are America's favorite vacation land. Towering peaks, azure skies, dense virgin forests of spruce and pine, lush mountain meadows interspersed with fields of fragile wildflowers—these are but a few of the many delights that tempt the most jaded travel appetite.

Our cover scene depicts a view that is typical of the beauty to be found in the highest of all the forty-eight states. For the rugged Rocky Mountains reach closer to heaven here than anywhere else on the continent. Forty-nine of Colorado's peaks push skyward more than 14,000 feet above the level of the sea, and literally hundreds of pinnacles in this mountain chain exceed 10,000 feet in elevation.

The deep, cool beauty of the Colorado sky cannot be described, for there exist no words adequate to the task. Even full-color photography fails in some degrees to picture its lucent blueness—a depth of color emphasized by flecks of fleecy clouds—modulating at sunset into a blaze of flaming red and gold.

The deep green forests which carpet the lower slopes of Colorado's mountains mask and soften their jagged contours, provide dark, cool glades where tiny forest creatures scamper undisturbed in a silence broken only by the sighing of the summer wind through evergreen needles, and the boisterous babbling of mountain brooks.

The sloping fields of the fertile highland valleys drink in the cold, clear waters from the melting snows on the mountain tops, burgeoning with vigor in response to the sky-filtered rays of the Colorado sun. Myriads of wildflowers lend a brilliant touch of color to the scene, blossoming in all the hues of the rainbow, and adding a hint of delicate perfume to the heady fragrance of the pines.

Truly a land of peace and majesty, of beauty distilled by Nature from rocks and sky and growing things, the Rockies well deserve the title of "Mountain Wonderland."
