EL TOVAR HOTEL

El Tovar, on the Canyon's rim, is one of the most famous resort hotels in America. It is a long, low structure of native boulders and pine logs, with more than 80 guest rooms.

RATES—European Plan:

Room without bath, single, \$2.50; double, \$3.50.
Room with bath, single, \$4.00 and up; double, \$5.50 and up.
Room with bath, twin beds, double, \$7.00 and up.
There are a few small rooms with bath, single, \$3.50; double, \$4.50.
Children's Rates: 3 to 7 years, inclusive, half rate; 8 years and over, full rate.
Discount: 7 days or more, 10%.

RATES—American Plan:

Room without bath, single, \$5.50; double, \$9.50.
Room with bath, single, \$7.00 and up; double, \$11.50 and up.
Room with bath, twin beds, double, \$13.00 and up.
There are a few small rooms with bath, single, \$6.50; double, \$10.50.
Children's Rates: Under 3 years, 50 cents per meal, no charge for room; 3 to 7 years, inclusive, half rate; 8 years and over, full rate.
Discount: 7 days or more, 10%.

MEALS:

Table d'hote service in Dining Room: Breakfast, \$1.00; luncheon, \$1.00; dinner, \$1.50. Also a la carte service.

BRIGHT ANGEL LODGE AND CABINS

These new facilities, on the rim of the Canyon, provide a wide range in comfortable, moderately priced living accommodations in two guest lodges and in numerous individual cabins.

RATES—European Plan:

Room without bath, single, \$2.00 and \$2.50; double, \$3.00, \$3.50 and up.
Room with bath, single, \$3.00, \$3.50 and up; double, \$4.00; \$4.50 and up.
Children's Rates: 3 to 7 years, inclusive, half rate; 8 years and over, full rate.
Discount: 7 days or more, 10%.

MEALS:

A la carte service in Coffee Room.

GRAND CANYON CABIN CAMP

An automobile camp adjoining the public camp grounds. An attractive central lodge provides soda fountain, luncheonette, newsstand and other services. Public showers. Firewood and water furnished. Free use of laundry to cabin occupants.

RATES:

Daily rates for cabins and furnishings (except bedding), regardless of number of occupants:
Cabin with one double bed (sleeping only). \$1.25
Cabin with two double beds... \$1.75 and \$2.25
Bedding, per bed, first night... .50
Each additional night... .35

PHANTOM RANCH

Picturesquely located at the bottom of the Grand Canyon, Phantom Ranch—a group of rustic cabins surrounding a central lodge—provides every modern comfort and convenience for a brief or extended stay in the depths of the chasm. There is a swimming pool. (See "Trail Trips").

RATES—American Plan:

\$6.00 per day. No reduction in rates for children.

GENERAL INFORMATION

SIDE-TRIP RAIL FARES: The side-trip rail fares, from the Santa Fe mainline station at Williams, Arizona to Grand Canyon and return, have been materially reduced, in connection with through tickets between Albuquerque or Belen, New Mexico and Barstow, California or points beyond. These fares are \$3.00 for coach and chair car passengers; \$5.00 for tourist car passengers (Berth extra); and \$7.00 for standard car passengers (Berth extra). • Grand Canyon accommodations are subject to Arizona sales tax. 1% on trips and meals and 2% on rooms.

HORSEBACK RIDING: For horseback riding, all classes of mounts and saddles are available, and there are interesting bridle paths leading in all directions. Rates: Two hours or less, \$1.50; two to four hours, \$3.00; full day, \$5.00.

GUIDE SERVICE: Special guides for private groups are available at \$5.00 per day or \$3.00 per half day.

CHARTERED CARS: Six-passenger touring cars may be chartered for private use (on special trips not covered by regular schedules) at 30 cents per car mile while loaded and 20 cents per car mile while deadheading. On any trip involving a layover, the charge is \$20.00 per day for car and driver.

INDIAN DANCES: Late each afternoon the Hopi Indians perform their picturesque ceremonial dances in front of the Hopi House. No admission charge.

EVENING ENTERTAINMENT: Each evening at Bright Angel Lodge, a talk, illustrated with moving pictures and slides, is given on Grand Canyon National Park and the surrounding country. No admission is charged. Following the talk an interesting musical program is provided by a cowboy orchestra.

KOLB BROTHERS' TRAVELOGUE: In their studio at the head of Bright Angel Trail, the Kolb Brothers give each day an interesting lecture, illus-

trated with motion pictures and slides, describing their boat trips down the Colorado River. Moderate admission charge.

MOVING PICTURE SHOW: On two evenings each week, moving pictures are shown in the Community House. Programs comprise recent releases of feature films, selected short subjects, news reels, etc. Moderate admission charge.

NATIONAL PARK SERVICE ADMINISTRATION BUILDING: In addition to providing a complete information service for Park visitors, the Administration Building, near El Tovar Hotel, maintains an interesting collection of Grand Canyon exhibits and an extensive library on the Indian Southwest.

YAVAPAI POINT OBSERVATION STATION AND MUSEUM: Located one and one-half miles east of El Tovar Hotel, the National Park Service maintains an observation station and trail-side museum. Here may be found a model of the Grand Canyon and samples of the various formations which go to make up the Canyon walls. A battery of high-power telescopes is also available. No admission charge.

LARGE GROUPS AND SPECIAL PARTIES: Grand Canyon affords ample facilities for the entertainment of conventions, special train parties, etc.

PUBLIC UTILITIES: Telegraph, telephone and postal facilities are available in or near the hotels.

MEDICAL SERVICE: Grand Canyon has a well equipped hospital. A physician and trained nurse are always available.

CARE OF CHILDREN: Provision has been made at El Tovar Hotel for the care of children, at reasonable cost.

MOTOR TRIPS—TRAIL TRIPS

Most popular of all Grand Canyon trips is this complete one-day motor tour of the South Rim. The distance for the round trip is about seventy miles.

The Grand Canyon Rim Drive

Morning Drive: Harveycars leave El Tovar Hotel and Bright Angel Lodge, traveling westward over Hermit Rim Road along the brink of the chasm. Stops are made at Powell, Hopi, Mohave and Pima Points—each affording its own superb view—and, finally at Hermit's Rest. The latter, a striking cliff-house built of Canyon boulders—with its rustic lounge, great fireplace and observation porch—is an attraction in itself.

Afternoon Drive: After luncheon the route is eastward over the newly paved Desert View Road through the Kaibab National Forest and along the Canyon's Rim. Stops are made at Yavapai Observation Station and at Yaki, Moran and Lipan Points. The end of the drive eastward brings the traveler to The Watchtower at Desert View, a re-creation of the ancient towers erected by the prehistoric inhabitants of the Southwest. Built on a high, rocky point overlooking the Painted Desert, The Watchtower commands one of the most magnificent of Grand Canyon views as well as a sweeping panorama of the Kaibab Forest and the Navajo Indian Country.

RATES: \$7.00 per person, including light refreshments at Hermit's Rest and The Watchtower. (Rates for the morning and afternoon sections of the drive, if taken separately, are \$3.00 and \$6.00 respectively.) Children, 6 to 11, inclusive, half rate.

Painted Desert-Indian Country Tour

Leaving El Tovar Hotel and Bright Angel Lodge after breakfast, Harveycars travel eastward over the Desert View Road through the Kaibab National Forest and along the Rim of the Canyon. After a stop at Desert View to visit The Watchtower, the drive continues over the Navahopi Road, crossing Cameron Bridge over the Little Colorado River, and thence to the Indian village of Moencopi; then on to Tuba City, where the Government maintains an agency and school for the Navajo and Hopi Indians. Following luncheon at Tuba City, the return journey is over the same route, with stops along the Painted Desert and at interesting points on the Canyon's Rim. Total distance is about 160 miles.

RATES: \$12.00 per person, including luncheon en route. Children, 6 to 11, inclusive, half rate.

TRAIL TRIPS

To many visitors, the "high spot" of a Grand Canyon Outing is the "adventure on muleback" down one of the famous inner-canyon trails.

One-Day Bright Angel Trail Trip

Each morning trail parties on muleback, in charge of Fred Harvey guides, leave El Tovar Hotel and Bright Angel Lodge. A few minutes' ride to the head of Bright Angel Trail . . . and the great "adventure" is begun! About half way down, a brief stop is made at Indian Gardens, after which the trail stretches out upon the Tonto Plateau and presently heads downward into the Granite Gorge leading to the rocky banks of the Colorado River, where a stop is made for rest and luncheon. The return journey is made in easy stages, reaching the hotels on the Rim late in the afternoon.

RATES: \$6.00 per person, including luncheon and services of guide. Children, regardless of age, are charged full fare.

Two-Day Phantom Ranch Trip

Nestling among the towering crags of Bright Angel Canyon—nearly a vertical mile below the South Rim—is Phantom Ranch, one of the most unique resorts in the world. With its rustic cabins, central dining and recreation halls and its crystal-clear swimming pool, Phantom Ranch affords every comfort for an overnight stay in the depths of the Canyon.

First Day: After luncheon, Harveycars leave the hotel for the head of Kaibab Trail, where the descent by muleback begins. Down, down, down . . . to the Colorado River and across the Suspension Bridge, then on to Phantom Ranch for dinner and overnight stop.

Second Day: The return journey is made over Kaibab Trail or Bright Angel Trail arriving on the South Rim in the late afternoon.

RATES: \$18.00 per person, including transportation, services of guides, three meals and overnight accommodations at Phantom Ranch. Children, regardless of age, charged full fare.

ONE-DAY TOUR

The Grand Canyon Rim Drive . . .

Tour 1-A . . . Rate \$10.00 per person . . . Children, 6 to 11, inclusive, \$5.00.

Includes: Motor transportation, with driver-guide; three meals at El Tovar Hotel.

Program: Breakfast at El Tovar Hotel. Motor drive westward along the famous Rim Road to

Hermit's Rest, with leisurely stops at important scenic points en route. Luncheon at El Tovar Hotel. Motor trip eastward over the Desert View Road, through the Kaibab National Forest and along the Canyon's brink, with stops at Yavapai Point Observation Station, at the principal Rim Points and at The Watchtower.

TWO-DAY TOURS

Hermit's Rest—Desert View . . .

Tour 2-A . . . Rate \$15.00 per person . . . Children, 6 to 11, inclusive, \$9.00.

Includes: Motor transportation, room with bath (one night) and six meals at El Tovar Hotel.

First Day: Morning free for rest and recreation. After luncheon, motor eastward over the Desert View Road, through the Kaibab National Forest and along the Canyon's brink, with stops at the principal Rim points. Extended stop for visiting The Watchtower and viewing the Canyon and Painted Desert from its top.

Second Day: In the morning, motor westward along the famous Rim Road to Hermit's Rest, with leisurely stops at important scenic points en route. The afternoon is left free for rest or for recreational activities such as walks along the wooded Rim footpaths, horseback rides through the pine forest, visits to the museums, etc.

Grand Canyon Rim Drive—Bright Angel Trail . . .

Tour 2-B . . . Rate \$20.00 per person . . . Children, 6 to 11, inclusive, \$13.00.

Includes: Motor and saddle-mule transportation, with guide service; box lunch on trail trip; room with bath (one night) and five meals at El Tovar Hotel.

First Day: Morning motor drive westward along the famous Rim Road to Hermit's Rest, with leisurely stops at important scenic points. Afternoon motor trip eastward over the Desert View Road, through the Kaibab National Forest and along the Canyon's brink, with stops at the principal Rim points.

Second Day: Trip on muleback down Bright Angel Trail, luncheon at the Colorado River, returning to the hotels late in the afternoon.

Hermit's Rest—Phantom Ranch . . .

Tour 2-C . . . Rate \$22.50 per person . . . Children, 6 to 11, inclusive, \$16.00.

Includes: Motor and saddle-mule transportation, with guide service; lodging (one night) and two meals at Phantom Ranch; four meals at El Tovar Hotel.*

First Day: Morning motor drive along the famous Rim Road to Hermit's Rest, with leisurely stops at important scenic points en route. Afternoon saddle-mule trip down Kaibab Trail to the Colorado River, and on to Phantom Ranch for dinner and overnight stop.

Second Day: After breakfast, return journey over Kaibab Trail or Bright Angel Trail, with lunch en route or upon arrival at El Tovar Hotel. The afternoon is left free for rest or for recreational activities.

THREE-DAY TOURS

Hermit's Rest—Bright Angel Trail—Indian Country . . .

Tour 3-A . . . Rate \$35.00 per person . . . Children, 6 to 11, inclusive, \$21.00.

Includes: Motor and saddle-mule transportation, with guide service; two meals en route; room with bath (two nights) and seven meals at El Tovar Hotel.

First Day: Morning motor drive westward along the Rim Road to Hermit's Rest, with leisurely stops at principal scenic points. Afternoon is left free for rest or for recreational activities.

Second Day: Saddle-mule trip down Bright Angel Trail to the Colorado River, and return.

Third Day: Motor drive, via Desert View and Navahopi Roads, to Moencopi and Tuba City.

Hermit's Rest—Indian Country . . .

Tour 2-D . . . Rate \$22.50 per person . . . Children, 6 to 11, inclusive, \$11.00.

Includes: Motor transportation, with driver-guide; luncheon on motor trip; room with bath (one night) and five meals at El Tovar Hotel.

First Day: In the morning motor drive westward along the famous Rim Road to Hermit's Rest, with leisurely stops at important scenic points. Afternoon left free for rest or recreation.

Second Day: Motor trip eastward over the Desert View Road to The Watchtower, thence over the Navahopi Road, through the Indian Country, to the Hopi village of Moencopi. After a stop at Tuba City, the return journey is over the same picturesque route, with leisurely stops along the Painted Desert.

Hermit's Rest—Phantom Ranch—Indian Country . . .

Tour 3-B . . . Rate \$40.00 per person . . . Children, 6 to 11, inclusive, \$25.00.

Includes: Motor and saddle-mule transportation, with guide service; luncheon on motor trip; lodging (one night) and two meals at Phantom Ranch; room with bath (one night) and six meals at El Tovar Hotel.*

First Day: Morning motor drive westward to Hermit's Rest, with stops at principal points of interest along the Rim Road. Afternoon saddle-mule trip down Kaibab Trail to Phantom Ranch for dinner and overnight.

Second Day: After breakfast at Phantom Ranch, return journey to Rim, reaching El Tovar Hotel in time for luncheon. Afternoon free, rest or recreation.

Third Day: Motor trip over Desert View and Navahopi Roads to Moencopi and Tuba City.

*If return trip from Phantom Ranch is made via Bright Angel Trail, box luncheon will be provided in lieu of luncheon at El Tovar Hotel.
