Ar. San Bernardino early evening.

Population 63,000. Located in the center of the orange district, it is the gate-way to several of California's finest winter resorts: Riverside, Mission Inn, Redlands, Palm Springs, Arrowhead Springs. The first non-sectarian Easter Sunrise Service of America was held at nearby Mt. Rubidoux. We continue on over the mountains through the Cajon Pass.

Ar. Barstow late evening.

This is the junction point where Santa Fe Lines divide, one line running to Los Angeles and Southern California points, the other to San Francisco and Northern California points. Turn your watch ahead an hour. We cross the desert during the night, arriving in Arizona in the morning.

Ar. Ashfork - This is the Santa Fe junction point for Phoenix, Arizona.

Ar. Williams - This is the Santa Fe junction point for Grand Canyon, Arizona.

September 24 Ar. Grand Canyon after Lunch.

Take a coat along and leave your other personal baggage in the sleeper. It will be safe there. The Grand Canyon is something every American should see. Here is evidence of God's handiwork throughout the ages. Enjoy the marvel of it all. Dinner at the El Tovar.

September 25

Morning finds us in Albuquerque,
New Mexico, population 62,000, and an important
Santa Fe terminal. Albuquerque is just about
half way between Los Angeles and Chicago. Santa
Fe trains are serviced here. Today should be an
interesting one, as we travel up and over the
New Mexico Rockies. Raton Pass is the highest
rail point on Santa Fe Lines, altitude 7,622 feet.

Ar. La Junta, Colorado (Pronounced La Hoon Tah)

Important Santa Fe division and terminal point. Line from Denver, Colorado Springs, and Pueblo connects here with transcontinental mainline. Turn your watch ahead an hour,

September 26 Ar. Kansas City in the morning.

Population 608,000. One of the largest railroad stations in the country, serving 12 railroads. Continuing on through Missouri, we cross the Mississippi River at Fort Madison and proceed on to Chicago.
