

INTRODUCTION

To aid all who are seeking suitable stopping places during their summer vacations, this booklet is issued by the Southern Pacific Company, and contains in condensed form descriptions of various California resorts and some in Southern Oregon.

Nearly all of them are within from an hour's to a night's ride from San Francisco or Los Angeles. A few of the places are within from twenty-four to thirty-six hours' journey.

The particulars given include the name and location of the resort (hotel, cottages, or camp with tent-houses); how reached from stations, auto or stage fare; name of manager; the accommodations provided; rates for rooms and meals; facilities for sports and amusements—fishing, hunting, golf, etc., and points of interest in vicinity.

The information, so far as it relates to names and hotel prices, was obtained to as late a date as possible, but of course cannot in every case be guaranteed.

For ready reference the several resorts in the different regions have been grouped under the following captions:

Outing Resorts

ALAMEDA BEACHES—SAN FRANCISCO BAY

The sunny beaches of Alameda, along the eastern shores of San Francisco Bay, are frequented by many thousands of people and offer a playground with which all visitors to the bay region should become familiar. Reached from San Francisco by Southern Pacific ferry steamers to Alameda Pier, there connecting with electric trains. Fare 15 cents each way.

NEPTUNE BEACH-On Central Avenue, Alameda, entrance at Southern Pacific Webster Street Station. A quarter-mile beach for surf bathing, with large floats close to shore. Life guards in attendance. A three-story bath house, over 400 feet long, contains 2000 rooms and 5000 lockers. Concrete swimming tank, 300x75 feet, in white mosaic tiling, contains one million gallons of fil-tered and heated bay water. Diving stand 30 feet high with two platforms and four spring-boards. Bleachers with 3500 seats, and gallery with 1500 seats, afford views of attractions staged in tank, also on platform 40 feet square. Regular band concerts from shell band stand in center of bathing beach. A concrete esplanade 600 feet long. A double concrete slide 30 feet long, and a perfectly equipped playground for children. Cafeteria seating 700; also refreshment counters. Amusement concessions and dance hall accommodating 600 couples. Daily picture shows; capacity 750. Admission 10 cents. Bathing suit, room and towel 35 cents.

SCHMIDT'S COTTAGE BATHS—On Central Avenue, Alameda, one block east of Southern Pacific Fifth Street Station and one block west of Webster Street Station. Tide-washed beach for surf bathing. 1000 rooms for bathers. Concrete swimming tank 125x75 feet. Refreshment stand and tables for picnic parties. Special attractions Sundays and Holidays. Admission 10 cents. Bathing suit and towel 25 cents. Tub baths 25 cents.
