MISSION SANTA CLARA

Named for Saint Clare of Assisi (1194-1253), co-foundress of the Order of Poor Ladies, or Clares, and first Abbess of San Damiano. It is situated in the grounds of the University of Santa Clara, a short distance from San Jose, about 50 miles south of San Francisco.

This is the eighth of the Franciscan missions, having been founded by Father Tomas de la Pena on January 12, 1777. The mission was originally near Alviso, three miles from the present site. In 1779, the waters of the bay rose twice, destroying what progress the padres had made in building and planting, so in the following year they moved to a spot about 150 yards from the present Southern Pacific station. Fra Junipero Serra dedicated this new church on May 15, 1784. In 1818 the mission was moved to its present site, the buildings being completed in 1822.

After the American occupation of California the Jesuits took over Mission Santa Clara and around it built the university.

What remained of the original church was completely destroyed by fire on October 25,1926. The present church is a modern replica of the original.
