

WIZARD ISLAND, CRATER LAKE, OREGON

Crater Lake lies in the heart of the Cascade Range in Southern Oregon, its surface 6,177 feet above sea level. As its name suggests, it is the crater of an extinct volcano. Crater Lake has been sounded to a depth of 1.996 feet and declared by scientists to be the deepest inland body of water in the world. Rising almost sheer from the water's edge the rim of the lava cliffs attain at places a height of two thousand feet. From Crater Lake Lodge, on the rim of the Lake, the opposite shore is six miles away. Wizard Island is a perfectly preserved cinder cone rising nearly one thousand feet above the Lake. You may climb the slaggy timbered cone of Wizard Island and descend one hundred feet into its crater which is five hundred feet across.
