



One would need to travel far to find a public playground so unusual in beauty and interest as famous Golden Gate Park in San Francisco. It is by far the largest in the city and was laid out and developed entirely by the untiring efforts of many, on the one-time barren sands of the peninsula. This unique park is about four miles long and one-half mile wide; is rich in plant and tree life and horticultural developments, as indicated by the flaming bed of rhododendrons in the accompanying illustration.

There are many miles of driveways and bridlepaths, an aquarium, the Natural History museum and the Simson African Hall, an art museum, open-air pavilion, arboretum, many lovely lakes, an athletic field with stadium, tennis courts, bowling greens, and facilities for every imaginable sport from cricket to miniature yachting. You can drive, ride or bicycle through the park, but the best way to see it, if time permits, is on a leisurely walking tour.
