### The Columbia River Region

ALONG the great Columbia River for 337 miles runs one of the most magnificent scenic highways in America. For more than 200 miles the Union Pacific parallels both the highway and the mighty stream, and during the summer it operates open-top observation cars between The Dalles and Portland. Union Pacific passengers obtain wonderful views of the rugged gorge of the Columbia and its splendid waterfalls. Among the latter are Latourell, Mist, Bridal Veil, Wahkeena and Horsetail. Most celebrated of all, however, is enchanting Multnomah (named after an Indian tribe), leaping daintily more than 600 feet into a mossy rock basin and taking rank among the highest and loveliest waterfalls in the country.

Other features of the Columbia River Route to the Pacific Northwest are Crown Point, Shepperds Dell, St. Peters Dome, the Cascades, the Bridge of the Gods, Oneonta Gorge, the Mitchell Point Tunnel and Beacon Rock. The historic old Oregon Trail followed the Columbia River as it cut its majestic course through the forested heights of the Cascade Mountains, past such lofty peaks as Mt. Hood, Mt. St. Helens, Mt. Jefferson, and Mt. Adams. The walls of the great gorge are always overspread with the rich verdure of flowering plants and evergreen trees. From Portland, "the Rose City," near the western end of the Columbia River Highway, fine motor roads extend to many attractive beach and mountain resorts, and the Union Pacific continues northward to the great Puget Sound cities, Tacoma and Seattle.
