



Sun Valley, Idaho, was built in 1936 by the Union Pacific Railroad as a ski resort, and opened that year on Christmas day. When the snows of the first winter receded, the founders discovered that they had an unexpected bonus in a summer climate unequaled except in the Alps. Idaho is the third sunniest state in the nation and its sparkling sunshine for outdoor sports is "air-conditioned" by the snow-capped peaks of the Sawtooth mountains.

Nice thing about a Sun Valley summer, you don't have to be a hardy athlete to enjoy its many charms. There's a wide variety of fun for all—from outdoor ice skating, horseback riding, golf on a new 18-hole course, tennis, fishing, skeet and trap shooting, and swimming for the more active . . . to ski lift riding or just plain relaxation of sun-tanning and loafing, if you are seeking leisure. The children will find great delight in the well-equipped playground supervised by trained attendants. Supervisors will arrange for the children's luncheons, affording parents more leisure. Baby-sitters are available when desired.

Evenings are gay and informal, with music and dancing, or current motion pictures in the "Opera House."

The summer season is from May 1 to Labor Day, with fall closing around October 15. The gay winter sports season opens around December 20 and extends to early April. Popular times for conventions or sales groups are the months of May, June, and September through October 15. Small sales groups interested in skiing may be accommodated in January and March.
