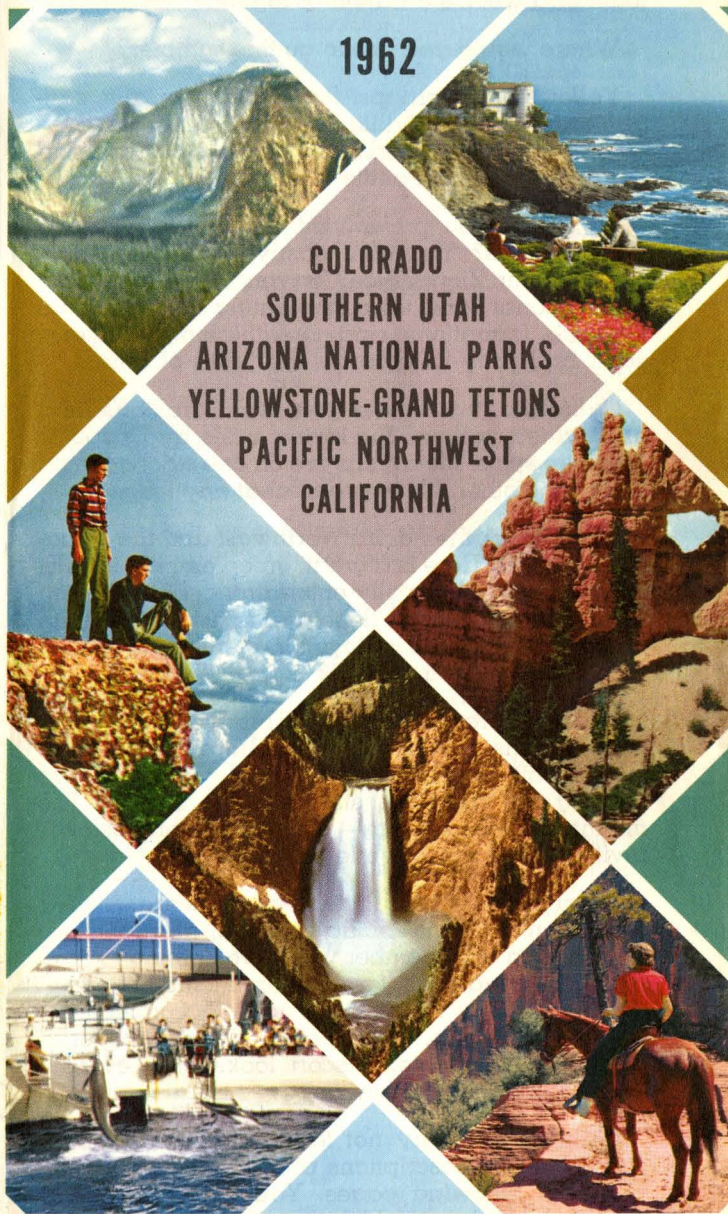

SATURDAY DEPARTURES FROM CHICAGO

In the "YT" tour we offer an economy type vacation which gives one not only a complete circle tour of Yellowstone, but also Grand Teton National Park, bordering Yellowstone six miles to the south, and through the storied Jackson Hole Country, fabled crossroads and rendezvous of early day fur expeditions.

In the Grand Tetons you'll see some of the most magnificent mountain scenery to be found anywhere. Often likened to the Alps of Switzerland, the Teton Range is said to "look more like you would expect mountains to look than any other range in America."

In your four days of sightseeing through the Parks, you'll see the spectacular wonders of Yellowstone. Here Nature outdoes herself and with a lavish hand places before her guests the choicest of her many wonders — geysers that hiss and steam; towering waterfalls; canyons of striking hue and color; hot springs, mud volcanoes; paint pots that bubble and gurgles; and, within the boundaries of the park, an amazing variety of wild life.

Add to Nature's great "Show of Shows" a day of sightseeing in beautiful Salt Lake City and another in and about Denver and you have about as interesting a vacation as one could imagine . . . and it requires only nine days away from home!

All arrangements are made in advance — it's an all-expense, escorted tour; you're relieved of all travel details and free to enjoy a really carefree vacation.

DAY-BY-DAY STORY

Saturday — First Day. Leaving Chicago during the afternoon your first hours will be spent in meeting your congenial companions and you'll watch the passing panorama—the interesting "prairie lands" of Illinois and Iowa's fields of waving corn. Dinner is served in the dining car.

Sunday — Second Day. During the night your train rolls smoothly through Nebraska and early morning finds you in Colorado. Breakfast on the train before arrival at Denver at 7:40 AM. You'll board motor buses soon after arrival for a day of scenic treats, which will include the Civic Center, the city parks, Park of Red Rocks, Denver's Mountain Parks and the historic old mining towns of Blackhawk and Central City. A stop is made in Central City to visit the Opera House and the famous Teller House, where luncheon will be served. There will be time to browse around a bit. Returning to Denver late afternoon, you board your train for an overnight trip to Salt Lake City. Dinner in the Union Station Restaurant.

Monday — Third Day. Breakfast on the train before arrival at Salt Lake City—reached at 9:20 AM. Motor buses will meet you immediately on arrival to begin an interesting day of sightseeing which will include a trip to all of the historic and romantic points of interest in Salt Lake Valley. A spectacularly scenic trip along the highway to Brighton, paralleling a rushing stream, walled in by towering mountain cliffs to the head of Big Cottonwood Canyon, one of the most rugged gorges in the West. Time is taken for a ride on the Mt. Millicent ski lift, 4,000 feet long, taking you over magnificent scenery.

Luncheon at the Mt. Majestic Manor Mountain Chalet. Afternoon, cross Salt Lake Valley to the world-famous Utah Copper Mine in Bingham Canyon arriving in time for the spectacular blasting operation, terminating at the Hotel Newhouse for dinner.

Leave at 7:30 PM for your overnight trip to Ashton, Idaho, where you begin four days of sightseeing through the Parks.

Tuesday — Fourth Day. You detrain at Ashton at 5:45 AM and have breakfast (tip included) at the Stage Coach Inn.

MOTOR TOUR OF YELLOWSTONE AND GRAND TETON NATIONAL PARKS

Immediately after breakfast you begin your trip to one of the strangest and most fascinating regions in the world.

You feast your eyes on more of Yellowstone's eerie formations—Roaring Mountain—Obsidian Cliff (Jim Bridger's Mountain of Glass) Apollinaris Spring, before you arrive at Mammoth Hot Springs where luncheon awaits you. There is time to view the Terraces, their various tints and hues aglow from the rays of an overhead sun.

After lunch you board the buses for another interesting trip past The Needles with its slender rock formations, stop at Tower Fall to view the many peaks and pinnacles—then on to the top of Mt. Washburn and through spectacular Dunraven Pass to the new Canyon Village. After dinner the evening is open to be spent as you will.

Wednesday — Fifth Day. Leaving Canyon Village at 8:30 AM your trip takes you past Yellowstone Lake and West Thumb en route to Old Faithful Inn. Afternoon is open.

Thursday — Sixth Day. Breakfast at the Inn, then you will have all morning to explore the weird formations that completely surround you.

After luncheon leave Old Faithful Inn, destination Jackson Lake Lodge. Your trip takes you via Craig Pass, Thumb and Lewis Canyon to the Grand Teton National Park.

Rooms with bath are provided in guest-cottages, a short walk from the lodge. The remainder of this afternoon is free to boat, hike, fish, ride horseback—or just relax and enjoy the magnificent scenery.

Friday — Seventh Day. At 9:00 AM you will be taken on an all-day sightseeing trip brim-full of breathtaking beauty. Ox Bow Bend, Glacier Lookout, Chapel of the Transfiguration; boat trip on Jackson Lake to the very foot of the Tetons and a delightful lunch on Elk Island. Truly a day of never-to-be-forgotten thrills in this cameraman's paradise!

You came—you saw—but the spectacular mountains have conquered you with their beauty. It has long been said, "The Tetons look more like you would expect mountains to really look than any other range in America."

Leaving Jackson Lake Lodge in late afternoon you'll travel through the Jackson Hole country crossing the spectacular Teton Pass before reaching Victor, Idaho, at 6:45 PM. Dinner at the Timberline Cafe, then board your train, homeward bound.

Saturday — Eighth Day. On arrival at Ogden, Utah, about 6:35 AM, you will detrain and transfer to the Ben Lomond Hotel for breakfast, tip included, returning to the station to board your coach Domeliner to Chicago.

Again it is a pleasure to watch the ever-changing landscape from your train window. But now your tour companions are your friends and together you re-live much of what you have seen and you enjoy a sense of camaraderie that only comes from such a happy association.

Sunday — Ninth Day. A leisurely breakfast in the dining car, and soon your train will roll quietly into Chicago, then happy adieus . . . and memories of a delightful, funful, care-free vacation!

SUNDAY DEPARTURES FROM CHICAGO

A trip through the Southern Utah-Arizona National Parks is in itself a complete vacation. So, too, is a visit to Yellowstone and Grand Teton National Parks. But to select two such fascinating regions, combining them into one 14-day, all-expense tour, this is indeed vacation news of the highest order — a vacation trip you can look back upon as one of the most eventful chapters in your life.

You see FIVE National Parks — Zion, Grand Canyon, Bryce, Grand Teton and Yellowstone, as well as Cedar Breaks National Monument, motor through several National Forests and go sightseeing in one of America's most noted cities — Salt Lake City, Utah. And — you do it all comfortably and leisurely in only two weeks' time.

First — a trip to Grand Teton and Yellowstone National Parks — four days of sightseeing with overnight stops at Jackson Lake Lodge, New Canyon Village and Old Faithful Inn. Then you spend five days and five nights in the Utah-Arizona Wonderlands, where Nature's sculptured masterpieces await your rapt contemplation.

What wonders they are to behold! Zion National Park, a symphony in form and color; Arizona's Grand Canyon, a world wonder in its own right; Bryce Canyon, masterpiece of erosion and color; the painted cliffs of Cedar Breaks National Monument and the drive through beautiful Kaibab Forest, over Mt. Carmel Highway and through Red Canyon.

And finally, sightseeing and overnight in Salt Lake City before you begin your return trip home.

DAY-BY-DAY STORY

Sunday — First Day. Late this afternoon you will embark upon two weeks of vacation adventure you will long remember. You'll have dinner aboard the Domeliner "City of Los Angeles" and get acquainted with your congenial traveling companions.

Monday — Second Day. Early morning finds you in western Nebraska. Soon you'll be in Wyoming following the route of the pioneers, paralleling the old Overland and Oregon Trails. After dinner in the dining car, you'll reach Ogden at 6:40 PM, and soon you are on your way once again for the overnight trip to Victor, Idaho.

Tuesday — Third Day. You detrain at Victor at 7:30 AM and have breakfast (tip included) at the Timberline Cafe.

The Grand Teton area is a region of mountainous grandeur and breathtaking views of the majestic Teton peaks are seen as you motor to your headquarters — Jackson Lake Lodge — where spacious, tastefully furnished rooms with bath are provided in guest cottages. Afternoon and evening are open.

Wednesday — Fourth Day. At 9:00 AM you will be taken on an all-day sightseeing trip brim-full of breathtaking beauty. Ox Bow Bend, Glacier Lookout, Chapel of the Transfiguration; Boat trip on Jackson Lake to the very foot of the Teton peaks and a delightful lunch on Elk Island. Truly a day of never-to-be-forgotten thrills in this cameraman's paradise!

As you begin your trip north into Yellowstone National Park, you'll motor along the shores of Jackson and Yellowstone Lakes for many miles passing West Thumb and many points of interest before reaching your headquarters — the Canyon Village in time for dinner. Evening is open.

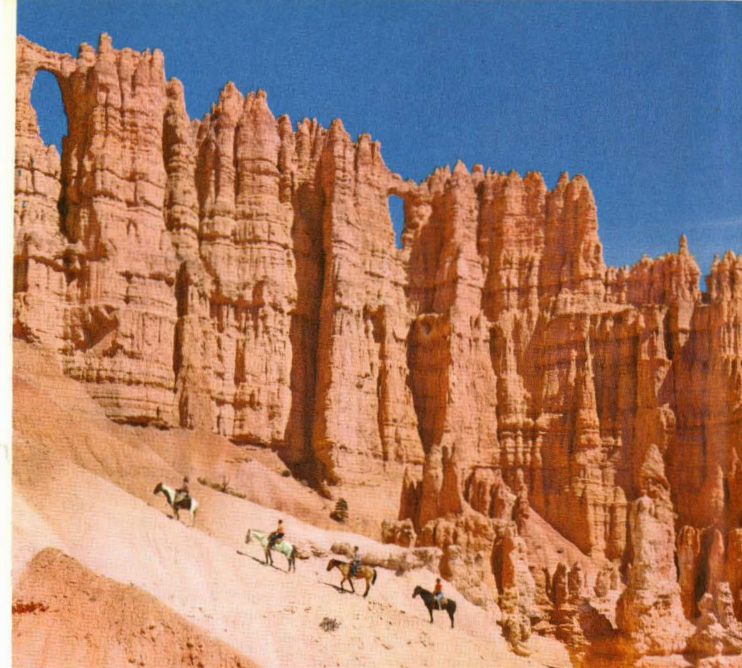
Thursday — Fifth Day. Departure from Canyon Village is scheduled at 8:00 AM to bring you to Mammoth Hot Springs in time for luncheon in the Mammoth Terrace Dining Room. The route is by way of the Grand Canyon and the great Lower Falls of the Yellowstone River — then by way of Dunraven Pass, Mt. Washburn, with a stop at Tower Fall — one of the outstanding scenic features of the Park.

There will be time to view the many vari-tinted terraces and to visit the Park Museum before departing for Old Faithful Inn, reached late afternoon. Traveling via Apollinaris Spring, Obsidian Cliff and Norris and Gibbon Geyser Basins, stops are made en route at the principal attractions.

There is dancing and other entertaining at Old Faithful. This evening, like all evenings in Yellowstone, is beyond compare — the combination of star-studded skies, campfires, soft re-echoing strains of music, create an enchanted setting, and it's wonderful.

Friday — Sixth Day. Old Faithful Geyser is but a few steps from the Inn, and you'll enjoy watching its almost hourly eruptions or take one of the hikes of the geyser basin conducted by a Park Ranger-Naturalist.

About 3:30 PM you will leave Old Faithful for Ashton, Idaho, where you will board the train for an overnight trip to Ogden, Utah. Dinner at Stage Coach Inn.

Saturday — Seventh Day. After breakfast at the Hotel and lunch in the dining car you arrive at Lund, Utah, at 2:45 PM, starting five days of adventure in the wonderlands of Southern Utah and Northern Arizona. First stop is Zion National Park where you spend the night snugly in a cabin in the canyon.

Sunday — Eighth Day. This morning a motor trip is made up the sublime aisle of Zion Canyon to the Temple of Sinawava to view the Great White Throne, Great Organ, Angels Landing and other monuments whose names carry out the sublimity of this lovely area.

After lunch you leave for Grand Canyon National Park — over the Mt. Carmel Highway, across the Prismatic Plains and through the Kaibab Forest. Vast and awe-inspiring, the Grand Canyon is a masterpiece of nature's handiwork. You'll enjoy relaxing and watching its changing colors. Two nights are spent here.

Monday — Ninth Day. No planned activities before luncheon. This afternoon, a motor trip to Cape Royal and to Point Imperial, highest point in Grand Canyon National Park, for inspiring views. Evening entertainment in the Lodge.

Tuesday — Tenth Day. After breakfast you leave, a little reluctantly perhaps, but you're on your way to another great scene — not so vast, but more intense and fantastic — Bryce Canyon National Park. The myriad marvels of Nature's handiwork will stretch your imagination almost to the breaking point.

Wednesday — Eleventh Day. After luncheon a motor trip takes you to Rainbow Point with a stop at Inspiration Point and other vantage spots. In the evening, a talk by the Park-Naturalist, a dance, or a walk out under the starlit heavens.

Thursday — Twelfth Day. After breakfast you say goodbye to Bryce — but there still is one surprise left before you leave this land of flaming color. Cedar Breaks National Monument, a vast escarpment and a vision of kaleidoscopic color, rises before your eyes.

Regretfully you leave this beautiful country as you once again board your train at Lund, Salt Lake City bound! Sightseeing tour taken on arrival. Overnight at Hotel Newhouse.

Friday — Thirteenth Day. After breakfast at the hotel you take leave of this beautiful city. The balance of this day is yours to enjoy watching the ever-changing landscape from your train window.

Saturday — Fourteenth Day. Regretfully you take leave of the many friends you have made on your vacation tour. But happy memories will stay with you always. Arrival in Chicago at 12:20 PM — the end of a perfect trip.

Envision them if you can — the huge monoliths of Zion National Park; the fairyland of stone and color named Bryce Canyon National Park; the painted cliffs of Cedar Breaks National Monument — all in Utah — together with the grandeur and vastness of Grand Canyon National Park in Arizona. Nowhere else on the North American continent is to be seen such an amazing concentration of scenic grandeur and geological wonders.

Add to these such along-the-way attractions as Mt. Carmel Highway, Kaibab and Dixie National Forests, plus sightseeing trips in Salt Lake City and in Denver, and you have a vacation trip you will never forget.

And note that the "Z" Tour schedule includes leisure time at Zion, Grand Canyon and Bryce Canyon in order that you may fully enjoy these monuments to Nature's handiwork.

DAY-BY-DAY STORY

Sunday — First Day. An eventful vacation begins when you leave Chicago — at 6:00 PM on the Domeliner "City of Los Angeles." Dinner is served upon departure.

You arrive at Zion Lodge at 6:30 PM in time for dinner. Entertainment, nature talks, movies, dancing, plenty of activity for the evening hours.

Accommodations in the Utah Parks are in comfortable rustic cabins with private shower bath. Deluxe cabins, if available, may be arranged through your escort at a small added cost.

Wednesday — Fourth Day. This morning you may wish to explore some of the miles of trails — ride or hike — the East Rim, the West Rim. After luncheon a trip by motor to the Temple of Sinawava and a hike with the Ranger-Naturalist to the Narrows. You will be overwhelmed at the beauty and magnitude of this inspiring region. Later another fulfilled evening and a refreshing night's rest.

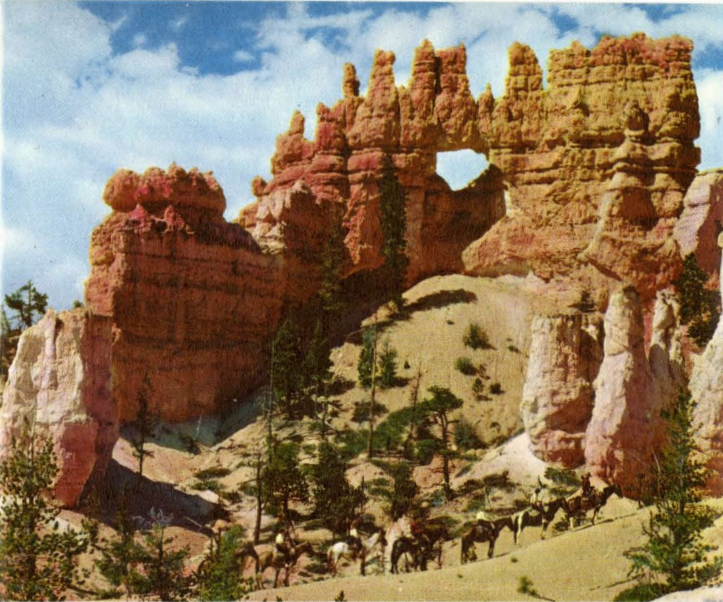
Thursday — Fifth Day. Morning is open for more exploration, discovery and adventure and at 1:00 PM you leave Zion for the Wonder of Wonders — the Grand Canyon. On the way you pass through the famous Mt. Carmel Tunnel along the Mt. Carmel Highway, with six huge tunnel portals through which you see masterpieces of scenic beauty.

You motor through the cool quiet of the Kaibab Forest with its abundance of deer and its shy white-tailed squirrels but your ride ends abruptly and most sensationally at the very brink of Grand Canyon as your bus reaches Grand Canyon Lodge.

This evening there will be informal entertainment, music and dancing and, perhaps, a moonlight stroll on the rim.

Friday—Sixth Day. The morning is free for hiking, horseback riding or to just relax. After luncheon a four-hour motor trip takes you to Point Imperial and Cape Royal for magnificent views of the canyon. Point Imperial is the highest point on the canyon rim.

Saturday—Seventh Day. Leaving at 8:30 AM you travel back over the winding road, deep into the Kaibab . . . out across the plains . . . through sparkling canyons . . . past Vermillion Cliffs . . . through Red Canyon . . . then, Bryce Canyon the beautiful—like a glimpse of another world—reached at 1:30 PM.

Sunset enlivens the myriad tints of Bryce Canyon's fragile formations and presents the towering temple peaks, the colorful sculptured depths at their best. Entertainment and dancing enliven the evenings at the Lodge.

Sunday—Eighth Day. After a solid night's rest in this cool mountain atmosphere, you are up early to view Bryce under the first rays of the rising sun. Under such light the canyon presents an entirely new and different aspect. This morning is reserved for Church services—then practically all day to enjoy this fairyland of form and color . . . from the rim . . . hiking down the trails with Ranger-Naturalist guided party for an absorbing explanation of the geology of the country . . . or perhaps as a member of a gay horseback party following your colorful cowboy guide. At 3:00 PM a motor trip to Rainbow Point, with stops at Inspiration Point, Bryce Point, Little Bryce and Natural Bridge.

Monday—Ninth Day. All day at Bryce—and there are side trips and trail trips into the Canyon without limit.

And what a strange place it is that greets your eyes. Seemingly a city from the mystic past stretches before you. Its spired temples and oddly shaped dwellings are aflame with color, and so delicately and skillfully carved are its many formations that you wonder if, in the long ago when the world was young, it was not the handiwork of the gods. The beauty of Bryce will remain with you forever.

Tuesday—Tenth Day. Have your bags packed early for you'll want to take one last, lingering look before you leave this colorful Canyon shortly after breakfast.

On the way to Lund a stop is made at Cedar Breaks National Monument, another of the colorful Southern Utah attractions. An artist has counted more than sixty tints in Cedar Breaks, whose vast amphitheatres are eroded to a depth of 2,000 feet in an area of 60 square miles. Standing on the rim

of this scintillating show-place, you are impressed with the power of Nature's mighty processes.

Once again you are on the way and soon you'll be able to look off to the south and get a distant view of the Temples of Zion which you left a few days ago.

A leisurely return to Lund, where you entrain for the first lap of your journey back home. Relax and enjoy these hours with your friends in the comfortable lounge car.

Wednesday—Eleventh Day. Breakfast in the dining car before you reach Denver—then leave immediately for an interesting sightseeing trip, visiting the Civic Center, parks and residential district, continuing by way of Park of the Red Rocks and Bergen Park to Central City, early mining town, where gold was first discovered in this area. Here a guide will show you the old Opera House, still in use; and the famed hotel, the Teller House, where luncheon is served. Time to look around this interesting town before returning to Denver to board the Domeliner "City of Denver," homeward bound.

Thursday—Twelfth Day. Arrive Chicago shortly before lunch. Fond farewells and promises to write and exchange snapshots bring to an end a glorious vacation.

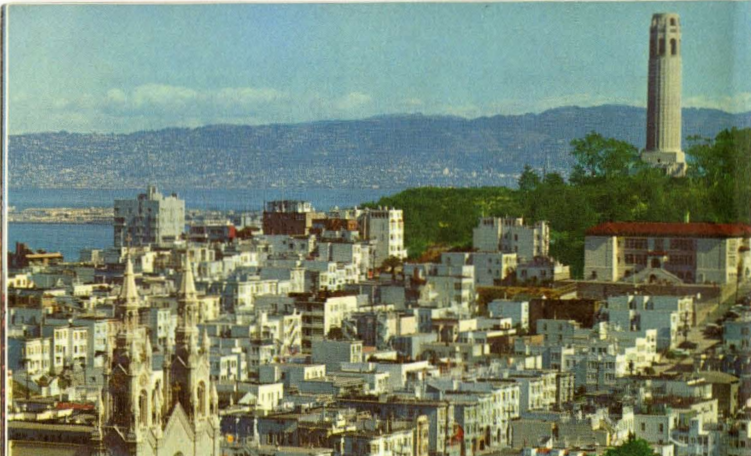

GENERAL INFORMATION

Hotel and Lodge Accommodations. Tour rates are based on double occupancy of rooms (twin beds). Rooms with bath are provided at all hotels and lodges used except at Old Faithful in Yellowstone National Park, where rooms with bath are limited but will be reserved on request, if available, at an additional charge of \$1.00 per person, per day. National Park facilities come under the jurisdiction of the Department of the Interior.

In the Utah-Arizona National Parks, rate is based on standard cabin with shower. Deluxe cabins with bath, if available, are at an additional cost of \$1.25 per person, per day.

SINGLE ROOMS are sometimes available upon request at an additional charge.

Meal Arrangements. All meals, three every day, are included in the cost of all Union Pacific summer tours except on the "PNW" and "NC" tours in Seattle where breakfasts only are included. Coupons with stated values are provided for meals taken in dining cars and at certain hotels. They are accepted the same as cash and a refund of the difference is made when meal check totals less than coupon value. Meal coupon values vary depending upon prevailing prices on trains and hotels used. In every case coupon values permit a liberal choice of entrees.

Escorts arrange settlement for all meals for which individual coupons are not provided.

Equipment — Pullman. All regularly assigned sleeping cars will be lightweight, streamlined, air-conditioned cars, providing a choice of accommodations, assuring you of every comfort.

Coach — Regularly assigned coaches with leg-rests are provided for tour patrons while tours are moving on: the "Domeliner City of Denver-Portland"; the "Challenger" Domeliner, the Streamliner "City of San Francisco," and the Domeliner "City of St. Louis."

Leg-rest coaches are not available on trains used between the following points:

- between Los Angeles, California, Merced and San Francisco, California via Southern Pacific Company.
- between Salt Lake City, Utah and Ashton, Idaho or Victor, Idaho via Union Pacific Railroad;
- between Denver, Salt Lake City and Lund, Utah via Union Pacific Railroad;
- between Portland, Oregon, Tacoma and Seattle, Wash.
- between Las Vegas, Nevada, Riverside and Los Angeles.

Family Plan, Reduced Rate Railroad Tickets may be used on Monday tour departures. See your local agent regarding saving that may be effected.

Children under 12 years of age are entitled to half-fare transportation and various other reductions in tour costs. Rates on request.

Purchase Railroad Tickets at Your Home Station. Passengers coming from points other than Chicago may join our tour parties at Chicago or at any regular stopping point en route between Chicago and Omaha. To obtain full benefit of the round trip fares, railroad tickets should be purchased from home station, reading via the route of the tour, as shown in the itinerary.

Passengers joining Tours at Chicago Must Check in at Tour Desk, train level floor, of the Chicago Union Station, at time and place indicated on back of your membership coupon book.

Here you will meet your escort. If joining elsewhere go directly to the space assigned for your use. Escort will see you there if he should miss seeing you as you board the train.

Baggage Insurance — Insurance to cover loss or damage to baggage and personal effects may be purchased through most railroad baggage offices or ticket offices or through your travel agent.

Baggage. One or two suit cases or bags will hold sufficient clothing for your entire trip. The Department of Tours will pay for all service in connection with the handling of baggage at stop-over points.

Baggage should never be checked on the baggage car from home station to Chicago or any point on the tour due to the possibility of delay enroute.

One piece of baggage, weighing not more than twenty-five pounds, will be carried free in the National Parks. If it is desired you may also carry a small overnight bag with you. Additional baggage may be checked free at park gateways. The Department of Tours assumes no responsibility for baggage or personal effects, but in the event of damage, delay or loss, will do all in its reasonable power to lessen the hardships incurred. Your escort will furnish special baggage tags to attach to each piece of luggage which you desire him to handle.

Wearing Apparel. Warm summer days suggest lightweight clothing, however nights in mountain regions are cool and topcoats, sweaters, and weatherproof outer garments are desirable. Sport or casual clothes are most practical for travel en route and in the parks. A business suit for men, a couple of informal dresses for women, suitable for dinner or evening wear, are suggested. Bring your camera, a pair of colored glasses and, of course, shoes suitable for hiking.

Church Services. Your escort will be fully informed regarding church services at places visited on Sunday.

Mail and Telegrams should be addressed to the various hotels shown in the itinerary of the tour you are taking. Specify "Member of Union Pacific Tour YT-5" or whatever the particular designating letter and number may be.

Immigration Regulations. Naturalized citizens of the United States must have in their possession naturalization papers. Alien passengers must hold valid passport, a visa for entry into Canada or Mexico and a visa or re-entry permit for re-entry into the United States. American-born citizens should carry with them some form of identification such as Birth Certificate, Voters' Registration or other form which shows citizenship. Such forms should be carried personally by passengers when entering and leaving Canada or Mexico.

Responsibility. In the sale of these tours the Department of Tours acts only as agent for the various hotels, transportation companies, railroads, Pullman Company, etc., and assumes no responsibility for loss or damage to baggage or injury to persons. Rates, train schedules and arrangements quoted herein are subject to such change as tariff or operating requirements may later demand.

YELLOWSTONE AND GRAND TETON NATIONAL PARKS. A complete tour of Yellowstone with its geysers, hot springs, famous canyon, Great Falls, terraces and other phenomena, also Grand Teton National Park and the storied Jackson Hole country are featured on tours "YT" and "YTZ."

GRAND CANYON NATIONAL PARK. Vast, awe-inspiring, mysterious. Its soft, subtle colors change before your eyes as the sun moves across the sky — while a mile below the rim the Colorado River is still hard at work deepening the canyon. Seen on the "Z" and "YTZ" tours.
