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

DAY-BY-DAY STORY

Saturday — First Day. Leaving Chicago during the afternoon your first hours will be spent in meeting your congenial companions and you'll watch the passing panorama — the interesting "prairie lands" of Illinois and Iowa's fields of waving corn. Dinner is served in the dining car.

Sunday — Second Day. During the night your train rolls smoothly through Nebraska and early morning finds you in Colorado. Breakfast on the train before arrival in Denver at 7:40 AM.. There is time for those who desire to attend the Church of their choice. At 10:00 AM you'll board motor buses for a day of scenic treats, which will include the Civic Center, the city parks, Park of Red Rocks, Denver's Mountain Parks and the historic old mining towns of Blackhawk and Central City. A stop is made in Central City to visit the Opera House and the famous Teller House, where luncheon will be served. Returning to Denver late afternoon, you board your train for an overnight trip to Salt Lake City. Dinner in the Union Station Restaurant.

Monday — Third Day. Breakfast on the train before arrival at Salt Lake City — reached at 9:20 AM. Motor buses will meet you immediately on arrival to begin an interesting day of sightseeing which will include a trip to all of the historic and romantic points of interest in Salt Lake Valley.

You see the many spots rich in memories of the hardy Mormon pioneers who conquered the wilderness of Utah. The Mormon Temple and Tabernacle; Brigham Young's homes, his monument and private burial ground, Beehive House, Lion House, Eagle Gate and the State Capitol, returning in time for the delightful organ recital.

Luncheon at the Hotel Utah, then off to Bingham Canyon and the famous Utah open-cut Copper Mine, arriving in time for the spectacular blasting operation, viewed in perfect safety.

After dinner at the Newhouse, you leave at 7:30 PM for the overnight trip to Victor, Idaho, where you begin four days of unforgettable sightseeing through the Parks.

Tuesday — Fourth Day. You detrain at Victor at 7:30 AM and have breakfast (tip included) at the Timberline Cafe.

The Grand Teton area is a region of mountainous grandeur and breathtaking views of the majestic Tetons are seen as you motor to your headquarters — Jackson Lake Lodge — where spacious, tastefully furnished rooms with bath are provided in quest cottages. Afternoon and evening are open.

Wednesday — Fifth Day. At 9:00 AM you will be taken on an all-day sightseeing trip brim-full of breathtaking beauty. Ox Bow Bend, Glacier Lookout, Chapel of the Transfiguration; Boat trip on Jackson Lake to the very foot of the Tetons and a delightful lunch on Elk Island. Truly a day of never-to-be-forgotten thrills in this cameraman's paradise!

As you begin your trip north into Yellowstone National Park, you'll motor along the shore of Jackson Lake. Then through the spectacular Lewis Canyon, passing West Thumb Geyser Basin and Yellowstone Lake before reaching your head-quarters, the Yellowstone Lake Hotel in time for dinner.

Thursday — Sixth Day. A great day! After a hearty breakfast you board motor coaches again and are off for a drive along the Yellowstone River to Artist Point for your first view of the Grand Canyon, climax of Yellowstone's glory.

Still another thrill awaits you as your trip continues over the famous Dunraven Pass to Mt. Washburn and Tower Fall—another of the outstanding scenic features of the Park.

Now a stop for lunch at the Mammoth Hot Springs Hotel with time to view the many vari-tinted terraces and to visit the Park Museum before departing for Old Faithful Inn. Your route is via Appolinaris Spring, Obsidian Cliff and Norris Geyser Basin with stops at the principal attractions.

There is dancing and other entertainment at Old Faithful. This evening, like all evenings in Yellowstone, is beyond compare—the combination of star-studded skies, campfires, soft re-echoing strains of music, create an enchanted setting, and it's wonderful.

Friday — Seventh Day. Old Faithful Geyser is but a few steps from the Inn, and you'll enjoy watching its almost hourly eruptions or take one of the hikes of the geyser basin conducted by a Park Ranger-Naturalist.

This day is yours to plan as you prefer so enjoy every moment, because after dinner you'll be headin' toward Ashton and your train for the overnight trip to Ogden, Utah.

Saturday — Eighth Day. Be up early this morning for a thrilling train ride through the Bear River Canyon and another view of the Great Salt Lake to the west.

On arrival at Ogden, Utah, you will detrain and transfer to the Ben Lomond Hotel for breakfast, then return to the station to board your Domeliner to Chicago.

Again it is a pleasure to watch the ever-changing landscape from your train window as you travel through the beautiful Weber Canyon, past "Devil's Slide" and into towering Echo Canyon.

But now your tour companions are your friends and together you relive much of what you have seen and you enjoy a sense of camaraderie that only comes from such a happy association.

Sunday — **Ninth Day.** A leisurely breakfast in the dining car, and soon your train will roll quietly into Chicago, then happy adieus . . . and memories of a delightful, funful, carefree vacation!

A trip through the Southern Utah-Arizona National Parks is in itself a complete vacation. So, too, is a visit to Yellow-stone and Grand Teton National Parks. But to select two such fascinating regions, combining them into one 14-day, all-expense tour, this is indeed vacation news of the highest order — a vacation trip you can look back upon as one of the most eventful chapters in your life.

You see FIVE National Parks — Zion, Grand Canyon, Bryce, Grand Teton and Yellowstone, as well as Cedar Breaks National Monument, motor through several National Forests and go sightseeing in one of America's most noted cities — Salt Lake City, Utah. First—a trip to Yellowstone and Grand Teton National Parks—four days of sightseeing with overnight stops at the Lake Hotel, Old Faithful Inn and Jackson Lake Lodge. Then you spend five days and five nights in the Utah-Arizona Wonderlands, where Nature's sculptured masterpieces await your rapt contemplation.

What wonders they are to behold! Zion National Park, a symphony in form and color; Arizona's Grand Canyon, a world wonder in its own right; Bryce Canyon, masterpiece of erosion and color; the painted cliffs of Cedar Breaks National Monument and the drive through beautiful Kaibab Forest, over Mt. Carmel Highway and through Red Canyon.

Finally, sightseeing in Salt Lake City and a visit to the famed Mormon Tabernacle to hear the Mormon Choir before your footsteps turn toward home.

DAY-BY-DAY STORY

Sunday — First Day. Late this afternoon you will embark upon two weeks of vacation adventure long to be remembered. You'll have dinner aboard the Domeliner "City of Los Angeles" and get acquainted with your congenial traveling companions.

Monday — Second Day. You're on vacation so relax a bit today — but be ready for the scenery as your train wriggles its way past "Devil's Slide," through Echo Canyon and Weber Canyon in the late afternoon. For your scenic dessert, a generous portion of the beauty of this amazing country is served to you on the afternoon trip. Past the Needle with its slender rock formations, stop at Tower Fall to view the many peaks and pinnacles—then on to Mt. Washburn and through spectacular Dunraven Pass to your first breath-taking view of the Grand Canyon and Great Falls of the Yellowstone from Artist Point! Here indeed is the climax of this never-to-be-forgotten day; then on to the Yellowstone Lake Hotel for your overnight stay.

Wednesday — Fourth Day. Snooze a bit later this morning but not too late as your bus leaves at 10:05 for the trip along Yellowstone Lake and past the West Thumb Geyser Basin to your home for the night — Old Faithful Inn. Afternoon is open for you to get acquainted with this "Geyser Land."

Thursday — Fifth Day. You have all morning to explore the eerie formations of this "weirdest spot on the universe."


After luncheon leave Old Faithful Inn, destination Jackson Lake Lodge. Your trip takes you via Craig Pass, Thumb and Lewis Canyon to the Grand Teton National Park.


Rooms with bath are provided in guest-cottages, a short walk from the lodge. The remainder of this afternoon is free to boat, hike, fish, ride horseback — or just relax and enjoy the magnificent scenery.

Friday — Sixth Day. At 9:00 AM you will be taken on an all-day sightseeing trip brim-full of breathtaking beauty. Ox Bow Bend, Glacier Lookout, Chapel of the Transfiguration; boat trip on Jackson Lake to the very foot of the Tetons and a delightful lunch on Elk Island. Truly a day of never-to-beforgotten thrills in this cameraman's paradise!

You came — you saw — but the spectacular mountains have conquered you with their beauty. It has long been said,

Leaving Jackson Lake Lodge in late afternoon you'll travel through the Jackson Hole country crossing the spectacular Teton Pass. Dinner at the Timberline Cafe, then board your train for the next chapter of your vacation adventure.

Saturday — Seventh Day. After breakfast at the Hotel and lunch in the dining car you arrive at Lund, Utah, at 2:45 PM, starting five days of adventure in the wonderlands of Southern Utah and Northern Arizona. First stop is Zion National Park where you spend the night snugly in a cabin in the canyon.

Sunday — Eighth Day. This morning a motor trip is made up the sublime aisle of Zion Canyon to the Temple of Sinawava to view the Great White Throne, Great Organ, Angels Landing and other monuments whose names carry out the sublimity of this lovely area.

After lunch you leave for Grand Canyon National Park—over the Mt. Carmel Highway, across the Prismatic Plains and through the Kaibab Forest. Vast and awe-inspiring, the Grand Canyon is a masterpiece of nature's handiwork. You'll enjoy relaxing and watching its changing colors.

Monday — Ninth Day. No planned activities before luncheon. This afternoon, a motor trip to Cape Royal and to Point Imperial, highest point in Grand Canyon National Park, for inspiring views. Evening entertainment in the Lodge.

Tuesday — Tenth Day. After breakfast you leave, a little reluctantly perhaps, but you're on your way to another great scene — not so vast, but more intense and fantastic — Bryce Canyon National Park. The myriad marvels of Nature's handiwork will stretch your imagination almost to the breaking point.

Wednesday — Eleventh Day. After luncheon a motor trip takes you to Rainbow Point with a stop at Inspiration Point and other vantage spots. In the evening, a talk by the Park-Naturalist, a dance, or a walk out under the starlit heavens.

Thursday — Twelfth Day. After breakfast you say goodbye to Bryce — but there still is one surprise left before you leave this land of flaming color. Cedar Breaks National Monument, a vast escarpment and a vision of kaleidoscopic color, rises before your eyes.

Regretfully you leave this beautiful country as you once again board your train at Lund, Salt Lake City bound! Sightseeing tour is taken on arrival, then a visit to the Mormon Tabernacle to hear the world-famed Mormon Choir. Dinner and overnight at the Hotel Utah.

Friday—Thirteenth Day. After breakfast at the hotel you take leave of this beautiful city. The balance of this day is yours to enjoy watching the ever-changing landscape from your train window.

Saturday — **Fourteenth Day.** Homeward bound across the quiet fields of Illinois, arriving in Chicago at noon, with glorious memories, new friends and new enthusiasms. A vacation indelibly engraved on your Memory Book of the future.





After luncheon a trip by motor to the Temple of Sinawava and a hike with the Ranger-Naturalist to the Narrows. You will be overwhelmed at the beauty and magnitude of this inspiring region. Later another funfilled evening and a refreshing night's rest.

Thursday — Fifth Day. Morning is open for more exploration, discovery and adventure and at 1:00 PM you leave Zion for the Wonder of Wonders — the Grand Canyon. On the way you pass through the famous Mt. Carmel Tunnel along the Mt. Carmel Highway, with six huge tunnel portals through which you see masterpieces of scenic beauty.

You motor through the cool quiet of the Kaibab Forest with its abundance of deer and its shy white-tailed squirrels but your ride ends abruptly and most sensationally at the very brink of Grand Canyon as your bus reaches Grand Canyon Lodge.

This evening there will be informal entertainment, music and dancing and, perhaps, a moonlight stroll on the rim.

Under such light the canyon presents an entirely new and different aspect. This morning is reserved for Church services - then practically all day to enjoy this fairyland of form and color . . . from the rim . . . hiking down the trails with Ranger-Naturalist guided party for an absorbing explanation of the geology of the country . . . or perhaps as a member of a gay horseback party following your colorful cowboy guide. At 3:00 PM a motor trip to Rainbow Point, with stops at Inspiration Point, Bryce Point, Little Bryce and Natural Bridge.

Monday - Ninth Day. Have your bags packed early for you'll want to take one last, lingering look before you leave this colorful Canyon shortly after breakfast.

On the way to Lund a stop is made at Cedar Breaks National Monument, another of the colorful Southern Utah attractions. An artist has counted more than sixty tints in Cedar Breaks, whose vast amphitheatres are eroded to a depth of 2,000 feet in an area of 60 square miles. Standing on the rim of this scintillating show-place, you are impressed with the power of Nature's mighty processes.

Once again you are on the way and soon you'll be able to look off to the south and get a distant view of the Temples of Zion which you left a few days ago.

You carry these beautiful visions with you for your file of future memories as you take leave of this colorful country bound for Salt Lake City. Sightseeing tour taken on arrival. Your home for tonight is the famous Hotel Utah.

Tuesday - Tenth Day. Morning is open for a bit of browsing in this unique city. Luncheon at the Hotel Utah, after which you walk across the street to the Mormon Tabernacle for the noon Great Organ recital. The marvelous acoustic properties of the huge dome-roofed Tabernacle and the mellow-toned pipe organ which it houses, are among the world's wonders.







GENERAL INFORMATION

Hotel and Lodge Accommodations. Tour rates are based on double occupancy of rooms (twin beds). Rooms with bath are provided at all hotels and lodges used. National Park facilities come under the jurisdiction of the Department of the Interior.

In the Utah-Arizona National Parks, rate is based on standard cabin with shower. Deluxe cabins with bath, if available, are at an additional cost of \$1.25 per person, per day.

SINGLE ROOMS are sometimes available upon request at an additional charge. This charge is not payable in advance but must be paid to each Hotel or Lodge at the time of service.

Meal Arrangements. All meals, three every day, are included in the cost of all Union Pacific summer tours. Coupons with stated values are provided for meals taken in dining cars and at certain city hotels. They are accepted the same as cash and you even receive a refund on dining car meals if there are times when you do not use the full value of your meal coupons or if you should skip a meal entirely.

Baggage. One or two suit cases or bags will hold sufficient clothing for your entire trip. The Department of Tours will pay for all service in connection with the handling of baggage at all stopping points while with the tour. Individuals are urged to carry their own cosmetic cases because of their fragile nature.

Baggage should never be checked on the baggage car from home station to Chicago or any point on the tour due to the possibility of it being delayed enroute.

One piece of baggage, weighing not more than twenty-five pounds, will be carried free in the National Parks. If it is desired you may also carry a small overnight bag with you. Additional baggage may be checked free at park gateways. The Department of Tours assumes no responsibility for baggage or personal effects, but in the event of damage, delay or loss, will do all in its reasonable power to lessen the hardships incurred. Your escort will furnish special baggage tags to attach to each piece of luggage which you desire him to handle.

Wearing Apparel. Warm summer days suggest lightweight clothing, however nights in mountain regions are cool and topcoats, sweaters, and weatherproof outer garments are desirable. Sport or casual clothes are most practical for travel en route and in the parks. A business suit for men, a couple of informal dresses for women, suitable for dinner or evening wear, are suggested. Bring your camera, a pair of colored glasses and, of course, shoes suitable for hiking.

Church Services. Your escort will be fully informed regarding Church services at places visited on Sunday.

Mail and Telegrams should be addressed to the various hotels shown in the itinerary of the tour you are taking. Specify "Member of Union Pacific Tour YT-5" or whatever the particular designating letter and number may be.

The address of the Ahwahnee Hotel and Camp Curry is Yosemite National Park, California.

In Rainier National Park the address is Paradise Inn., Wash.

Immigration Regulations. Naturalized citizens of the United States must have in their possession naturalization papers. Alien passengers must hold valid passport, a visa for entry into Canada or Mexico and a visa or re-entry permit for reentry into the United States. American-born citizens should carry with them some form of identification such as Birth Certificate, Voters' Registration or other form which shows citizenship. Such forms should be carried personally by passengers when entering and leaving Canada or Mexico.
