

Sunday — First Day. In mid-afternoon you embark upon two weeks of vacation adventure long to be remembered. You'll have dinner aboard the Domeliner "City of Portland" and have time to get acquainted with your congenial traveling companions.

Monday — Second Day. You're on vacation so relax a bit and watch the changing contours of the great Midwest as your train carries you smoothly across Nebraska and Wyoming to Pocatello, shortly after dinner. Here you transfer to a motor coach for the brief ride to Idaho Falls and your home for tonight, the Flamingo Motor Lodge.

Tuesday — Third Day. This will be your first day in the Park so be up early and on your way to one of the strangest and most fascinating regions in the world. Through Christmas Tree Park via Madison Junction to the Norris Geyser Basin. You feast your eyes on more of Yellowstone's eerie forma-

First stop is at Roosevelt Lodge for a bite and taste of the Old West as we turn back the clock and treat you to the thrills of a stagecoach ride! But hang on tight and you'll love it. Thursday — Fifth Day. Breakfast at the Inn, then a motor trip via Craig Pass, Thumb and Lewis Canyon to the Grand Teton National Park and your headquarters, Jackson Lake Lodge.

Rooms with bath are provided in guest-cottages, a short walk from the Lodge. The remainder of this afternoon is free to boat, hike, fish, ride horseback — or just relax and enjoy the magnificent scenery.

Friday — Sixth Day. After a hearty breakfast you leave on an all-day sightseeing trip brim-full of breathtaking beauty. Ox Bow Bend, Glacier Lookout, Chapel of the Transfiguration; boat trip on Jackson Lake to the very foot of the Tetons and a picnic box lunch on Elk Island. Truly a day of never-to-be-forgotten thrills in this cameraman's paradise!

You came — you saw — but the spectacular mountains have conquered you with their beauty. It has long been said, "The

Leaving Jackson Lake Lodge in late afternoon you'll travel through the Jackson Hole country to the picturesque town of Jackson, then cross spectacular Teton Pass to Idaho Falls and the next chapter of your vacation adventure.

Saturday — Seventh Day. Much has been written about the historic and lovely Salt Lake City and today is your day to see it. Motor buses will meet you immediately on arrival to begin an interesting day of sightseeing, which will include the historic and romantic points of interest in Salt Lake Valley.

You see the many spots rich in memories of the hardy Mormon pioneers who conquered the wilderness of Utah. The Mormon Temple and Tabernacle, Brigham Young's homes, his Eagle Gate and the State Capitol, returning in time to hear the Great Organ recital in world-famous Mormon Tabernacle. Overnight in your headquarters, the Royal Executive Inn.

Sunday — Eighth Day. Breakfast then board your motor coach once again for the short trip to Cedar City and the beginning of five days of adventure in the wonderlands of Southern Utah and Northern Arizona.

Cedar City is your first intimate contact with this colorful canyon country you are about to visit. And after a brief stop your trip continues through "Utah's Dixie," a fertile valley studded with quaint Mormon villages.

As you enter Zion Canyon, the highway follows the Virgin River, swift, sinuous waters stained with the red of the canyon walls. And here begins the parade of majestic peaks that is Zion. The walls spread apart to form the lovely Court of the Patriarchs, overlooked by the austerely dignified Three Patriarchs themselves; the east wall breaks into the Twin Brothers and the Mountain-of-the-Sun. These rows of sentinel peaks continue to the uppermost end of the canyon, but suddenly you come upon Zion Lodge, nestled at the base of Red Arch Mountain and dwarfed by the canyon walls towering above.

A series of elaborate hotels would be sadly out of place in these virgin regions, thus your accommodations are cozy double cabins, snuggled in the majestic mountains.

Monday — Ninth Day. After breakfast a motor trip is made up the sublime aisle of Zion Canyon to the Temple of Sinawava to view the Great White Throne, Great Organ, Angels Landing and other monuments whose names carry out the sublimity of this lovely area.

Leaving Zion after lunch you travel through Pine Canyon, and as the highway ascends in broad loops and zig-zags, the panoramas from above are breathtaking. You pass through the famous Mt. Carmel tunnel cut for more than a mile through solid rock, pierced by six huge windows, each framing a picture of startling grandeur.

Turning south, you journey past the Vermillion Cliffs and, after leaving Kanab, cross the state line into Arizona. Scenes of grandeur unfold before you as you cross the Prismatic Plains, one of the most exquisitely colored regions of upland in America.

Off in the distance is a long, low-lying, blue-green ridge, the forested Kaibab Plateau, and for more than fifty miles you drive through a forest of evergreen and aspen that is the Kaibab National Forest. The delightful ride through the cool glades of the charming Kaibab is a fitting prelude for the spectacle which awaits you at the North Rim.

There is spread before you an immense chasm, and rising from the sublimity of its templed depths in the bewildering glory of their gorgeous coloring are whole ranges of mountains, with bases a mile below and tops at the level of your eyes. No wonder John Burroughs called it the Divine Abyss.

Evening events at Grand Canyon are planned for your pleasure and entertainment.

Tuesday — **Tenth Day.** Morning is open for you to drink in the beauty that is all around and after lunch, take a four-hour trip of indescribable beauty.

Grand Canyon from Cape Royal, with its Angels' Window, presents an entirely different view from that of other points along the Rim. There in the awful stillness below lies as sublime a scene as you will ever look upon. Rich and vivid tones in a perfect kaleidoscope of color tint its mighty walls, and far below, the roaring Colorado River — but to you on the Rim, it is only a tiny thread in the silent, misty distance. You will never forget this scene, for you will feel here, more poignantly than ever before, the vastness and grandeur of Creation.

Tonight there will be informal entertainment — perhaps a recount of the thrilling sights of the day as you sit around the great log fire — music for the dance. Wednesday — Eleventh Day. This morning it is time to leave, a little reluctantly perhaps, but you're on the way to another great scene — not so vast, but more intense and fantastic — Bryce Canyon National Park.

Your route again takes you through delightful Kaibab Forest ... across the impressive Prismatic Plains ... past miles of Vermillion Cliffs ... through Red Canyon, walled with red rock, decorated with columns of pink and ruby ... and on to Bryce Canyon the beautiful.

Here at Bryce — as at Grand Canyon — you come upon the scene suddenly. The Lodge stands at the edge of a pine forest and modern, comfortable cabins are hidden away among the surrounding pines. A short walk from the Lodge and there bursts upon you one of the most brilliant sights ever beheld by man. There at your feet, in an immense semicircular amphitheater, is a bewildering assortment of fantastic stone formations, alive with flaming, glowing color, ablaze in the rays of the western sun.

This evening, entertainment in the Lodge, a talk by the Park Ranger, a dance or a walk under the starlit heavens.

Thursday — Twelfth Day. After breakfast you say goodbye to Bryce — but there still is one surprise left before you leave this land of flaming color. Cedar Breaks National Monument, a vast escarpment and a vision of kaleidoscopic color, rises before your eyes.

Regretfully you leave this beautiful country as once again you board your motor coach, Salt Lake City bound!





Thursday — Fifth Day. Morning is open for more exploration, discovery and adventure and at 1:00 PM you leave Zion for the Wonder of Wonders — the Grand Canyon. 


This evening there will be informal entertainment, music and dancing and, perhaps, a moonlight stroll on the rim.

Friday — Sixth Day. The morning is free for hiking, horseback riding or to just relax. After luncheon a four-hour motor

trip takes you to Point Imperial and Cape Royal for magnificent views of the canyon. Point Imperial is the highest point on the canyon rim.

At 3:00 PM, a motor trip to Rainbow Point, with stops at Inspiration Point, Bryce Point and Natural Bridge. Indeed, as you gaze upon the eerie carvings and exquisite colorings, Bryce might well become a Dream City of a remote age, set apart, as it were, for mortals to see and enjoy.

Monday — **Ninth Day.** Have your bags packed early for you'll want to take one last, lingering look before you leave this colorful canyon shortly after breakfast.

On the return trip a stop is made at Cedar Breaks National Monument, another of the colorful Southern Utah attractions. An artist has counted more than sixty tints in Cedar Breaks, whose vast amphitheatres are eroded to a depth of 2,000 feet in an area of 60 square miles. Standing on the rim of this scintillating show-place, you are impressed with the power of Nature's mighty processes.

Once again you are on the way and soon you'll be able to look off to the south and get a distant view of the Temples of Zion which you left a few days ago.

You carry these beautiful visions with you for your file of future memories as you take leave of this colorful country bound for Salt Lake City. Headquarters — Hotel Utah.

Tuesday — Tenth Day. This morning at 9:30 you will be taken on a comprehensive tour of this historic city over a portion of The Old Mormon Trail, passing the "This is the Place" monument; Brigham Young's homes and private burial ground; Beehive House and State Capitol, arriving at the Mormon Tabernacle in time for the noon Great Organ recital.

Luncheon at the Hotel Utah, then off to the Great Salt Lake and the famous Utah open-cut Copper Mine in Bingham Canyon for the spectacular blasting operation, viewed in perfect safety. Dinner in the Sky Room and overnight at the Hotel Utah.

Wednesday — Eleventh Day. This morning you board the Domeliner "City of Los Angeles" for the return trip through the canyons of Utah on your way to Denver. Breakfast, luncheon and dinner in the dining car and pleasures a'plenty with your friends in the lounge. Overnight at the Cosmopolitan Hotel.

Thursday — Twelfth Day. At 9:15 AM you'll board motor buses for a most interesting trip to Lookout Mountain and the tomb of Buffalo Bill; Clear Creek Canyon and the Red Rocks Park, returning to Denver via Lariat Trail.

Time to look around this "mile-high" city before boarding your Domeliner "City of Denver," homeward bound.

Friday — Thirteenth Day. Arrive Chicago shortly before lunch. Fond farewells and promises to write and exchange snapshots bring to an end a glorious vacation.



Superlatives could not describe the beauty that will fill your hearts today on this tour of tours. Your route will be along the gorgeously scenic highway carved from the sheer granite walls of the towering Santa Lucia Mountains, with the pounding surf of the Pacific always in view. Through Big Sur, outstandingly beautiful site of a recent movie, to San Simeon, but before proceeding any further — some time out for funch.



Monday — Tenth Day. This morning you may wish to stroll to the Park Headquarters, visit the Park Musuem to hear an illustrated lecture on the formation of the Valley, or accompany a Park Ranger-Naturalist on a hike. Others may just wish to lounge on the veranda of the Ahwahnee and enjoy the beauty that is everywhere.



GENERAL INFORMATION

Passengers joining Tours at Chicago must check in at Tour Desk near Milwaukee Road train Gate 5, train level floor, of the Chicago Union Station, at time and place indicated on back of your membership coupon book. Here you will meet your escort. If joining elsewhere go directly to the space assigned for your use, as indicated on the front cover of your membership coupon book. Escort will see you there if he should miss seeing you as you board the train.

Purchase Railroad Tickets at Your Home Station. Passengers coming from points other than Chicago may join our tour parties at Chicago or at any regular stopping point en route between Chicago and Omaha. To obtain full benefit of the round trip fares, railroad tickets should be purchased from home station, reading via the route of the tour, as shown in the itinerary.

Family Plan, Reduced Rate Railroad Tickets may be used on all tour departures. See your local agent regarding saving that may be effected.

Children under 12 years of age are entitled to half-fare transportation and various other reductions in tour costs. Rates on request.

Hotel and Lodge Accommodations. Tour rates are based on double occupancy of rooms (twin beds). Rooms with bath are provided at all hotels and lodges used. National Park facilities come under the jurisdiction of the Department of the Interior.

In the Utah-Arizona National Parks, rate is based on standard cabin with shower. Deluxe cabins with bath, if available, are at an additional charge.

SINGLE ROOMS are sometimes available upon request at an additional charge. This charge is payable in advance at time of confirmation of single room and within time limit prescribed. Single hotel rooms CANNOT be sold unless definite confirmation has been received from the Department of Tours. Charges are listed in the rate block of each tour.

Meal Arrangements. All meals, three every day, are included in the cost of all Union Pacific escorted tours. Coupons with stated values are provided for meals taken in dining cars and at certain city hotels. They are accepted the same as cash and you even receive a refund on dining car meals if there are times when you do not use the full value of your meal coupons or if you should skip a meal entirely.

Only Union Pacific Tours give you this advantage.

This same refund arrangement is also true at most city hotels, thus giving you the freedom of choice of fine restaurants without the necessity of carrying extra money with you to cover costs of meals not included in the original charges.

Meal coupon values vary depending upon prevailing prices on trains and hotels used. In every case coupon values permit a liberal choice of entrees.

Escorts arrange settlement for all meals for which individual coupons are not provided.

Equipment — Pullman. All regularly assigned sleeping cars will be lightweight, streamlined, air-conditioned cars, providing a choice of accommodations, assuring you of every comfort. Rate quotations shown following each tour itinerary will indicate the various types of accommodations carried on each particular tour.

Coach — Regularly assigned coaches with leg-rests are provided for tour patrons while tours are moving on: the Domeliner "City of Denver-Portland"; the "Challenger" Domeliner, the Streamliner "City of San Francisco," and the Domeliner "City of St. Louis."

Leg-rest coaches are not available on other trains used by our tours.

Lounge car facilities for Pullman and Coach passengers are available on most trains used.

Baggage Insurance — Insurance to cover loss or damage to baggage and personal effects should be purchased through your railroad baggage office or ticket office or through your travel agent.

Baggage. One or two suitcases or bags will hold sufficient clothing for your entire trip. The Department of Tours will pay for transfer charges and tips for handling of this baggage at all stopping points while with the tour. Individuals are urged to carry their own cosmetic cases because of their fragile nature.

Baggage should never be checked on the baggage car from home station to Chicago or any point on the tour due to the possibility of it being delayed en route.

One piece of baggage, weighing not more than twenty-five pounds, will be carried free in the National Parks. If it is desired you may also carry a small overnight bag with you. Additional baggage may be checked free at park gateways. The Department of Tours assumes no responsibility for baggage or personal effects, but in the event of damage, delay or loss, will do all in its reasonable power to lessen the hardships incurred. Your escort will furnish special baggage tags to attach to each piece of luggage which you desire him to handle.

Wearing Apparel. Warm summer days suggest lightweight clothing, however nights in mountain regions are cool and topcoats, sweaters and weatherproof outer garments are desirable. Sport or casual clothes are most practical for travel en route and in the parks. A business suit for men, a couple of informal dresses for women, suitable for dinner or evening wear, are suggested. Bring your camera, a pair of colored glasses and, of course, shoes suitable for hiking.

Church Services. Your escort will be fully informed regarding Church services at places visited on Sunday.

Mail and Telegrams should be addressed to the various hotels shown in the itinerary of the tour you are taking. Specify "Member of Union Pacific Tour YT-5" or whatever the particular designating letter and number may be.

The post office address of all hotels in Yellowstone Park is Yellowstone National Park, Wyoming; Jackson Lake Lodge, Grand Teton National Park, Jackson, Wyoming.

In the Utah-Arizona Parks, addresses are as follows: Zion Lodge, Zion National Park Rural Station, Springdale, Utah 84767; Grand Canyon Lodge, North Rim Rural Station, Fredonia, Arizona 86022; Bryce Canyon National Park Lodge, Bryce Canyon P.O., Utah 84717.

Estes Park Chalet, Estes Park, Colorado; Grand Lake Lodge, Grand Lake, Colorado; Elkhorn Lodge, Estes Park, Colorado.

The address of the Ahwahnee Hotel and Yosemite Lodge is Yosemite National Park, California.

In Rainier National Park the address is Paradise Inn, Wash.

Immigration Regulations. Naturalized citizens of the United States must have in their possession naturalization papers. Alien passengers must hold valid passport, a visa for entry into Canada or Mexico and a visa or re-entry permit for re-entry into the United States. American-born citizens should carry with them some form of identification such as Birth Certificate, Voters' Registration or other form which shows citizenship. Such forms should be carried personally by passengers when entering and leaving Canada or Mexico.

Responsibility. In the sale of these tours the Department of Tours acts only as agent for the various hotels, transportation companies, railroads, Pullman Company, etc., and assumes no responsibility for loss or damage to baggage or injury to persons. Rates, train schedules and arrangements quoted herein are subject to such change as tariff or operating requirements may later demand.
