



THIRTEENTH SEASON

THE DEPARTMENT OF TOURS

of the Chicago, Union Pacific and North Western Line, presents herewith its outline of arrangements which have been completed for summer vacation travel under escort, with rates which include all expenses of the tours.

Each succeeding season has shown a marked improvement in these arrangements until the summer tours to Yellowstone Park have established a reputation for themselves and have become more familiarly known as the

"POPULAR 14-DAY YELLOWSTONE TOURS"

Twelve seasons of experience and living up to the wants and wishes of the traveling public has so "standardized" these popular tours of the Chicago, Union Pacific and North Western Line that they now form an important part of the summer travel under escort of the Department of Tours.

It has been the aim of the management to add at each opportunity new features which have resulted in the arrangement of as nearly "Perfect" tours as the exacting wishes of the traveler can demand.

The arrangements made for the season of 1913 include eight of the "Popular 14-Day Yellowstone Tours," going via the direct route to the western entrance of The Yellowstone National Park, and spending five full days touring the Park.

The return trip is made through Utah and Colorado, spending one day at Salt Lake City, stopping at Glenwood Springs, two days at Colorado Springs and one day at Denver.

These tours leave Chicago each Saturday, commencing with the first tour Saturday July 5th, and ending with the last tour of the season Saturday, August 23d.

TWELVE DAYS TOURING YELLOWSTONE PARK

In connection with the Fourteen-Day Yellowstone Park Tours, persons desiring to spend more time in the Park may stop over from one tour to the next at any of the hotels in the Park for the seven additional days. The extra charge for this Twelve-day tour of the Park will be \$35.00, or in other words offering a Twenty-one Day Tour, Chicago to Yellowstone Park and return at a cost of \$190.00.

PACIFIC COAST TOURS

In addition to the popular Yellowstone Park Tours, two excursions have been arranged so as to include the Pacific Coast.

July 5th a tour will leave for California visiting the Yellowstone Park on the going trip, stopping at Lake Tahoe, San Francisco, Del Monte, Santa Barbara and Los Angeles; returning through Utah and Colorado.

July 12th another tour will leave for Seattle via Portland, visiting the Yellowstone Park on the going trip and returning via the Scenic Canadian Pacific.

Arrangements have been made so that persons accompanying the California Tour can take in the Yosemite National Park by cutting down time at San Francisco and Los Angeles at an additional expense of \$33.50.

A cruise to Alaska can be made in connection with any of these tours, and more complete details as to rates and schedule will be cheerfully furnished separately upon application.

Any individual may also carry out an independent tour under the guidance and following the suggestions of this department.

The choice of points of interest that may be included are unlimited and depend largely upon individual wishes.

Correspondence is invited and much help and assistance can be rendered by the Department of Tours in planning and arranging the numerous details incident to any trip.

A full supply of handsome descriptive literature of all western resorts is kept in stock, and same may be had upon request and without cost. This literature will be of interest and assistance in making your arrangements and decisions.

Quoting of rates covering your trip, regardless of what points you take in, the reservation of sleeping car space, checking of baggage and looking after hotel accommodations are some of the services that the Department of Tours is pleased to render the traveling public.

DEPARTURE FROM CHICAGO

All tours leave Chicago from the magnificent new Passenger Terminal of the Chicago and North Western Railway—The Portal of the West—located on Madison Street between Canal and Clinton streets.

It is particularly adapted in many ways to the convenience of parties on extended tours.

Advanced and scientific skill has been made use of in providing comforts that no passenger terminal has ever before attempted. All the conveniences and appurtenances of a high class hotel are found here with the one exception of sleeping apartments.

UNDER ESCORT AND ALL-EXPENSE FEATURE

An experienced representative of the Department of Tours accompanies each tour carrying out all details and arrangements and leaving patrons free to enjoy every part of the trip. The great advantages of this arrangement are not fully understood until actually experienced.

The cost of each tour includes every expense necessary for the entire trip as outlined elsewhere herein. All arrangements have been contracted for in advance. By this means a person is enabled to know exactly what the trip will cost him before starting and he is relieved of numerous details incident to an extended tour of this nature, all of which are taken care of in such a way as to insure "The Best of Everything" at all times.

MANAGEMENT

The tours are under the direct management and supervision of the Department of Tours of the Chicago and North Western Ry. and Union Pacific Railroad (C., U. P. & N. W. Line) which is specially organized and maintained to handle this class of travel and makes it possible to offer patrons many advantages in the way of superior service, etc., that it would not be possible to secure in any other way.

EQUIPMENT OF THE SPECIAL TRAINS


These special parties are organized and handled on a strictly first-class basis throughout and therefore only modern first-class Pullman Drawing-Room, Private Compartment and Open Section Sleeping Cars, Composite Library-Buffet Car, Dining Car of ample seating capacity and Observation Parlor Car make up the equipment of the special trains. No expense has been spared by the management to insure complete comfort and enjoyment both en route and at points of stop-over. Every luxury of modern American railway travel is provided.

ROUTES OF TRAVEL

Great care combined with experience has been exercised in selecting the routes of travel with the idea in view of making the journey of continual interest and arranging the schedules so that the regions offering the most scenic attractions are traversed in daytime. This is one of the most important essentials in the arrangement of any trip.

HOTELS

In touring the Yellowstone Park only first-class hotels are used, which, in rotation, are Fountain Hotel, Old Faithful Inn, Colonial or Lake Hotel, New Canyon Hotel and Mammoth Hot Springs Hotel. All of these are located nearest the centers of interest in the Park. There is always much

travel through Yellowstone especially at the height of the season, and realizing the importance of the matter, this department has secured and contracted long in advance for accommodations at the different hotels to insure patrons of the best service to be had. This is one of the strongest benefits of these popular Escorted All-Expense Tours.

At Colorado Springs accommodations have been secured at The Antlers Hotel: at Denver either the Albany Hotel or the Savoy Hotel will be patronized.

The hotels patronized on the Pacific Coast tours are too numerous to be mentioned here, but it may be stated that at all points of stop-over where hotels are used they are of the highest class and the best accommodations have been secured.

AS A VACATION TRIP

As a summer vacation trip there is not a more ideal way to spend the time than in company with such a tour. An ordinary trip made for sight-seeing can hardly furnish rest and recreation with the many details to be personally looked after but by traveling on the Escorted All-Expense Plan all these are eliminated, making the trip a pleasant combination of rest, recreation and the fullest enjoyment. Furthermore, the reasonable cost of the tours for first-class service puts them in reach of many.

SLEEPING-CAR ACCOMMODATIONS

The cost as quoted herein provides for the assignment of a double berth (half section) to each individual. There will be a limited number of Drawing Rooms and Private Compartments available and a moderate extra charge is made for same, depending upon the number of occupants and the tour selected. The extra charge will be quoted promptly on application. It is best that reservations be made as far in advance as consistent and especially if there is any preference of location.

DINING-CAR SERVICE THE BEST

There is nothing so important as to fully satisfy the palate. In the spacious dining cars the delicacies and substantials of the season will be served, and the well-established reputation of the commissary department for high-class service will be maintained.

REGISTRATION

When you have made up your mind to accompany one of these tours, notify S. A. Hutchison, Mgr., Department of Tours, C., U. P. & N. W. Line, 148 S. Clark St., Chicago, being particular to give full name and address of each person in your party, and forward a deposit of \$10.00 with your regis-

tration as evidence of your intention to make the trip, which amount will be credited on final settlement or refunded if for any good cause it should become impossible to go.

WEARING APPAREL

Because of the altitudes in Yellowstone Park, cool weather is experienced, especially after sundown, and it is advisable to be provided with some warm clothing. Ladies will find use for a sailor or felt hat, veils, a heavy wrap, linen duster and heavy shoes. Gentlemen can use with comfort a soft hat, linen duster and a medium-weight overcoat. For travel in California summer clothing is suggested, and for Alaska some warm clothing will at times be comfortable.

CHECKING BAGGAGE

Hand bags and suit cases that can be taken into the sleeping car will supply the daily needs en route and in the Yellowstone Park. The heavier pieces of baggage will be carried under check in baggage car. Special tags will be supplied to be attached to valises and trunks. Patrons are expected to handle and look after their own hand baggage which is not under check.

Twenty-five pounds of hand baggage will be carried without cost on stages through the Yellowstone. Trunks will be stored at entrance of Park while making the tour, and access may be had to trunks in baggage car on train the day before reaching Yellowstone in order to take out such effects as may be desired.

For Tours "A" to "H" inclusive, trunks (if any) should be checked to Yellowstone, Mont., via C. & N. W. Ry.—U. P. R. R.—O. S. L. R. R.







YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK

The Yellowstone Park is a unique region of mountains, forests, lakes, streams, geysers and canyons, where one may see such strange and wonderful diversions of nature as cataracts of steaming hot water rising periodically into the air to hang there minute after minute; blue and amber ponds, the water of which is hot enough to boil fish; limpid springs welling peacefully in their basins one minute and overflowing with violent explosions the next, tossing high in air sticks, stones and small roots of trees; and with these wonders, lakes of rare beauty, streams that contain unlimited numbers of fish, and mountains that tower thousands of feet in the air, the home of wild game that under wise protection is increasing yearly. To this wild and beautiful region thousands of visitors repair each year, surrounded by all the luxuries that modern American railway travel provides. Fishing in the Park is exceptionally good. No feature of life in the Park is more interesting to the visitor than the big game with which it abounds — elk, antelope, buffalo, moose, bear, mountain sheep, foxes and smaller animals. Beaver, otter, marten and other valuable fur-bearing animals here find a haven.

The United States Engineer Road Department has completed a splendid system of road sprinkling, whereby over one hundred miles of the Park roads are sprinkled daily, adding materially to the pleasure and comfort of the tour.

SALT LAKE CITY

Salt Lake City is thirty-seven miles south of Ogden. It is a most pleasant city, the streets being 132 feet wide, including the sidewalks, and along each side runs a clear, cold stream of water from the mountain canyons. It was founded by Brigham Young and the Mormons in 1847, and the principal points of interest are the Mormon Tabernacle and grounds. To hear the great organ in the tabernacle is well worth the trip. Saltair Beach on the Great Salt Lake is close by and is a great bathing and resort center.

GLENWOOD SPRINGS

Glenwood Springs is noted for its remarkable hot sulphur springs, bathing parlor and swimming pool. Glenwood Springs is surrounded by a most beautiful mountainous country.

COLORADO SPRINGS AND MANITOU

Among the many attractions at these celebrated resorts are Pikes Peak, Garden of the Gods, South Cheyenne Canyon, the Soda Springs, Iron Springs and a scenic trip to the most famous mining districts in the world. The Cripple Creek trip is reputed to be one of the most charming scenic mountain trips in America. Another scenic trip of great importance is the new automobile scenic trip to Crystal Park. Manitou is six miles from Colorado Springs and is connected with it by steam and electric railways.

DENVER

There is much of interest to be seen in and about Denver, the principal points of interest being the Mint, the city park, and the capitol building. From the latter an excellent bird's-eye view of the city may be obtained, and 200 miles of snowy mountain ranges can be seen. A number of delightful, interesting trips can be made from Denver, among them being the Denver-Arrow one day trip via the Moffat Line, also the trip to the famous Georgetown Loop.

CALIFORNIA

California is a state of great resources and is favored with a most wonderful climate. There are no extremes of heat and cold and it is 'the comfortable and reliable all-the-year-round resort. The State's magnetic power of attraction is increasing each year, both to tourists and permanent settlers.

Riverside is a beautiful city and is situated in the heart if the great orange belt. Broad avenues and beautiful shaded streets furnish opportunity for many charming drives and walks. The famed Glenwood Tavern, where peace, rest, and quiet surround one is located here.

Pasadena is one of the most favored resorts in this wonderful region. It is a beautiful city of palatial residences, and enjoys a climate that is as near ideal as any yet discovered.

Los Angeles is the metropolis of Southern California and is a charming modern city, situated in the center of a locality of great beauty and interest. Numerous delightful outing trips can be made from here, among them being the trip up Mt. Lowe, and the trip to Santa Catalina Island, where the mysterious submarine gardens may be seen through glass-bottom boats; visiting the beaches, orange groves, etc.

Santa Barbara is one of the oldest and most popular health and pleasure resorts in Southern California. It has a charming location on the coast near the Santa Ynez Mountains. Santa Barbara Mission, the best preserved of all the old mission churches, is located here. There is also an excellent beach providing fine surf bathing.

Paso Robles Hot Springs have made the city of that name famous. The new main bathhouse is without question one of the finest in America. Every known bathing appliance of hydrotherapeutic merit is used here, and thousands bear grateful testimony of the healing powers of these waters.

The Santa Cruz forest of Big Trees begins almost within the outskirts of this thriving city, which is called the Atlantic City of the Pacific.

At Del Monte is Hotel Del Monte with its gorgeous array of flowering landscape which surrounds it. The setting of this hotel commands unbounded admiration and appreciation. The famous "17-mile drive" is taken from here.

San Francisco is the railroad and commercial metropolis of California. The city has risen as if by magic during the past few years and is now more beautiful and substantial than ever. It is a great resort center and numerous short outing and pleasure trips can be made.

THE YOSEMITE

The Yosemite Valley is now open to tourists, spring, summer, autumn and winter. In this little valley, containing only six square miles of territory, and shut in by sheer walls from 3,000 to 5,000 feet high, their sides washed by wondrous sheets of water that tumble into the valley over precipices from 300 to 2,600 feet high, is probably contained more beauty and scenic grandeur than can be found in anything like the same limited area anywhere else in the world. The level, meadow-like floor of the valley is covered with a rich carpet of green and a mass of flowers dotted with beautiful groups of silver fir, red cedar, tamarack and yellow pine, the great conifers of the Sierras, between whose trunks is caught the occasional home-like shimmer of a white tent or the light of an Indian campfire. The Yosemite Falls, half way down the length of the valley, leap, in three bounds, a distance of 2,600 feet. In the center of the valley is beautiful Mirror Lake, in whose clear waters the surrounding heights are reflected, while great domes, spires and pinnacles of rock, such as El Captain, the Half Dome, and Cloud Rest, stand guard over this storehouse of Nature's beauties.

The famous Mariposa Grove of Big Trees is reached by a delightful daylight stage ride from the Yosemite Valley. They are said to be the largest and oldest living things in the world, growing to an altitude of 340 feet and circumference of 100. They are probably more than 3,000 years old.

LAKE TAHOE

This lake, located about fourteen miles south of Truckee, is one of the most beautiful in the world. It lies in the heart of the Sierras, 6,280 feet above the sea level, and is completely hemmed in by mountains. It is twenty-three miles long and fourteen miles wide and from 100 to 3,000 feet deep. The water is so clear that the bottom of the lake can be seen at a depth of from sixty to seventy feet. There are many attractive resorts about the lake and fishing is good.

PORTLAND

Portland, the "Rose City," has one of the world's greatest fresh water harbors for ocean vessels. Its commerce is enormous, and a more beautiful residential city could not be found. The salmon fisheries constitute an important industry.

SEATTLE

Seattle is the wonder city of the great Northwest in regard to its unprecedented commercial development. It is situated on Puget Sound and from its many hills commands a fine view of the water front. Over twenty-five hundred deep-sea vessels pass in and out of the Seattle harbor yearly, a great number of them being engaged in the Alaska trade, which has been developed by Seattle to a remarkable extent.

THROUGH THE CANADIAN ROCKIES

The Canadian Rockies are compared by many with the Swiss Alps. For over six hundred miles a continuous panorama of bewildering magnificence is presented, which no pen can adequately describe. Wondrous glacial fields, startling precipices, snow-capped peaks, wide forest areas, clear lakes, and peaceful valleys combine in enchanting array. That there is not a dull or uninteresting moment all the way is the testimony of every one who has made the trip through the Canadian Rockies. They are the scenic climax of the mighty Rocky Mountains, called "the backbone of America." To the northward they gradually diminish in height until the Arctic Circle is reached. Southward they lack that ruggedness and glacial beauty which give them their attractiveness to the lovers of Alpine scenery

FIELD

Surrounded by majestic peaks and tremendous glaciers, beautiful lakes and mighty waterfalls, Field is a veritable paradise for the mountain climber, sportsman and artist. It is a splendid base from which to make numerous expeditions into the surrounding region.

BANFF

Banff, the gateway to the Canadian National Park, is the chief objective point for tourists and without a peer as a holiday resort. The scenery in the vicinity is incomparably grand and diversified. Mountain peak surmounts mountain peak; rock lies piled upon rock; rushing waters and lakes, like gems among the roughness, give color to the scene.

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
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
