

Each year more and more Californians are making the transcontinental journey east—some to revisit old homes, some on business, some just to satisfy the desire for travel that is ingrained in all of us, the urge "to go and see."

Such a trip deserves a setting in keeping with its importance. As you leaf through the pages of this little booklet which describes the Los Angeles Limited, picture yourself enjoying the comforts that are set forth here-for the ladies, the luxury of maid service and hairdresser aboard a transcontinental flyer; the privacy of a lounge where mere men do not intrude. For the men, the clubby atmosphere of a masculine lounge; the daily services of a valet and barber. For both, the superb appointments of a train built for extra-fare travel, but which does not require extra fare.



The Lounge Observation Car

The first inquiry about a train is usually: "What kind of an observation car does it have?" for this car is the social center of the community which populates the train.

This car on the Los Angeles Limited marks the train for its luxury. Its deep chairs and settees can be moved at will. The thick carpets and broad windows of its three lounges invite the relaxation which should be a part of every long trip.



The Men's Lounge

The men are well provided for on the Los Angeles Limited. Their separate lounge contains deepseated chairs; the near-by buffet offers bottled beverages, cigars and cigarettes. Stock-market reports are posted daily and magazines and daily newspapers are provided.

No freer atmosphere can be imagined for making new acquaintances and the exchange of experiences that frequently add so much to a transcontinental trip.



The Correspondence Desk

"Having a fine time, wish you were here." That phrase has long been a stock joke, but the spirit of it persists. We all want to tell someone about our trip.

Forward in the main lounge is a writing desk with all writing accessories, including "Los Angeles Limited" letterheads. Prior to departure of the Los Angeles Limited from Los Angeles and Chicago, this desk carries a city telephone.



Women's Dressing Room and Maid Service


A "train maid"? Yes indeed. No longer need the feminine traveler lack for the little services that mean so much to her sense of wellbeing. In the spacious women's dressing rooms of the Pullmans, a well-trained colored servant does manicuring and hairdressing at prices no higher than are found in city shops. Maid service is also a great help to mothers traveling with small children.



The Valet

Once, your clothes took their press (and their wrinkles) from the baggage which contained them, and the end of a journey meant work for the hotel valet.

Now, with a valet on board, you can have your clothes pressed every night if you wish, and step from your Pullman looking as fresh and as immaculate as you were the day you left home. This service is for both men and women and, again, prices are about the same as in any shop at home.



The Barber Shop

If you object to shaving yourself or if you want a fresh hair-trim before your journey's end is reached, there's a fully-equipped barber shop in the forward end of the observation car. Not only is the barber an expert at his trade, but his



services are for both men and women, and he dispenses everything from a shave to a Boncilla massage, from a neck trim to a full bob.

In addition, the barber shop sells a few toilet articles, such as tooth brushes, dentifrices, talcum and antiseptics.



Drawing-Rooms and Compartments

The use of a drawing room or a compartment has several advantages. It allows greater privacy; two or more persons traveling together can secure rooms opening into one another and thus have the advantages of connecting cabins on shipboard or of a hotel suite.

Every Pullman on the Los Angeles Limited has one drawing room, many have two compartments also, and one Pullman is devoted entirely to drawing rooms and compartments. (See diagram on page 15.)



The Dining Car


"Meals that Appeal" has long been a slogan of Overland Route dining service. Foods for the Los Angeles Limited are especially chosen in the markets of the country through which it travels. The skilful chefs, stewards and waiters would do credit to any restaurant.

The dining car appointments reflect the quality of the rest of the train; the system of through diners between Chicago and Los Angeles permits the passenger to dine in unhurried comfort, almost when he chooses.



The Shower Bath

Another convenience for a transcontinental trip—a bathroom—is provided on the Los Angeles Limited, where you can have a tub or shower bath, hot or cold.
