Grand Canyon National Park

THE GRAND CANYON is the supreme epic of erosion; there wind, frost and water have perpetuated their sublimest masterpiece in stone. "It is beyond comparison—beyond description; absolutely unparalleled throughout the wide world," wrote Theodore Roosevelt.

The Grand Canyon may be described as an intricate range of sunken mountains cut through a hundred miles of high plateau, "a mountain chain reversed." Usually it is pictured as a colossal chasm, 220 miles in length, a mile deep and some twelve miles wide; but it is more precisely a measureless labyrinth of canyons. Deep down in the uttermost gorge of granite, the Colorado grinds ceaselessly at the rocks. Numberless rich and vivid tones of gray, green, blue, red and mauve tint its mighty walls and temples and, independent of these, the sunlight pours daily into the chasm a shifting color parade of exquisite blues and purples, glowing reds and golds.

The Kaibab division (North Rim) of the Grand Canyon is the sublimest portion of the chasm, being nearly a thousand feet deeper than any other, far more diversified and complex, and is adorned with a multitude of magnificent features, either absent or much less strongly represented elsewhere. The North Rim also has the incomparable Kaibab Forest with its uncounted thousands of deer, white-tail squirrels, cliff dwellings, and a summer climate distinguished by unfailingly cool nights.

The North Rim of Grand Canyon is reached via Union Pacific, through Zion or Bryce Canyon National Parks. Regular 6-day motor-bus tours are operated from Cedar City, Utah, the gateway, during the season, June 1 to September 20. Excellent accommodations are provided at Grand Canyon Lodge; there are similar ones at Zion and Bryce Canyon National Parks.
